Zacchaeus, the chief tax collector, wanted to see Jesus; he was curious, so he climbed a tree for a good view. His story, from the nineteenth chapter of the Gospel of Luke, could have ended there, but it was only the beginning. Jesus saw him, called him by name and went to Zacchaeus' house for dinner. Jesus was more than curious about the tax collector; He was looking for him; the Lord was intent on saving him, despite the murmurings of the "good people."

Our individual histories mirror – or echo – this. The Lord calls each of us by name, for God wants nothing more than our sharing His life ("I have come that they may have life and have it to the full" [John 10:10].)

In the end, the mission of the Church is the proclamation of this good news and, through the sacraments, to guide us in the ways of God's life, even as we continue to share this message "to the ends of the earth." Each of us shares this mission, which begins at home. . . in each of our homes. The Gospel is not a weapon, but an invitation. Faith cannot be forced, but learned from the example of our lives and the joy of the Good News. Just as He was looking for Zacchaeus, so the Lord continues to look for us and, in a special way, for those who have wandered from Him over the years.

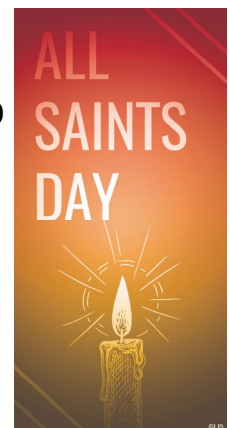

Parish/School Consultation Sessions

- Thank you to all who have held and submitted your parish or school consultation sessions summary worksheets.
- Nearly all 26 schools have completed their consultations sessions and only handful have yet to submit their summary worksheet.
- 37 of our parishes have completed their consultations sessions. 9 have scheduled their consultation session within the next two weeks. We are working with the remaining 7 parishes and missions to help them with their session.

Synod Survey – Consultation of the Faithful

- The diocesan synod survey opened today online and is available in English, Spanish and Vietnamese. It will remain open through Thanksgiving.
- Please share Bishop’s video inviting everyone to complete the survey

- Key Talking Points about the Survey:
 - Bishop wants to hear from all Catholics in Santa Clara County, including those no longer practicing their faith.
 - The purpose of the survey is to gain a greater understanding of the pastoral needs of the Catholic community in Santa Clara County and discern pastoral priorities for our diocese for the coming years.
 - The survey is available in English, Spanish or Vietnamese. It will take 10-15 minutes to complete the survey, and responses will be anonymous.
 - The input will be integrated into the information to be considered by the Diocesan Synod General Assembly, when recommending priorities for our diocese’s new Pastoral Plan on how our diocese will serve God’s People in the coming years.

General Assembly

- All delegates have received their invitation to the general assembly on January 27-29, 2023 at Santa Clara University and are confirming their participation.
- For those who have submitted updated delegates or replacements, we have sent invitations this week to the new delegates. We have 130 delegates confirmed to participate.
- Delegates will be attending a day of prayer and orientation on Saturday, November 5th.

VOTE “NO” ON PROPOSITION 1

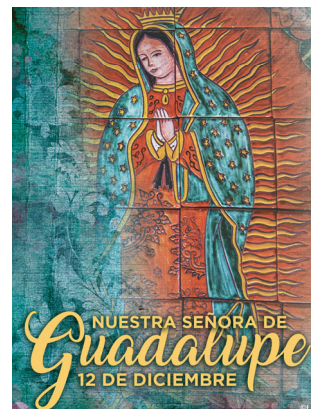

Ao aproximarmo-nos do fim do Ano Litúrgico do ciclo C, as leituras do fim de qualquer ano litúrgico, seja que ciclo for alertam-nos para estarmos preparados para nos encontrarmos com o Senhor Deus. 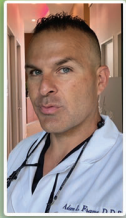

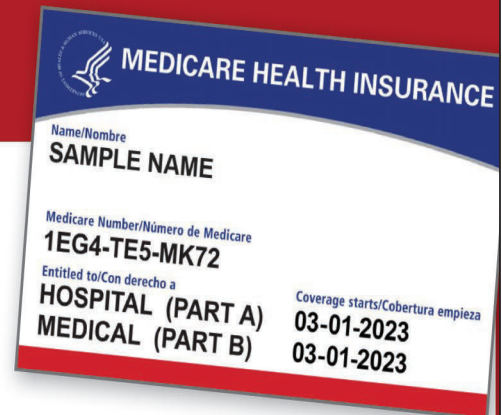
