



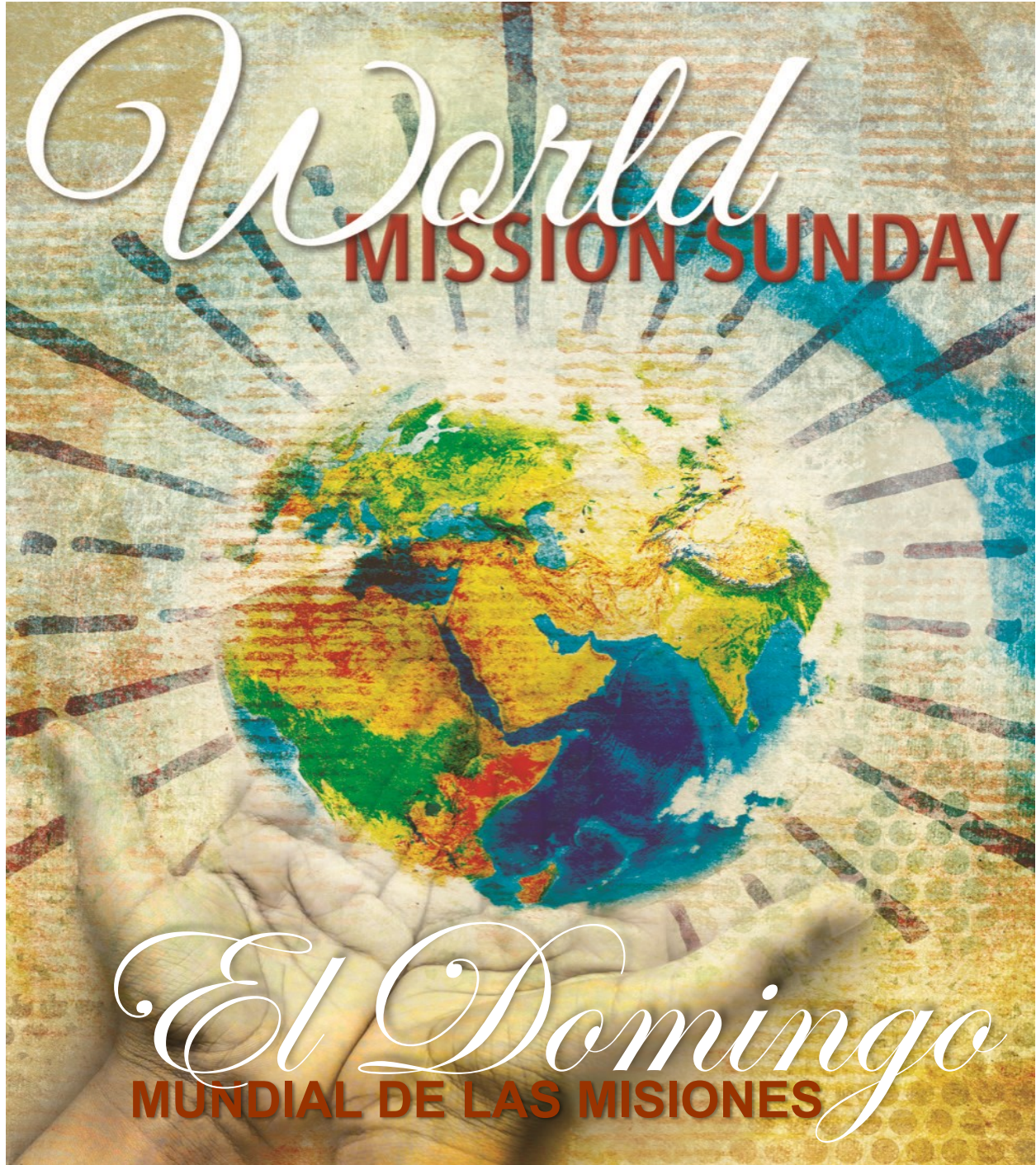

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## From Monsignor Fran Cilia

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There are many interpretations of Jesus' declaration, "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's" (Matthew 25:21). But the heart of the matter is found in the question that Jesus asked regarding the Roman coin, "Whose image and whose inscription?" The answer was that it was definitely that of Caesar. But the question that did not need to be asked was in whose image His hearers were made. The answer to that is also as clear, for the Book of Genesis narrates that God made man and woman in the divine image.

Jesus' teaching has often been cited to support good citizenship, "giving to Caesar." But the underlying principle cannot be lost on us: We, who are made in the image and likeness of God, must give to God all that we are. We are, as it were, citizens of two realms – here on earth and future citizens of heaven.

## World Mission Sunday - Collection this Weekend

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Pope Francis, [in his message for World Mission Sunday 2023](#), reflects on the theme "Hearts on fire, feet on the move," based on the story of the disciples who encounter Jesus on their way to Emmaus (cf. Lk 24:13-35). He invites all of us to "set out once more, illumined by our encounter with the risen Lord and prompted by his Spirit. Let us set out again with burning hearts, with our eyes open and our feet in motion. Let us set out to make other hearts burn with the word of God, to open the eyes of others to Jesus in the Eucharist, and to invite everyone to walk together on the path of peace and salvation that God, in Christ, has bestowed upon all humanity."

On World Mission Sunday, we join our Holy Father in supporting his missions. As we pray and respond here at home, we share in those celebrations taking place in every parish and school throughout the world. Together, through our prayers and financial support, we bring the Lord's mercy and concrete help to the most vulnerable communities in the Pope's missions.

In a world where so much divides us, World Mission Sunday rejoices in our unity as missionaries by our Baptism, as it offers each one of us an opportunity to support the life-giving presence of the Church among the poor and marginalized in more than 1,111 mission dioceses.

## Anointing of the Sick

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Next weekend, October 28/29, we will celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at all Saturday evening and Sunday Masses.

The question always comes up – "Who should be anointed?" Maybe we can begin with who should not be anointed. . . It is not for healthy individuals, or even for someone who woke up with a cold or another more ordinary and passing condition. Also, this anointing is not for babies and young children, generally thought of as those under 7 or 8 years old. But if you have an acute or chronic illness (known to you, but it is not necessary that anyone else knows it) or if you are significantly weakened because of your age, this Sacrament is for you.

We will reserve some seats in the front row at the Masses that weekend, to encourage those who have mobility issues to approach the sacrament. After the intercessions and some prayers and the laying on of hands on each person who will be anointed, each will be anointed on the forehead and hands. There will be a concluding prayer and Mass will continue with the Preparation of the Gifts. Please think about whether you are a candidate for this sacrament. If you are not sure, you can ask either of us priests to help you make that decision.

During the anointing, the priest says these words for each person: "Through this holy anointing, may the Lord in His love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. Amen. May the Lord for frees you from sin save you and raise you up. Amen"

## All Saints Day and All Souls Day Masses

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On all Saints Day, Wednesday, November 1, our Masses will be in English at 8:00 am, 10:45 School Mass (all are welcome) and 6:00 pm bilingual (English and Spanish). All Saints Day is a holy day of obligation.

On All Souls Day, Thursday, November 2, Masses will be at 8:00 am in English and 6:00 pm in Spanish. Although not a day of obligation, All Souls Day offers a special opportunity for the Christian community to remember in prayer our beloved dead.

## Book of the Names of the Dead

During November, we will again place in the sanctuary of the church the Book of the Names of the Dead for all to enter the names of those we will remember in our prayer throughout the month. Envelopes for your offerings and listing of names of beloved dead will also be available.



Reflexão por: João Pereira Arruda

“Dai a Cesar o que é de Cesar e a Deus o que é de Deus”. É com esta frase que termina o Evangelho de hoje; do mesmo modo é nesta frase que as pessoas acolhem a mensagem de toda a liturgia deste Domingo. As tensões existentes na política do tempo de Jesus eram tão hipócritas tal e qual a dos nossos dias e neste país em que vivemos. A cilada para atrapaçar Jesus e comprometer-Lo eram tão iguais às dos nossos dias, excepto, que as de agora tem os jornalistas profissionais para enganar a todos que se recusam a aceitar a verdade das coisas. Se cairmos na tentação de não darmos valor ao que é verdadeiro; decerto que, iremos cair e contribuir para o que está mal, para o que está errado. Assim fez Jesus em resposta ao que os fariseus e seus discípulos lhe disseram “Mestre! Sabemos que és recto e és imparcial no ver as coisas...toda uma linguagem lisongeira que cuja finalidade era nada menos do que embaraçar-Lo com uma trapaça embaraçosa. Jesus não teve muitos rodeios foi direito ao ponto da questão e chamou-lhes de hipócritas. Mais claro não podia ser Jesus pois bem sabia Ele a cilada que os fariseus estavam-nO armando. Se na moeda estava a figura de Cesare se a ele pertenceria Jesus acrescenta que devemos dar a Deus o que a Deus pertence. Se somos feitos á imagem de Deus a Deus pertencemos. A Deus lhe devemos prestar tributo. Deste modo Jesus estava a ser coerente com o dar resposta á perguntas que os fariseus a Jesus fizeram. Jesus Cristo, em doação plena ao Pai e aos homens, seus irmãos, viveu, até ás “últimas conseqüências, na justiça e no amor. nPor ser justo foi condenado, por amor, aceitou livremente a injustiça da condenação. Hoje, aqui e agora; o exemplo de Jesus Cristo continua a ser o exemplo a seguir.

## **De Monseñor Fran Cilia**

Hay muchas interpretaciones de la declaración de Jesús: “Dad al César lo que es del César y a Dios lo que es de Dios” (Mateo 22:21). Pero el meollo del asunto se encuentra en la pregunta que Jesús hizo con respecto a la moneda romana: “¿De quién es la imagen y la inscripción de quién?” La respuesta fue que definitivamente era la de César. Pero la pregunta que no era necesario plantear era a imagen de quién fueron creados sus oyentes. La respuesta a esto también es igualmente clara, pues el Libro del Génesis narra que Dios hizo al hombre y a la mujer a imagen divina.

A menudo se ha citado la enseñanza de Jesús para apoyar la buena ciudadanía, “dar al César”. Pero el principio subyacente no se nos puede escapar: nosotros, que estamos hechos a imagen y semejanza de Dios, debemos darle a Dios todo lo que somos. Somos, por así decirlo, ciudadanos de dos reinos: aquí en la tierra y futuros ciudadanos del cielo.

El próximo fin de semana, 28 y 29 de octubre, celebraremos el Sacramento de la Unción de los Enfermos en todas las Misas del sábado por la tarde y del domingo.

Siempre surge la pregunta: “¿Quién debe ser ungido?” Quizás podamos comenzar con quiénes no deberían ser ungidos... No es para personas sanas, ni siquiera para alguien que se despertó con un resfriado u otra condición más común y pasajera. Además, esta unción no es para bebés y niños pequeños, generalmente considerados como aquellos menores de 7 u 8 años.

Pero si tienes una enfermedad aguda o crónica (la conoces, pero no es necesario que nadie más la sepa) o si estás significativamente debilitado a causa de tu edad, este Sacramento es para ti.

Reservaremos algunos asientos en la primera fila en las Misas de ese fin de semana, para animar a aquellos que tienen problemas de movilidad a acercarse al sacramento. Después de las intercesiones y algunas oraciones y la imposición de manos sobre cada persona que será ungida, cada uno será ungido en la frente y en las manos. Habrá una oración final y se continuará con la Misa con la Preparación de las Ofrendas. Piense si es candidato para este sacramento. Si no está seguro, puede pedirnos a cualquiera de nosotros, los sacerdotes, que le ayudemos a tomar esa decisión.

Durante la unción, el sacerdote dice estas palabras para cada persona: “Por esta sancta unción, y por su bondadosa misericordia, te ayude el Señor con la gracia de Espíritu Santo. Para que libre de tus pecados, te conceda la salvación y te conforte en tu enfermedad. Amen.”

## **Misas del Día de Todos los Santos y del Día de los Difuntos**

El Día de Todos los Santos, miércoles 1 de noviembre, nuestras Misas serán en inglés a las 8:00 am, Misa escolar a las 10:45 (todos son bienvenidos) y bilingües (inglés y español) a las 6:00 pm. El Día de Todos los Santos es un día santo de obligación.

El Día de Todos los Difuntos, jueves 2 de noviembre, las misas serán a las 8:00 am en inglés y a las 6:00 pm en español. Aunque no es un día de obligación, el Día de los Difuntos ofrece una oportunidad especial para que la comunidad cristiana recuerde en oración a nuestros amados muertos.
