Founded in 1777, Saint Clare Parish is an ethnically diverse Catholic community of faith, united in worship, discipleship and service. In welcoming immigrants, newcomers and strangers, we strive to live the virtues of justice and love, so as to be the face of Christ in the world, becoming in Him a sign of unity and an instrument of God's peace.

The readings these last Sundays of the liturgical year (which ends Saturday after Thanksgiving), leading up to the Feast of Christ the King, are about “end things” . . . the end of our lives and the end of the world. For the Christian, neither are to be feared, for these days usher in our salvation and the salvation of the world.

For us, the “Day of the Lord” need not be feared, for it brings life and healing:

“But for you who fear my name, there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays” (Malachi 3:20a).

I repeat something that should be familiar to us: We will not be judged by the way we die, but according to how we have lived. God’s grace, God’s own life in us, continues to call us to live in humility, service and love. While this is not always easy and sometimes we fail in our attempts, God leads and guides us along the right path, offering us hope and healing.

During November, we pray in a special way for our beloved dead and for all who have gone before us. *The Book of the Names of the Dead* will remain in the sanctuary, in front of the Easter Candle, for all to write the names of those whom you would like to be included in the prayers of the parish this month.

Looking Ahead . . .

Friday is **Veteran’s Day**, a federal holiday. Mass that morning will be at 9:00.

Friday evening, our school hosts its annual **Multi-Cultural Dinner**. Details can be found on Page 7 of this Bulletin. All are welcome to what is always a wonderful evening that celebrates the diversity in our parish and our school.



On Thanksgiving Day, our parish Mass will be at 10:00 am. In addition to a collection for Saint Vincent de Paul Society’s work, we will be accepting non-perishable food items as part of our Procession of the Gifts during the Mass.

Daylight Saving Time ends on Sunday, November 6, 2022. On Saturday night, set back your clock one hour to “fall back.”

Second Collection for the Archdiocese for Military Services

Every three years, there is a national collection to benefit the work of the Archdiocese that offers pastoral care for members of all branches of the United States Military. This collection is next weekend. From the Archdiocese's website, we have this description of the work that this collection supports:

The AMS worldwide mission is to provide for the pastoral care of the 1.8 million Catholics serving in the United States Armed Forces, their family members, students at the Military Academies, patients in VA medical centers and US governmental personnel serving abroad. It is the only agency responsible for endorsing and granting faculties to Catholic chaplains and deacons in service to those populations.

Archbishop Timothy Broglio is the Archbishop of the Archdiocese and Bishop Richard Higgins, Bishop Richard Spencer, Bishop Neal Buckon, and Bishop Robert Coyle are the four Auxiliary Bishops. In support of the mission, they spend 65% of their time on pastoral visits to over 220 military locations in 29 countries and 153 VA Medical Centers throughout the United States.

Update on 2022 Annual Diocesan Appeal

Our parish's diocesan goal was \$85,674. Our combined goal was \$150,000. There were 278 pledges and gifts for a total of \$161,297. To date, \$154,538 has been paid, and the parish has received \$61,471.92 in rebates. Thank you!!

With two months to go before the end of the year, 38 pledges in the amount of \$6758 remain to be paid.

Parish/School Consultation Sessions

- Thank you to all who have held and submitted your parish or school consultation sessions summary worksheets.
- Nearly all 26 schools have completed their consultations sessions and only handful have yet to submit their summary worksheet.
- 37 of our parishes have completed their consultations sessions. 9 have scheduled their consultation session within the next two weeks. We are working with the remaining 7 parishes and missions to help them with their session.

Synod Survey – Consultation of the Faithful

- The diocesan synod survey opened today online and is available in English, Spanish and Vietnamese. It will remain open through Thanksgiving.

- Key Talking Points about the Survey:
 - Bishop wants to hear from all Catholics in Santa Clara County, including those no longer practicing their faith.
 - The purpose of the survey is to gain a greater understanding of the pastoral needs of the Catholic community in Santa Clara County and discern pastoral priorities for our diocese for the coming years.
 - The survey is available in English, Spanish or Vietnamese. It will take 10-15 minutes to complete the survey, and responses will be anonymous.
 - The input will be integrated into the information to be considered by the Diocesan Synod General Assembly, when recommending priorities for our diocese's new Pastoral Plan on how our diocese will serve God's People in the coming years.

General Assembly

- All delegates have received their invitation to the general assembly on January 27-29, 2023 at Santa Clara University and are confirming their participation.
- For those who have submitted updated delegates or replacements, we have sent invitations this week to the new delegates. We have 130 delegates confirmed to participate.
- Delegates will be attending a day of prayer and orientation on Saturday, November 5th.

El viernes es el *Día de los Veteranos*, un feriado federal. La misa de esa mañana será a las 9:00.



En apoyo a la misión, dedican el 65 % de su tiempo a visitas pastorales a más de 220 ubicaciones militares en 29 países y 153 Centros Médicos VA en todo Estados Unidos.

Mas hoje celebramos o trigéssimo-segundo Domingo do Tempo Comum do Ano Litúrgico do ciclo C e a partir deste Domingo olhamos para o fim da nossa existência: o fim do mundo.
