### Dear Parishioners,



### **Parish Catechetical Program**



Children's Faith Formation serves First to Seventh grades. All children gather at the beginning of our session and we begin with singing and prayer. This year we changed the books that we use to *Our Sunday Visitor* (OSV) publication. In addition to the books, OSV offers online resources for families. We are in the process of meeting with all families to familiarize them with our new resources and we encourage parent participation and engagement in their child's Faith Formation journey.

Already-baptized children prepare for First Reconciliation and First Eucharist in our two-year program, while we prepare those how have not been baptized for the Sacraments of Initiation. Our program works closely with our School in preparation, as well. In addition, we are following the Liturgical Calendar in our teaching and we request that children attend our 10:30 am Family Mass and participate in the Liturgy of the Word for Children. In the New Year, we will offer Liturgy of the Word for Children during the Spanish Mass at 12 noon.

At our first family meeting we honored our Mother, the *Virgen de Guadalupe* by bringing plants or flowers to our Rectory Garden and we have continued our devotion to her, especially on her day, December 12th. Together, we enjoy the journey and we experience the love and commitment necessary for Sacramental Preparation. ### **Youth Ministry**

Our Saint Clare Parish Youth Ministry has been blessed by the joy of our young people who serve others and their community while also seeking fellowship and formation in prayer.

During this last year, we were able to confirm over 40 young people after a year of formation. In addition, we held our first ever Confirmation Retreat in September. Some of our youth also attended the **Diocesan Youth Retreat** at Lake Tahoe during the summer. Our Youth Ministry has been blessed with other smaller events such as Movie Nights, Easter Egg Hunts, "Clarely Casual Conversations," and Open Gym Nights.

Our Youth Ministry grows as our young people become more integrated into parish life through liturgical ministry and even consulting in the parish and diocesan synodal process.

### **Liturgical Music**

Something that makes Saint Clare's music ministry special is that it's all about cultivating outstanding liturgical music leadership. Our ensemble has members ranging from 2nd grade to retirement age, and the only requirement to join is that you know how to read words. During rehearsals, we practice musicianship skills like reading music, developing our musical ears, and improvising. We work on vocal techniques you'd normally learn in a private voice lesson, and learn new songs, including several composed by our teenage ensemble members. We also work on cantor training and discuss how the songs relate to the Sunday scripture. Over time, we've been lucky to have people sing, and play guitar, clarinet, trumpet, violin, flute, bass, and percussion, and work with each person at their skill level. What musical instruments do you know how to play? Let's get you involved!

Since its founding in 2011 by Saint Clare parishioners, the Peace and Justice Committee has hosted annual Fair-Trade sales, Immigration Awareness Weekends, education efforts on Human Trafficking Awareness, Grateful Garment Drive, Stations of the Cross for global solidarity, peace prayer service, advocacy for the Catholic Climate Covenant and care for the earth. The committee has also mobilized Saint Clare support for the homeless through Village House Rotating Shelter program in the Bay Area. The committee has been on hiatus since the pandemic and is seeking to restart its work with the help of interested parishioners. ### Saint Clare's Portuguese Community



The Portuguese Community has been active at Saint Clare Parish since the 1800s. From early 1973 until now, we celebrate Mass in Portuguese and we participate in all phases in the parish life of Saint Clare. Hundreds of Portuguese have received all the sacraments (except the Order of Priesthood) and have graduated from Saint Clare School. We raised funds through our promotions of cooking meals: beef shish kabob, (Madeira style), goat stew, chicken barbecue, and bacalhau (salt black cod). These activities not only raise funds for our parish, but bind us as a community and unite us to our parish. Like everybody else, we

are thankful to survive these last pandemic years and resume our Christmas Celebration in our Parish Hall this year. We are a Community that is proud of our heritage and traditions which we are able to celebrate at Saint Clare, and consequently minimizes the missing our places of origin. ### **Saint Clare Hispanic Ministry**
