

Therefore, if you bring your gift to the altar, and there recall that your brother [or sister] has anything against you, leave your gift there at the altar, go first and be reconciled with your brother, and then come and offer your gift. Settle with your opponent quickly while on the way to court (Matthew 5:23-24).

Based upon this passage from the Sermon on the Mount, there was a consultation throughout the Church some years ago to consider moving the Sign of Peace from its current place, just before Communion, to a position prior to the Procession of Gifts at Mass. The proposal was not accepted, but it did serve to make us think: How many times do we bring “our gifts” to the altar without first being reconciled with others?

It is true that just before we receive Communion, we pray, “Lord, I am not worthy. . .” But this statement of unworthiness and the request, “Only say the word, and my soul shall be healed,” cannot be a substitute for making peace with others. The two go hand-in-hand. First, we make peace, attempt to right the wrongs of our lives, then, after that effort has been made, we look to the Lord to heal us, to nourish us. We “bring our gift” to the altar, not to gloss over some wrong that we have done, but as a sign of the peace which we have already sought.

Second Collection Next Weekend *Black and Indian Missions*


Catholics in the U.S. are familiar with all kinds of “second collections” taken up in their parish churches. But only one can claim status as the first ever!

Recognizing a need to call the faithful to support missionary work among African American and Native American Catholics, the U.S. Catholic bishops established this Catholic Church charity for the Catholic Missions in 1884 to administer a national collection—the first of its kind in the United States—to support missionary work.

Ever since the first Collection in 1884, the Commission has administered the yearly, national **Black and Indian Mission Collection**. The generosity of the good People of God allows the Commission to give helpful grants to dioceses across the country to operate schools, parishes, and other missionary services that build the Body of Christ in Native American, Alaska Native, and Black Catholic communities.

Ash Wednesday Schedule




All are invited to begin the season of Lent by participating at Mass on Ash Wednesday.

Weekly Justice Challenge



The Gospel for Sunday is part of the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus is focusing on keeping the commandments. He emphasizes that the Fifth Commandment, “Thou shalt not kill,” means more than not taking someone’s life. It also means not being angry or destroying someone’s self-esteem by calling them names. Your challenge this week is to look at your life and examine where you might have hurt someone—physically, emotionally through negative gossip, cyber criticism, or derogatory words, or even spiritually by giving bad example. Make a commitment to changing that hurtful behavior, say a prayer for the person you have hurt, and try to have the courage to ask forgiveness in person.

We are now beginning to reap what we have sown regarding environmental degradation. In our insatiable appetite for paper, plastic, gasoline, red meat, fish, food flown in from around the world, precious minerals, and irrigated green lawns, our society has been choosing diminishment and death for the natural world. God isn’t cursing us with droughts, floods, melting glaciers, and global warming; they are the outcome of choices we have collectively made for decades now. Por tanto, si traes tu ofrenda al altar, y allí te acuerdas de que tu hermano [o hermana] tiene algo contra ti, deja allí tu ofrenda en el altar, ve primero y reconcílate con tu hermano, y luego ven y presenta tu ofrenda. Llega a un acuerdo con tu oponente rápidamente mientras te diriges a la corte (Mateo 5:23-24).

Con base en este pasaje del Sermón de la Montaña, hubo una consulta en toda la Iglesia hace algunos años para considerar mover el Signo de la Paz de su lugar actual, justo antes de la Comunión, a un puesto previo a la Procesión de las Ofrendas en la Misa. La propuesta no fue aceptada, pero sirvió para hacernos pensar: ¿Cuántas veces llevamos “nuestras ofrendas” al altar sin antes reconciliarnos con los demás?

Es cierto que justo antes de recibir la Comunión, rezamos: “Señor, no soy digno. . .” Pero esta declaración de indignidad y la petición: “Di solamente la palabra, y mi alma será sanada”, no puede ser un sustituto de hacer las paces con los demás. Los dos van de la mano. Primero, hacemos las paces, tratamos de corregir los errores de nuestras vidas, luego, después de que se ha hecho ese esfuerzo, buscamos al Señor para que nos sane, nos nutra. Nosotros “traemos nuestro regalo” al altar, no para encubrir algún mal que hayamos hecho, sino como señal de la paz que ya hemos buscado.

Informe de la Campaña Anual Diocesana #1



Segunda Colecta Próximo Fin de Semana *Misiones negras e indias*



Reconociendo la necesidad de llamar a los fieles a apoyar el trabajo misionero entre los afroamericanos y los nativos americanos Católicos, los obispos católicos de EE. UU. establecieron esta organización benéfica de la Iglesia Católica para las Misiones Católicas en 1884 para administrar una colecta nacional, la primera de su tipo en los Estados Unidos, para apoyar el trabajo misionero.

Desde la primera Colecta en 1884, la Comisión administró la Colecta Nacional Anual de Misiones Negras e Indias. La generosidad del buen Pueblo de Dios permite que la Comisión otorgue subvenciones útiles a las diócesis de todo el país para operar escuelas, parroquias y otros servicios misioneros. servicios que construyen el Cuerpo de Cristo en las comunidades nativas americanas, nativas de Alaska y católicas negras.

Que o teu sim seja sim. Que o teu não seja não!

PARISH COMMUNITY O evangelho deste domingo, VI do tempo comum, parece bastante radical, com uma série de exemplos aparentemente fundamentalistas. No entanto, nem o evangelho é radical nem Jesus é fundamentalista. O que o evangelho deste domingo nos recorda são os fundamentos da nossa vida cristã se a queremos viver com unidade, coerência e verdade. Na primeira parte do evangelho, Jesus recorda a importância de correspondermos à lei e não a lermos de acordo com as nossas conveniências. Jesus dá-nos exemplos muito fortes sobre a importância de levar a lei a sério. Chega a dar o exemplo de cortamos os membros do corpo humano caso estes não estejam ao serviço do maior bem. Jesus dá tanta importância à paz interior e ao perdão que chega a dizer que as nossas ofertas têm valor salvífico se forem acompanhados pelo amor, perdão e paz. Portanto, não podemos subestimar a lei e pensar que depende do modo como cada um a lê. A Igreja tem a autoridade de interpretar a lei e no-la dar a conhecer. Cada um de nós tem o dever de observar a lei com amor à Igreja, a Deus e a todos os homens e mulheres. Mas Jesus não se fica pela vivência da letra da lei. A lei não é para viver à letra mas segundo o Espírito. A lei não tem valor em si mesma mas é um caminho para viver o amor a Deus segundo o espírito da lei. Só a oração nos pode mergulhar no espírito da lei. Só o Espírito Santo nos pode guiar no que a lei tem de belo como forma de nos conduzir a Deus. Só a comunhão e a obediência em Igreja e na Igreja nos pode ajudar a saborear a lei segundo o espírito com que foi escrita a fim de que a saibamos viver guiados pelo mesmo espírito. Jesus não permite que tiremos letra à lei. No entanto, se lhe tiramos o espírito, ficamos sem lei, porque a lei sem o Espírito Santo é letra morta e Jesus prometeu o Espírito Santo à sua Igreja até aos fins dos tempos. Que os mandamentos que Jesus nos recorda, vividos em Igreja, nos alimentem, nos inspirem e nos orientem.
