## **From Monsignor Fran Cilia**

---

The Beatitudes has been called Constitution of the Reign of God. Through them, Jesus taught the values, virtues and attitudes to his followers. It is not that Jesus instructed his listeners to be meek or mourning or persecuted or insulted. Rather, the Beatitudes are lessons on how to live when bad things happen to people, as they do to every person. What distinguishes the followers of Jesus is how we react to the presence of suffering in our lives. Jesus teaches us to find blessedness or happiness even during the difficulties we experience, and He promises heavenly rewards.

In the end, the question to each of us is whether we try to evade the trials of our lives or do we learn to grow through them, even remaining hopeful and faith-filled in bad times?

This weekend – Friday through Sunday – our Diocesan Assembly for the Synod gathers at Santa Clara University. From the 8000 comments and suggestions received from throughout the Diocese, there are now 96 proposals, organized around 8 themes. Please keep the delegates from our parish and from throughout Santa Clara County in your prayers, that all of us will be guided by the Holy Spirit in our listening, discussions and deliberations.

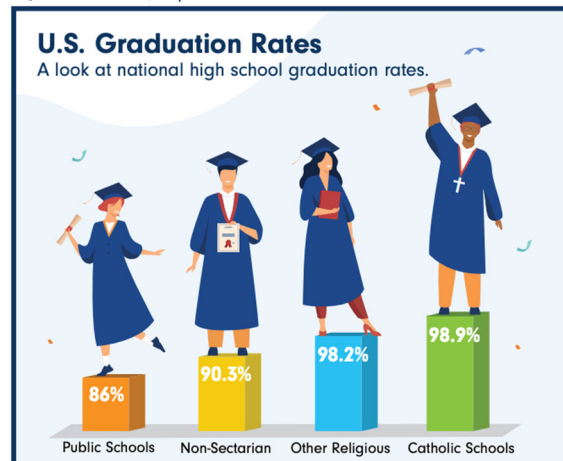

### Cada um de nós pode ser bem-aventurado!

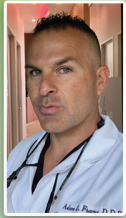
PARISH COMMUNITY O evangelho deste IV domingo do tempo comum, recorda-nos as bem-aventuranças transmitidas por Jesus à multidão enquanto o escutavam na montanha. Trata-se de um dos textos mais bonitos, encorajadores e inspiradores do novo testamento. No meio de luzes e sombra, terrenos lineares e irregulares da vida, as bem-aventuranças apresentam-se como uma espécie de consolação cheia de futuro animador. Também o mundo mundano tem as suas bem-aventuranças que contrastam totalmente com as de Jesus. Cada um de nós está no mundo, mas não é do mundo, pelo menos não se deve identificar com o mundo mundano. Viver na mundo, comprometer-se com o nosso mundo, mas não pactuar com as bem-aventuranças mundanas exige muita perseverança. No mundo mundano que exalta o poder pelo poder, o orgulho, a influência, o ter muitos bens, as meias verdades, a glória e o sucesso a qualquer preço, a impureza, a vaidade, entre tantas outras, Jesus propõe a humildade, a verdade, a simplicidade, a pobreza e pureza de coração, o perdão, a construção da paz, as lágrimas por amor à justiça. Jesus até louva as perseguições, insultos e todo o mal contra os seus discípulos sem ter dado ocasião a isso. Como podemos estar no mundo e não vivermos as bem-aventuranças mundanas? Como podemos estar na nossa família, no trabalho, nas nossas associações, com os amigos e vivermos as bem-aventuranças que Jesus nos propõem, principalmente em momentos críticos de aceitação e nos quais se tornam muito mais tentadoras as bem-aventuranças mundanas?

Jesus não nos ilude, não nos promete facilidades sedutoras mas enganadoras. Poderá não ser fácil viver no mundo com os critérios e bem-aventuranças de Jesus. A história da Igreja mostra-nos que muitos conseguiram viver a fidelidade das bem-aventuranças até ao fim dos seus dias. Onde encontraram a força que os inspirou e o alimento que os fortificou? Encontraram pelo menos em quatro fontes: na eucaristia e sacramentos, na oração diária, na Palavra de Deus e nas boas obras. Por isso, pela graça de Deus e pelo seu muito trabalho, transformaram-se em pessoas bem-aventuradas junto de quem viveram e conviveram. Jesus é por excelência, o bem-aventurado. Cada um de nós é convidado a ser imagem e semelhança sua. No meio das incompreensões, adversidades, fragilidades, sou bem-aventurado ao jeito de Jesus? Vivo orientado pelas bem-aventuranças de Jesus, ou ando distraído e desatento ao programa de vida que Jesus me propõe para meu verdadeiro bem, aqui e na eternidade?
