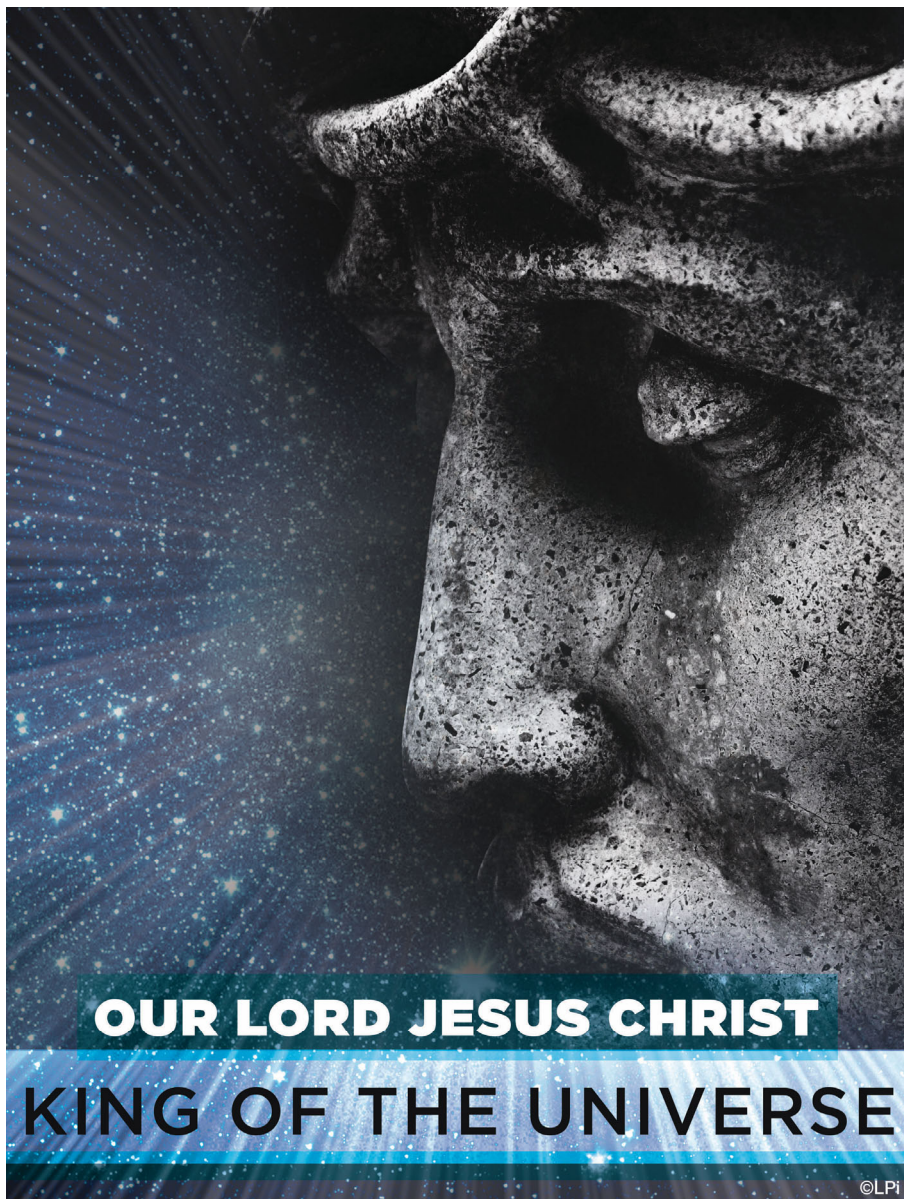

Parish Mission Statement

Founded in 1777, Saint Clare Parish is an ethnically diverse Catholic community of faith, united in worship, discipleship and service. In welcoming immigrants, newcomers and strangers, we strive to live the virtues of justice and love, so as to be the face of Christ in the world, becoming in Him a sign of unity and an instrument of God's peace.

The Jews desperately hoped for a Messiah, the Savior who would rid them of the interference of the Romans who occupied Israel. They wanted an earthly king who brought stability and peace. On Palm Sunday, they proclaimed the Lord with loud Hosannas: “Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!”

And what did they get?

A suffering Savior Who is nailed to the “throne” of the Cross, on which were written the words, “Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews.”

The images of God’s royal reign are not of riches and power, but of servant, shepherd, and, yes, crucifixion.

Saint Paul hands on the to Colossian Christian community a hymn, which we hear in the second reading today. The last lines are these:

He is before all things,
and in him all things hold together.
He is the head of the body, the church.
He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead,
that in all things he himself might be supreme.
For in him all the fullness was pleased to dwell,
and through him to reconcile all things for him,
making peace by the blood of his cross
through him, whether those on earth or those in heaven.

This is the Christ we proclaim today and in Whose reign we seek to live. In proclaiming Jesus Christ as King of the Universe, we need to allow Him to be King of our hopes and dreams and hearts.

Thursday is Thanksgiving Day. It is for us the only true American feast, and it is good that we try to observe it by coming together to celebrate as we give thanks to God for all that we are and all that we have. I hope your schedule allows you to be with us for **the 10:00 am Mass**, which will have elements in English, Spanish and Portuguese. At that Mass, we invite you to bring non-perishable food to support the work of our Saint Vincent de Paul Society – as part of the Procession of Gifts. Also, the collection that day will go toward this work.

Next weekend, we enter into a new liturgical year as we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent. During that season, we proclaim Jesus Christ, the One who is, who was and who is to come. The past and future meet in the present. We look not only to history or some unknown future in search of the Lord. We look around, to welcome Him into our daily lives, in and through the people we encounter each day. May our Advent 2022 be an opportunity for us to discover the many ways God is present to us.

Little Blue Books for Advent and Christmas are still available in the vestibule of the church and at the Parish Office.

Advent Wreath candles [3 purple/1 pink (rose)] are also available, as are some copies of the 2023 Saint Joseph Missal for Sundays and Holy Days. Candles are \$5.50 per set and Missals are \$5.00 each.

2023 Calendars are also available and will be placed in the vestibule. We are anticipating receiving another 500 calendars soon, and we will begin distributing them when they arrive.

This coming **Friday, Mass will be at 9:00 am.**

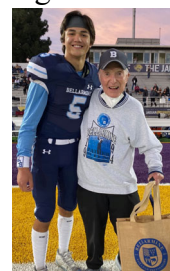

We are so proud of our beautifully diverse and caring community that has been a Santa Clara tradition for 166 years. As a Catholic school in the Diocese of San Jose, Saint Clare School provides an opportunity for those who desire an outstanding character-based education steeped in the Catholic worldview, in a safe and loving environment, surrounded by committed and caring educators. Even as the media reports of learning loss due to the pandemic, Catholic schools, including Saint Clare performed better in post COVID assessments (<https://www.americamagazine.org/politics-society/2022/10/25/catholic-schools-naep-244026>).

In March of 2020, Saint Clare School closed in-person learning on the 13th and reopened with a robust distance learning program in a matter of days on March 17th. Focusing on literacy skills, social emotional learning, and building community despite not being able to be in person, the faculty, staff, and families deepened the commitment we had to accompany one another. It is this commitment that has made the difference in the formation of our students.

Our alumni, now attending Catholic high schools and universities, continue to serve their communities because of the priority given to social justice, instilled in their nine years at Saint Clare. The lasting impact of this formation is immeasurable.

Los judíos esperaban desesperadamente un Mesías, el Salvador que los libraría de la interferencia de los romanos que ocupaban Israel. Querían un rey terrenal que trajera estabilidad y paz. En el Domingo de Ramos proclamaron al Señor con fuertes Hosannas: “¡Bendito el que viene en el nombre del Señor!”

¿Y qué consiguieron?

Un Salvador sufriente que está clavado en el “trono” de la Cruz, en el que fueron escritas las palabras “Jesús de Nazaret, Rey de los judíos”.

Las imágenes del reino real de Dios no son de riquezas y poder, sino de siervo, pastor y, sí, crucifixión.

San Pablo entrega a la comunidad cristiana de Colosenses un himno, que escuchamos en la segunda lectura de hoy. Los últimos versos son estos:

Él es antes de todas las cosas,
y en él todas las cosas subsisten.
Él es la cabeza del cuerpo, la iglesia.
Él es el principio, el primogénito de entre los muertos,
que en todas las cosas él mismo sea supremo.
Porque en él se agradó habitar toda la plenitud,
y por medio de él reconciliar todas las cosas para él,
haciendo la paz por la sangre de su cruz
por medio de él, ya sean los que están en la tierra o los que están en el cielo.

Este es el Cristo que proclamamos hoy y en cuyo reino buscamos vivir. Al proclamar a Jesucristo como Rey del Universo, debemos permitirle que sea el Rey de nuestras esperanzas, sueños y corazones.

El **jueves es el Día de Acción de Gracias**. Es para nosotros la única verdadera fiesta americana, y es bueno que tratemos de observarla reuniéndonos para celebrar mientras damos gracias a Dios por todo lo que somos y todo lo que tenemos. 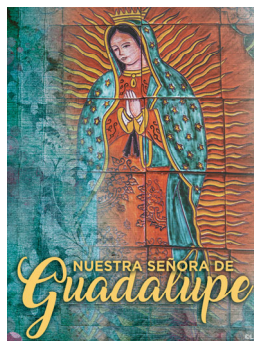

Boletim Paroquial Português

Domingo da Solenidade de Jesus Cristo Rei do Universo

Reflexão por: Padre Francisco Rodrigues S.J.

A liturgia deste domingo assiná-la a solenidade de “Nosso Senhor Jesus Cristo Rei do Universo”. Deste modo, terminamos o ano litúrgico C e damos início ao ano litúrgico A.

Quando nós pensamos em “Rei, Reinado, Magistade” o que compreensivelmente nos vem à mente é poder, glória, ter. Este modo de pensar tem muito a ver com o modo de pensar do mundo mundano. A leitura do evangelho que a Igreja nos propõe para este domingo, contrasta radicalmente com este modo de pensar. Segundo esta narração do evangelho, Jesus, o Rei dos reis, não aparece com poder, nem com magistade, nem com glória, sendo que a Jesus, como Senhor do Universo, Lhe é reconhecido todo o poder, toda a glória e toda a magistade. Assim sendo, como podemos nós lidar com a figura de Jesus, que sendo Senhor de tudo, se apresenta como Senhor de nada? Encontraremos a resposta a esta questão no serviço! Quando o serviço é alimentado pela fé, este tem uma consistência fecunda que dará frutos em abundância. Na verdade, a leitura do evangelho de hoje recorda-nos a narração da paixão. Em Jesus, o serviço pode levar-nos à paixão. Não tenhamos medo das dificuldades! O evangelho recorda-nos ao jeito de Jesus que o reino de que Ele é Senhor é um reino de justiça, de paz, de serviço, de amor, de entrega aos demais. Não é um reino para se servir ou viver comodamente. Não é um Reino deste mundo mundano. Mas é um Reino para este mundo imperfeito mas que Jesus não desiste de o querer melhorar através de cada um de nós. Quando na Cruz o chamado “bom ladrão” se deixou converter e Jesus o acolheu no seu Reino (hoje estarás comigo no paraíso) isto significa que Deus não desiste de nós. Deus tem fé em cada um de nós de que nos podemos voltar para Ele, mesmo quando parecemos condenado e crucificados na dor dos nossos pecados. Que este dia seja uma ocasião privilegiada para pensar que tipo de reino estamos nós a construir, ao serviço de quem! Que este dia seja um dia especial para rezarmos por todos os que parecem andar longe de Deus, para que, voltando-se para o seu rosto possam ouvir: “Hoje estarás comigo no paraíso” ainda que esse paraíso comece na construção do Reino de Deus na Terra. Rezemos de um modo particular pela juventude visto que se assiná-la neste domingo também o seu Dia Mundial.

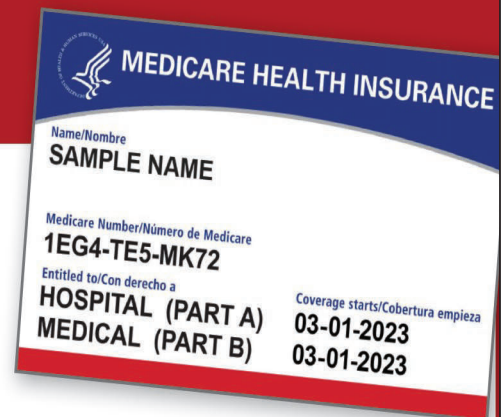
