We began distributing *Little Blue Books* at Mass last weekend. Copies are still available in English and in Spanish. Please get yours before they are gone.

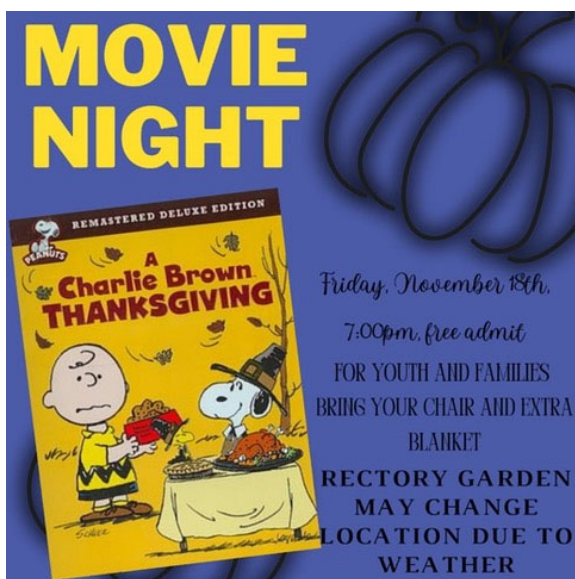
Advent Wreath Candles

You might consider how Mary was about eight months into her pregnancy at this time of year all those years ago but she didn’t have the benefit of central heating to keep herself warm. If she managed, we can manage by using less energy to heat our homes now.

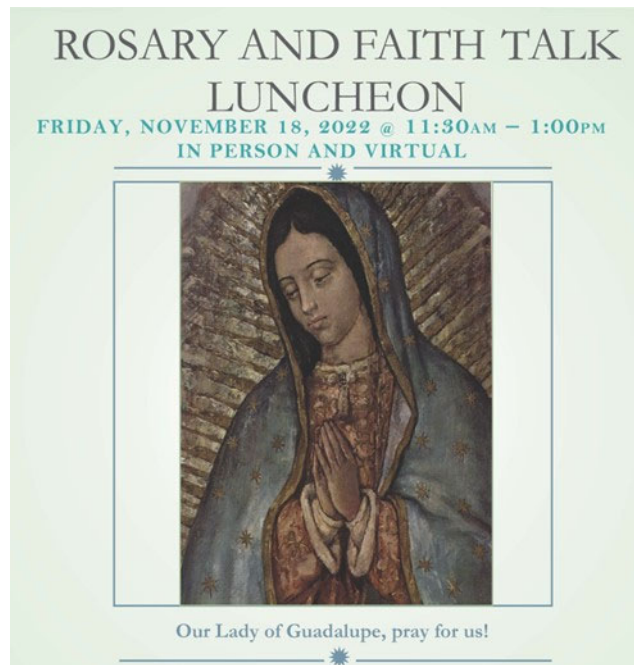

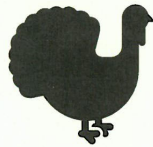

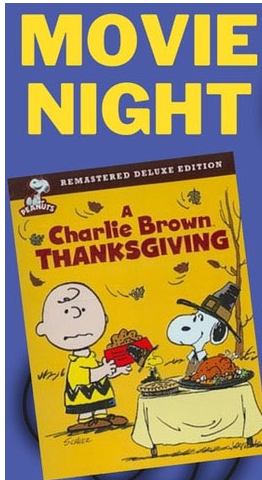
Los Libritos Azules para Adviento y Navidad

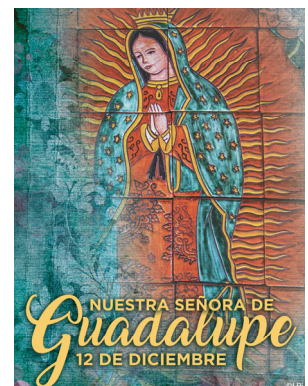

Domingo XXXIII do Tempo Comum-C

Reflexão por: João Pereira Arruda

“Vale a pena morrer às mãos dos homens quando se espera que Deus nos ressuscite”. Foi esta a atitude dos sete irmãos Macabeus perante a idolatria do tempo deles. Qual a nossa atitude perante a idolatria dos nossos dias? Primeiro é necessário reconhecer o que é de Deus e o que é do mundo. Saber profundamente a diferença entre estar com Deus e estar com o que o mundo nos oferece. Estar com Deus exige uma atitude semelhante às dos irmãos Macabeus. Ter a coragem em dizer: NÃO! Ao excessivo consumismo. Quando se sabe diferenciar entre Deus e o mundo pode-se não acreditar nas mensagens dos políticos, dos meios abundantes da comunicação social, seja esta: rádio, televisão, escrita ou electrónica toda ela semeia: teorias, de confusão que resulta em desconfiança e violência.. Na maioria da informação destes meios vem de interesses de corruptos governantes que nada têm a ver com Deus nem com o interesse da salvação dos mais fracos, dos que trabalham uma vida toda para o magro sustento de si e sua família. Mas Deus está com estes que são vítimas das artimanhas do mundo mas fieis a Deus, esses são os macabeus que recusaram comer a carne que era proibida pela lei. A lição que os irmãos Macabeus nos traz neste Domingo, o penúltimo do Tempo Comum do ciclo C, é não pactuar com o mal do mundo, recusar a oferta do mundo, sempre que esta esteja em não conformidade com a lei de Deus, é o sinal que pela oração, pelo relacionamento que se tem com Deus ficamos conscientes da diferença em estar com Deus e a de estar no mundo seguindo os ídolos feitos de “barro” que facilmente partem e de nada servem. As dúvidas ou as objeções levantadas pelos saduceus sobre a ressurreição essencialmente são as que ainda hoje se levanta. A ressurreição vive-se sempre que o homem se renova e se propõe construir algo de novo. Que nunca percamos a fé que em Cristo nunca morreremos porque n’Ele ressuscitamos. Com Ele viveremos a vida eterna, no Reino em que o Pai tem lugar preparado para cada um de nós. Na ressurreição está o objectivo de morreremos para depois ressuscitar com Jesus. Todos os finais dos anos litúrgicos presentam-nos o final das nossas vidas. Todos eles nos levam em ter em conta em estarmos preparados para estar perante Deus e dar ao Pai a “contabilidade” da nossa vida terrena, sem medo pois tudo Ele sabe e a todos Ele ama com a Sua infinita misericordiosa.


