## **From Monsignor Fran Cilia**

Some of the followers of Saint John the Baptist clung to the hope that John himself was the Messiah; obviously, Jesus' followers (then and now) believed the same about Him. But it is not a case of one faction triumphing over the other. The disciples of Jesus (who eventually produced the gospels as we have received them) held John in the very highest esteem, as can be seen in this Sunday's gospel passage:

John the Baptist saw Jesus coming toward him and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. He is the one of whom I said, 'A man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me because he existed before me.'

John is hailed as the "last and greatest" of the prophets and even as the sole prophet of the New Testament. His message is clear: He points to Jesus and not to himself. As we leave the Christmas Season and observe these weeks of "Ordinary Time," we can ask ourselves if we follow John's example. Is it Christ to whom our lives point, or would we rather draw attention to ourselves?

The First Reading for Sunday is from the Book of Isaiah. ## A New Year, New Beginnings for the Christian Steward

The practice of making New Year's resolutions goes back over 3000 years. The start of a New Year gives us the feeling of a fresh start, a new beginning, and new opportunities. It is a time when people feel that they can begin anew with their lives. Common New Year's resolutions are to lose weight, exercise more and eat healthier; or to spend more time with family. Still others include managing money better and being more organized.

Although there is nothing in the Bible or notable in Christian tradition about New Year's resolutions, many good stewards take advantage of this time of year to become closer to the Lord. They may re-commit themselves to pray more, to read the Bible, or to attend Mass more regularly. If you are looking for some ideas for your New Year's resolutions, here are a few to get you started:

**Practice gratitude** – Cultivating a grateful heart is the hallmark of a Christian steward. Every day, express thankfulness to the Lord and to others.

**Encounter the Lord each day** – Find time to be with the Lord each day, whether it be for an hour or ten minutes. Have a conversation with the Lord. Give your joys and worries to Him as well. Allow God's love to transform them. Our encounters will keep our eyes and ears open to the presence of Christ in our midst.

**Be present to others** – There is much celebration and mourning, joy and sorrow in peoples' lives. What a blessing it is to be able to share those times and not let others experience them alone. The gift of your presence to others is much more valuable than you realize.

**Resist overwork** – There is a pressure to produce, meet goals, be successful. But activities that lead us to overwork, constant fatigue and worry do not give glory to God. What God calls us to do we can do well. Be mindful that life requires balance, down time and letting go of unrealistic goals.

## **Boletim Paroquial Português**

815de Janeiro de 2023; Domingo II do Tempo Comum – A  
*Reflexão pelo Padre Francisco Rodrigues S.J.*

**Jesus, Aquele que salva porque nos devolve a saúde do corpo e da alma!** A leitura do evangelho deste II domingo do tempo comum sugere-nos dois pontos (entre outros). Quem é Jesus em si? Quem é Jesus para mim?

Primeira questão: João Baptista apresenta Jesus aos seus interlocutores, como: “O Cordeiro de Deus que tira o pecado do mundo.” Ou “Aquele que passou à sua frente porque existia antes de João”. Ou ainda “Aquele sobre o qual, viu uma pomba repousar sobre Jesus, que batizará no Espírito Santo. João atesta e testemunha que Jesus é o Filho de Deus.”

Através dos evangelhos, nota-se que o modo como João entende e apresenta Jesus marca a maneira como fala dele e o testemunha. Para João, Jesus não era um simples amigo, Aquele que vem depois dele e de quem ele, João, dá testemunho. Para João, Jesus é Aquele que nos salva dos nossos pecados, que nos salva das nossas fragilidades. Salvar significa devolver a saúde perdida; não só do espírito mas do corpo. Quando dizemos que Jesus salvou muitas pessoas significa que lhes devolveu a saúde do coração, da alma, do corpo. É esta saúde que nos enche de esperança numa vida plena de sentido. Jesus salva-nos das nossas angústias, medos, receios e inseguranças. Foi este Jesus salvador que João Batista apresentou!

E cada um de nós? Só podemos apresentar alguém que conhecemos. Ninguém apresenta um desconhecido. Ninguém dá boas informações de alguém que não conhece. Cada um de nós precisa de conhecer Jesus para falar dele com propriedade como fez João Batista. Precisamos de interiorizar que Jesus não foi só um homem bom. Jesus não coloriu a história com o sonho ingénuo de um mundo melhor e desapareceu de seguida deixando-nos entregues a nós mesmos. Pela ressurreição, testemunho dos apóstolos e ação do Espírito Santo, Ele continua connosco. No entanto, o pecado continua a enublar o nosso horizonte de esperança. As guerras, vinganças, terrorismo, exploração, egoísmo, corrupção, injustiça continuam na ordem do dia. O que é que tem falhado? Provavelmente somos todos nós, cada um no seu lugar, que ainda não experimentamos Jesus como salvador, que nos salva e nos coloca numa atitude de salvadores nas situações ou cruzamentos em que nos encontramos. Deus não impõe nada e respeita a liberdade das nossas escolhas. Ajudará muito conhecer melhor Jesus através do estudo e da meditação da sua palavra. Temos que falar mais vezes com Ele antes de falar dele. Apesar das nossas incoerências e fragilidades, não podemos desistir de conhecer Jesus com crescente profundidade. Quem é Ele para mim? A resposta a esta questão ditará o modo como eu o vivo e o apresento. Sendo que, continuaremos a lidar com as consequências das nossas fragilidades, pois sabemos que os novos céus e a nova terra que nos estão prometidas, são um caminho, mas o caminho faz-se a caminhar. No entanto, tendo a Ele como companhia de jornada, seguramente que chegaremos à meta.

## **Eleições do CPP**

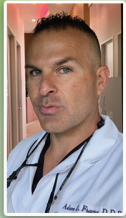

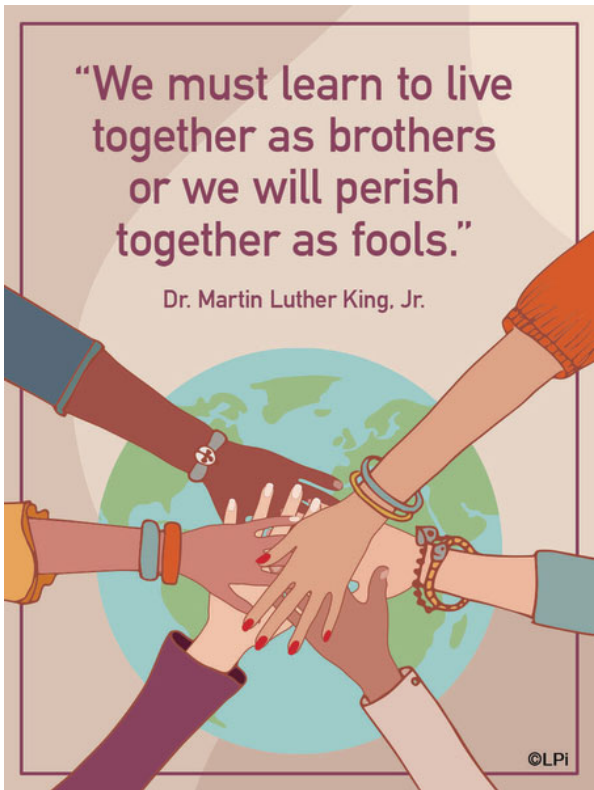
