

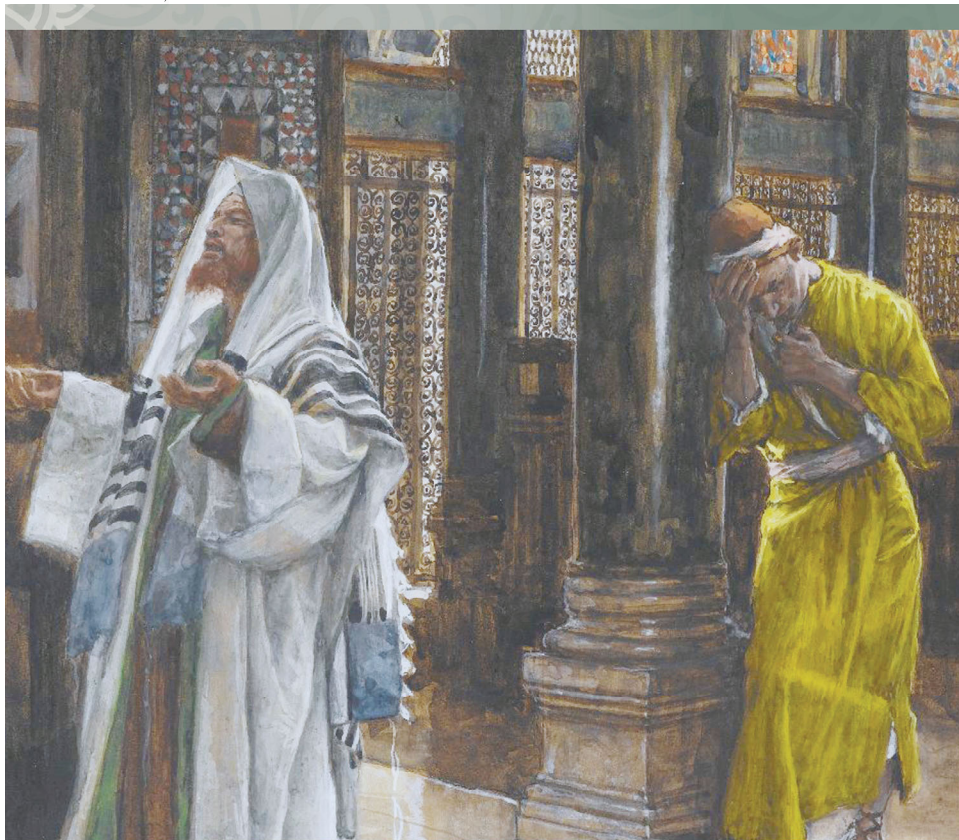

“Jesus addressed this parable to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else. “Two people went up to the temple area to pray. . .”

The “righteous” Pharisee did not pray to God, but “to himself,” for he was truly full of himself, his own goodness, religious observance, and so much more.

The other person, a tax collector, really prayed to God: “Be merciful to me, a sinner.” Because of his penitential attitude, he went home justified, for “the one who exalts oneself will be humbled and the one who humbles oneself will be exalted.”

Sometimes, good people fall into the frame of mind of the Pharisee, so taken with their goodness, that it blinds them to the reality of their faults and the need to seek pardon from the Lord. As Pope Francis teaches, “the face of God is mercy,” but to experience this compassion, we need to be humble – honest – before the Lord. If we judge ourselves according to the perceived faults of others, we will be lost. Rather, we should strive to be responsive to the call to holiness in the best ways possible for each of us.

Deacon Eddie Ngô, S.J., to do Pastoral Ministry at Saint Clare Parish



We will welcome Jesuit transitional deacon, Eddie Ngô, at Masses next weekend. He will be sharing ministry here, as his schedule allows, from now until his ordination as a priest in the spring.

Here is a brief biography:

Being the youngest son of a large Vietnamese Buddhist family, Eddie is a convert to the Roman Catholic faith, being

nurtured in the community of Saint Ann's parish in Coppell, Texas. After attending public school all his life, he went on to earn a bachelor's degree in biochemistry from the University of Dallas, a Roman Catholic institute of higher education crucial to his who he is today as a human being. He then completed graduate studies at the University of Texas Medical School, Houston. Prior to entering the Society of Jesus, he worked as a family physician, took part in medical mission trips to Ethiopia and Peru, and taught confirmation classes while leading music for the youth mass. Eddie completed his pre-theology studies at ITESO (Western Institute of Technology and Higher Education – Universidad Jesuita de Guadalajara in Mexico), worked in ministry as the Immersion Program Director at Ignatian Center for Jesuit Education at Santa Clara University in California, and now is currently studying theology at Jesuit School of Theology of Santa Clara University. He was ordained a transitional deacon in October, 2021, having served with the wonderful parish of Saint Theresa's in Oakland under Father Bob McCann, before moving to the South Bay. He looks forward to getting to know the community of Saint Clare, of whom he has already heard of their loving joy and great faith.

Weekly Justice Challenge



Sunday's Responsorial Psalm proclaims that "The Lord hears the cry of the poor." The question is: Do WE hear the cry of those in need—in our families, in our communities, in our country, and even in the world? Or are we too focused on our own issues and worries that we tune out the cries of those around us? Your challenge this week is to listen. Be open to hearing the cries of those who suffer from injustice, hatred, hunger, poverty, loneliness, or whatever might be keeping them from living in hope and joy. Listen to people's stories; listen to the news; just listen. Then choose one voice you have heard and decide how you can reach out and help the person whose cry spoke to your heart. It might be just listening further, or it might be donating time or money. The important thing is that you respond to the cry you have heard.

Humanitarian Assistance to Refugees in Diocese of El Paso

"For I was a stranger, you welcomed me". The Diocese of El Paso is helping with humanitarian assistance to refugees arriving on the U.S. border. Immigrants/ Refugees processed by ICE or Border Patrol are released and need assistance in getting to their final U.S. destination where they will appear at an immigration court hearing. The Diocese of El Paso has organized immigrant hospitality centers to offer hot meals, shelter, clothes, prayer, and connections to family members to make travel arrangements. They need volunteers who can travel to El Paso for one week and serve our immigrant brothers and sisters in their time of need. The process is fairly simple in that you can help with welcoming our guests, making meals, helping with intake, making phone calls to family for giving rides to the airport or bus station. VOTE “NO” ON PROPOSITION 1

Proposition 1 is a worst-case scenario for abortion in California. It is an expensive and misleading ballot measure that allows unlimited late-term abortions — for any reason, at any time, paid for by tax dollars.

Luego completó estudios de posgrado en la Facultad de Medicina de la Universidad de Texas, en Houston. Antes de ingresar a la Compañía de Jesús, trabajó como médico familiar, participó en viajes misioneros médicos a Etiopía y Perú, y enseñó clases de confirmación mientras dirigía música para la misa de jóvenes. Eddie completó sus estudios de pre-teología en el ITESO (Instituto

Tecnológico y de Estudios Superiores de Occidente- Universidad Jesuita de Guadalajara en México), trabajó en el ministerio como Director del Programa de Inmersión en el Centro Ignaciano para la Educación Jesuita en la Universidad de Santa Clara en California, y ahora actualmente estudia teología en la Escuela Jesuita de Teología de la Universidad de Santa Clara. Fue ordenado diácono de transición en octubre de 2021, después de haber servido en la maravillosa parroquia de Santa Teresa en Oakland bajo el padre Bob McCann, antes de mudarse a South Bay. Boletim Paroquial Português

Domingo XXX do Tempo Comum-C *Reflexão por: João Pereira Arruda*

As Leituras deste Domingo dão-nos uma certeza de que Deus não faz acepção de pessoas; assim nos afirma a Primeira Leitura do Livro de Ben-Sirá. Mas segundo a parábola do Evangelho faz claramente uma distinção entre a oração do publicano e do fariseu. Deus em muitas partes da Bíblia mostra-nos ser um Deus que aceita todos os homens e mulheres com seus; e como tal, todos tem os mesmos direitos e oportunidades de pelo baptismo sermos seus filhos e como tal herdeiros do Reino. As liberdades, mal geridas, pelos homens e mulheres deste mundo, criam métodos de vida complicados que nos afastam de Deus e do Seu Amor por nós. Essa diferença se espelha nos dois métodos de orar do fariseu que dentro do templo e perto do altar, dizia a Deus tudo de bom que fazia no cumprimento da lei, das percentagens da esmolas que dava para a administração do templo e que por assim ser merecia melhor sorte do que a do publicano. Por seu turno o publicano nas trazeiras do templo implorava ao Senhor que tivesse dele compaixão e que usasse Sua misericórdia no perdão dos seus pecados. Deus ama os publicanos tal e qual ama os fariseus, porém os fariseus, por cumprirem as leis ou obrigações não têm mais direito que os publicanos, os pobres que não tem nem podem contribuir tal como os fariseus, nem por isso o Senhor tem-os em menor consideração em relação aos ricos, aos poderosos, aos que tem posições de chefia nas sociedades. Jesus afirma no final do Evangelho: *“Eu vos digo que o publicano saiu do templo justificado para a sua casa e o fariseu não.”* Porque todo aquele que se exalta será humilhado e quem se humilha será exaltado.” Sendo a oração um dos meios mais eficazes de nos comunicarmos com Deus, usemos esta para com ela nos comunicarmos e que o façamos de coração aberto e transparente; porque o Deus a quem dirigimos a nossa oração sabe tudo e por assim ser não dá jeito nenhum dizer-Lhe o que Ele sabe de antemão o bem que fazemos neste mundo, mas sim faz a diferença se Lhe dissermos que somos fracos e pecadores e que necessitamos do Seu Amor e do Seu Perdão. Como exercício ao nosso comprometimento analisamos os nossos métodos de orar: se o fazemos como o fariseu para dizer a Deus que fazes esmolas, fazes devoções e novenas e que por assim ser Deus não tem outro remédio senão dar o prémio por essas boas obras que fazes. Por outro lado vê se procedes nas tuas orações que perante Deus apelas ao Seu Amor e á Sua misericórdia em atenuação á tuas falhas – pecados.

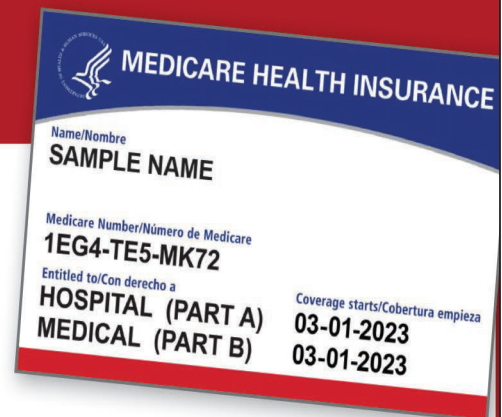
