Our Holy Week celebrations begin with the ecstasy of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, as the people shouted "Hosanna" to Him. Soon come the calls for crucifixion, His agony – in the garden, along the path to Golgotha, and on the Cross.

But there is much more that we commemorate these days. There is the tenderness of the Last Supper, in which Jesus gave His Body and Blood to The Twelve and finally, on the third day, His appearances to Mary Magdalene, to Peter and John and the other disciples, in Jerusalem and on the road to Emmaus.

These events happened once in history, and they are not repeated as they are retold again and again. *It is we who make ourselves present to these saving events*, which makes this week a holy time for us.

The liturgies of the Easter Triduum (Holy Thursday evening, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday night) form one multi-day celebration. Please join us for as many of them as you can. You can find the schedule below.

May we and our entire parish family open our lives to these mysteries so that we may share the life the Lord opens to us.

This Week's Mass Schedule

There will be an 8:00 am Mass on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday this week. The only Mass on Thursday will be the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7:30 pm.

On Good Friday, there will be no morning Masses on Good Friday and Holy Saturday and no confessions are scheduled on Holy Saturday.

The Easter Vigil will begin with the Blessing of the New Fire in the parking lot adjacent to the Parish Hall. Please join us there for the beginning of this most solemn celebration.

Flowers for Holy Thursday and Easter

Once more, we welcome your gifts of Easter Lilies and other potted plants (lilies, azaleas, etc.) to beautify the Altar of Repose on Holy Thursday evening and the church for the Easter Season. Your gifts will be gratefully received. Thank you.

Parish Office Closed for Easter Weekend

There will be no office staff at the Parish Office on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Monday. The office will re-open on Tuesday, April 11. Mass on Easter Monday will be at 9:00 am.

Weekly Justice Challenge

Justice Challenge: The First Reading for Palm Sunday is from Isaiah (50:4-7) and contains one of several powerful images of the Suffering Servant found in this book of the Bible. While the author was describing the nation of Israel when he wrote, the passages about the suffering servant took on new meaning after the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus. It is easy to see how Jesus embodied the traits of Isaiah's suffering servant, one of which was his peaceful approach to conflict. Jesus exemplified non-violence, even when he was attacked, spat upon, mocked, and scourged. He met violence by turning the other cheek. And he asks us to do the same. Your challenge this week is to examine your conscience for any signs of violence in your life—in your actions, but also in your words. Make a commitment to responding to violence against your person, be it bullying or being yelled at or being physically attacked, with a strong but peaceful response.

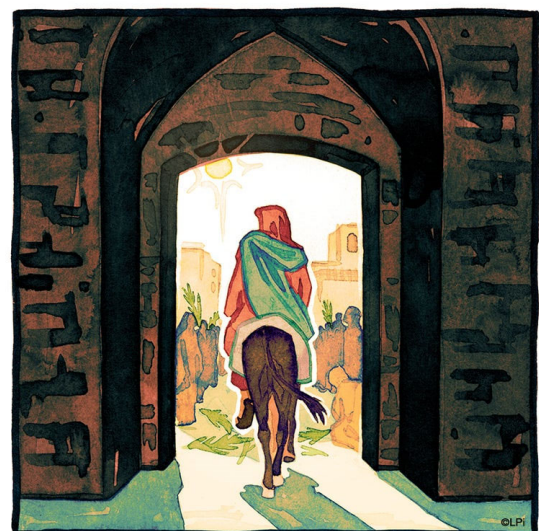

Reflexão pelo Padre Francisco Rodrigues S.J.

Este era verdadeiramente o Filho de Deus!

PARISH COMMUNITY A narração do evangelho deste domingo, recorda-nos um dos maiores dramas da história cuja vítima foi um inocente! Qualquer julgamento que ocorra, quer no tribunal, quer na praça pública que afete a vida de um inocente é sempre um ato de grande injustiça. No caso da narração de hoje é o próprio Deus, na pessoa de Jesus que é acusado de todo o mal, sendo que Jesus passou pelo mundo fazendo o bem. O mais dramático não foi só o facto de Jesus ter sido apontado e rejeitado pelos seus inimigos declarados. O ciúme, a inveja e o desejo de poder sobre os outros, gerou muitos inimigos à volta de Jesus. A inveja corrompe as relações humanas e inventa acusações. A inveja faz vítimas inocentes e os invejosos nunca assumem esta doença como sua. Como se não bastasse a inimizade de quem nunca aceitou Jesus nas suas vidas, os discípulos, amigos de Jesus, andam todos baralhados. Num momento destes, os discípulos não estiveram à altura. Agora que Jesus mais precisa deles, eles estão dispersos, desorientados, confundidos. Um vende Jesus por um conjunto de moedas. Outro nega conhecer Jesus. Os restantes estavam a dormir enquanto Jesus está a orar. Os inimigos de Jesus estão despertos e a maquiagem o modo de o prenderem. Muitas vezes, os inimigos não dormem. É pena que nós caiamos no sono principalmente quando deveríamos estar mais despertos. Por fim, a multidão que Jesus abençoou, curou, alimentou, acarinhou... entrega Jesus. Pior: a multidão trocou Jesus por Barrabás, isto é, por um assassino. Infelizmente, esta é muitas vezes a nossa vida: trocamos Jesus por uma banalidade qualquer. Como é que Jesus olha os discípulos e a multidão? Sem gramar, sem condenar, sem querer mal, sem vingança, sem azedume. "Pai perdoa-lhes...". Que grande Mestre e Doutor de bondade que Jesus é! Algumas mulheres e João evangelista, são as únicas pessoas que fazem boa figura, entre elas a mãe de Jesus, senhora das dores. Acompanham Jesus, choram, rezam, sofrem, amparam. Estas pessoas são extraordinárias. Neste dia, faça um convite ao silêncio, meditação e exame de consciência: neste cenário onde é que eu me encontro? Qual tem sido o meu papel e relação com a pessoa de Jesus? Esta é a Via-Sacra da história de que faço parte. Sentar-me num cantinho, olhar para Jesus e ver a multidão. E eu, Senhor? Como te olho? Como me deixo olhar por ti? Tu és verdadeiramente o Filho de Deus!
