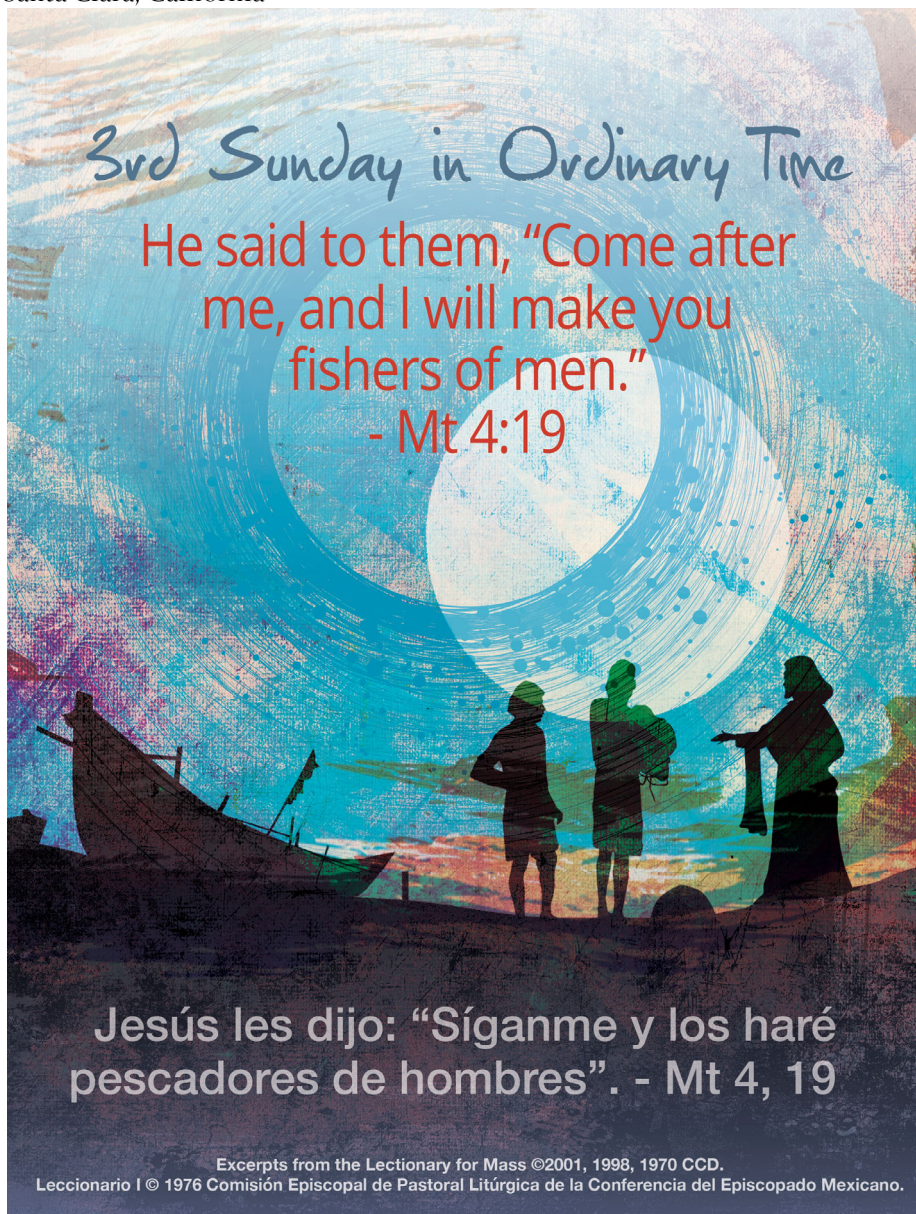

## **From Monsignor Fran Cilia**

---

One of the major themes of Christmas and Epiphany is that Christ is the Light of the World. Now that the Christmas Season is past, and we have returned to "Ordinary Time," we hear again part of the Old Testament reading from Christmas Eve Mass: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light. . ." (Isaiah 9:1). Near the beginning of His public ministry, Jesus quotes this passage, in obvious reference to the work He had begun. And then he began calling the disciples to Himself, so that they could share his ministry, bringing light to all those in the dark places.

This weekend's second reading puts the ministry of the apostles in the context of the early Church, where factions had begun to surface. Saint Paul repeats some of what the first believers were saying: "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." And he asks this question: "Is Christ divided?"

The Lord's followers are still divided in many ways. During "Christian Unity Week," we focus on that which unites us in the Lord. We are asked to recommit ourselves to the vision of the Lord Who prayed that "all may be one." And within our own Church, we should strive toward unity, which is a gift from the Lord. In that way, we can let the Lord's light shine on all.

## Creation Care Tips

*“As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew, his brother, casting a net into the sea—for they were fishermen. And he said to them, 'Follow me, and I will make you fish for people.' Immediately they left their nets and followed him.” —Matthew 4:18-20*

Jesus spent a lot of time in boats, on beaches, and along shorelines, and he spent a lot of time with people who made their livelihoods from fishing. If you've ever been to shores in the Holy Land where Jesus once walked or imagined them in your own prayer, you probably don't envision them littered with all the trash that is so common on our beaches now. Imagine how distressed Jesus would be to walk along a shoreline cluttered with plastic straws, bottles, cans, pieces of styrofoam, old tires, etc. Make time to go to a beach or shoreline near you and pick up trash. If you don't live near a body of water, do the same in your neighborhood. Better yet, go with a friend or family member, or take some kids with you to multiply the effect.

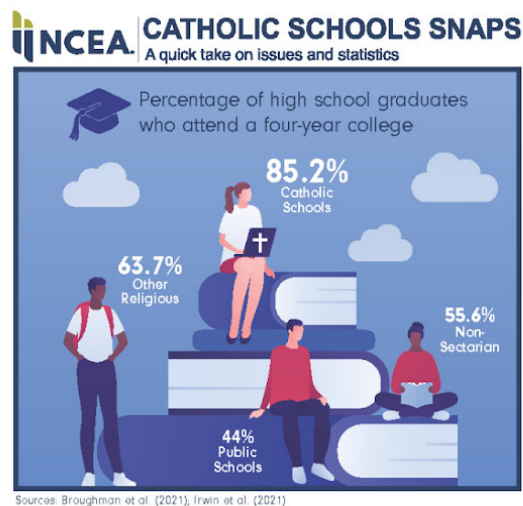


## Saint Clare School News

**Nurture friendships** – Our friends are those we choose to be with, those with whom we spend our evenings, with whom we vacation, to whom we go to for advice. Friends are gifts from God who give us a greater appreciation of God's love for us. Friends need our time and love.

**Give more** – Good stewards realize that everything they have is entrusted to them as a gift to be shared. There is no better place to begin than sharing with the community that gathers around the Lord's table at Mass. Consider what you are giving to your parish and local diocese and commit to an even greater contribution as circumstances allow.

**Make a difference in your parish community** – Believe it or not, your parish community can use your talents. Offering your talents to your faith community is one of the most effective ways to feel useful and connected to others, and it is a potentially life-changing New Year's resolution.



Ask the Lord for guidance, strength and perseverance in achieving your resolutions.

**Consider living more simply** – We cannot find fulfillment in possessions. They add nothing to our self-worth. Jesus blessed the "poor in spirit" in his Sermon on the Mount; and Saint Francis of Assisi urged us to live with only what was necessary, for that is how we begin to find God.

**Get healthy** – Studies show that most people in North America are accelerating their own decline into premature old age, owing to poor diet and lack of physical activity. Be a good steward of your body. If necessary, plan a complete overhaul of your diet and exercise habits.

**Don't give up** – People give up their New Year's resolutions because of perfectionism and unrealistic expectations. So take it slow, be kind to yourself and keep trying. Resist the urge to throw your hands up and quit. You succeed through small, manageable changes over time.

**Turn to the Lord** – Ask the Lord for guidance, strength and perseverance in achieving your resolutions. In his letter to the Philippians, Saint Paul writes: "I can do everything through Him who gives me strength" (Phil 4:13). If God is the center of our New Year's resolutions, they have a better chance for success.

## STEWARDSHIP SAINT *for January*

### Saint André Bessette, C.S.C.



Saint Andre Bessette was born in 1845 in the village of Saint-Grégoire d'Iberville, in what is now the Archdiocese of Montreal, Canada. Baptized as Alfred, by the time he was 12 he had to work because both of his parents had died. At age 22 he moved to the United

States, where he labored alternately in mills and on farms in New England. He returned to Montreal where he joined the Congregation of Holy Cross in 1870 with the encouragement of Father André Provençal, who had observed Alfred spending whole nights in prayer and sent a note with Alfred that read, "I am sending you a saint."

Alfred made his final vows in 1874 and was given the religious name of André. For some forty years Brother Andre served as janitor, porter, infirmarian, gardener, baker of the altar bread and in other capacities at the College of Our Lady of the Snows near Montreal. In 1905, at age 60, Brother Andre was transferred to Montreal.

Much attention centered on Brother André himself because of the number of cures that were attributed to him, so many, in fact, that he was called the "Miracle Man of Montreal."

From his childhood Brother Andre had a strong devotion to Saint Joseph and spent his life promoting devotion to the foster-father of Jesus. He founded and helped to build the Oratory of St. Joseph. The popularity of the oratory grew as it became a place of pilgrimage because of the many healings attributed to the intercession of Brother André and Saint Joseph. It was referred to as the "Lourdes of Canada," and became one of the most popular shrines in North America drawing millions of pilgrims to Montreal.

Much attention centered on Brother André himself because of the number of cures that were attributed to him, so many, in fact, that he was called the "Miracle Man of Montreal." Brother Andre died on January 6, 1937, at age 91. Over a million mourners processed past his casket. He was beatified by Saint John Paul II in 1982 and he was canonized a saint in 2010 by Pope Benedict XVI. His feast is on January 6.

Algunos de los seguidores de San Juan Bautista se aferraron a la esperanza de que el mismo Juan era el Mesías; obviamente, los seguidores de Jesús (entonces y ahora) creían lo mismo acerca de Él. Pero no se trata de que una facción triunfe sobre la otra. Los discípulos de Jesús (quienes eventualmente produjeron los evangelios tal como los hemos recibido) tenían a Juan en la más alta estima, como se puede ver en el pasaje del evangelio de este domingo:

Juan el Bautista vio a Jesús que venía hacia él y dijo: “He aquí el Cordero de Dios, que quita el pecado del mundo. Él es aquel de quien dije: 'Viene detrás de mí un hombre que está delante de mí porque existió antes que yo.'”

Juan es aclamado como el “último y más grande” de los profetas e incluso como el único profeta del Nuevo Testamento. Su mensaje es claro: apunta a Jesús y no a sí mismo. Al dejar la Temporada de Navidad y observar estas semanas del “Tiempo Ordinario”, podemos preguntarnos si seguimos el ejemplo de Juan. ¿Es Cristo a quien apuntan nuestras vidas, o preferimos llamar la atención sobre nosotros mismos?

## Boletim Paroquial Português

Reflexão do Padre Francisco Rodrigues S.J.

### Os pescadores foram pescados!

A leitura do evangelho deste III domingo do tempo comum, recorda-nos alguns momentos em que Jesus chamou aqueles que vieram a constituir o grupo dos primeiros apóstolos. Eram homens que tinham a sua vida familiar constituída, como acontece hoje com a maior parte dos leigos. Eis alguns dos principais traços que os caracterizam: são trabalhadores, responsáveis pelo sustento das suas famílias, humildes, tementes a Deus e que viviam a sua vida ordinária sem dar nas vistas. Na vida destes homens, não havia nada de extraordinário. Jesus chama-os a partir da realidade laboral das suas vidas. Jesus dirige-se a quem trabalha ou a quem manifesta atitude de trabalhador. O mar era para estes homens fonte de sustento. Conheciam noites de sucesso e noites de trabalho sem resultados.

Mas, persistentes e perseverantes, não consta que alguma vez tenham voltado as costas ao mar. Os insucessos não os vacilava ao ponto de desistirem das redes. Ainda assim, estavam longe de pensar que naquela noite, ao lançarem as redes, seriam eles próprios a serem pescados!

Porque eram bons pescadores, perseverantes e persistentes, foram por Jesus pescados. Assim, as suas vidas foram totalmente mudadas. Com Jesus e na barca de Jesus, já não pescam peixes para alimentar a família, pescam sim, homem e mulheres para o Reino de Deus. O barco deu lugar a uma enorme barca. O lago deu lugar a um gigante oceano. A família que deixaram, deu lugar a uma enorme família que aos poucos foi crescendo e hoje está espalhada pelo mundo inteiro. No entanto, Jesus não chama só operários que lhe entregam a vida através do sacerdócio ou da vida religiosa. Jesus começou por chamar leigos e hoje continua também a chamar leigos. Leigos que cuidem da comunidade, dos seus pastores, dos mais idosos e doentes. Hoje, Jesus continua a chamar a partir do que fazemos e de onde estamos, a sermos a comunidade. É bom que os mesmos de sempre continuem a servir a comunidade. No entanto, não tem que ser sempre os mesmos a fazerem sempre as mesmas coisas. Hoje é Jesus que te chama para algum ministério. Não deixes que os doentes e idosos fiquem privados da tua visita. Disponibiliza-te para os serviços litúrgicos e sociais, no caso de te serem solicitados. Constrói comunidade. Participa nos eventos. Colabora. Dá de ti com confiança. Se soubéssemos o que ganhamos em dar e servir por amor, seríamos muito mais dedicados e generosos. Lança as redes no mar da tua vida. Quando as lançares, é possível que sejas por Jesus pescado. Se assim for, se entrares na barca de Jesus, não sabes para onde vais mas sabes com quem vais e isso te basta. Isso é suficiente para pescares se antes tiveres sido pescado por Jesus.
