Chapter 15 of the Gospel of Luke is one of my favorites in all the Bible. It could be called “The Lost Chapter,” for it deals with the lost sheep, the lost coin and the lost boy (otherwise known as the parable of the Prodigal Son or of the Merciful Father).

The gospel passage this weekend is about the lost sheep and the lost coin. Jesus makes the point of His teaching very clear:

I tell you, in just the same way there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance (verse 7).

The dynamic of forgiveness and repentance is one of the primary lessons that we learn from the Lord. It teaches us how to be toward one another and it also instructs us on the way God reaches out to each of us.

One of the seemingly lost practices of the Church is sacramental confession of sins and reception of absolution. While some few approach the sacrament each week, the sense of sin and/or the appreciation of God’s forgiveness and our reconciliation with the Church is something else that seems lost in the twenty-first century.

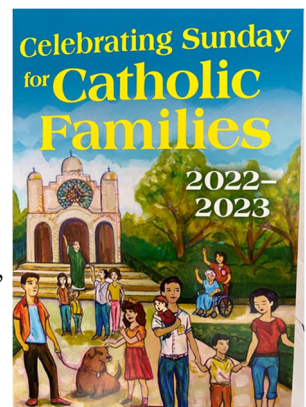
If we approached the sacrament with an understanding of the “joy in heaven” that the finding of the lost causes and if we realize that Penance/Confession/Reconciliation are offered as encouragement and not condemnation, we might rediscover its immense value in our lives.

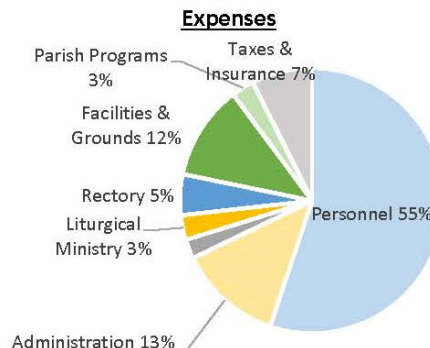
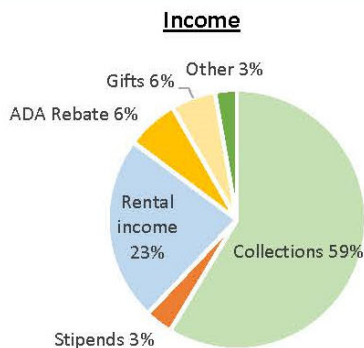

De Monseñor Fran Cilia

El capítulo 15 del Evangelio de Lucas es uno de mis favoritos de toda la Biblia. Podría llamarse “El Capítulo Perdido”, pues trata de la oveja perdida, la moneda perdida y el niño perdido (también conocida como la parábola del Hijo Pródigo o del Padre Misericordioso).

El pasaje del evangelio de este fin de semana trata sobre la oveja perdida y la moneda perdida. Jesús deja muy claro el punto de Su enseñanza:

Os digo que así habrá más alegría en el cielo por un pecador que se arrepiente que por noventa y nueve justos que no tienen necesidad de arrepentimiento (versículo 7).

La dinámica del perdón y el arrepentimiento es una de las principales lecciones que aprendemos del Señor. Nos enseña cómo ser unos con otros y también nos instruye sobre la forma en que Dios se acerca a cada uno de nosotros.

Una de las prácticas aparentemente perdidas de la Iglesia es la confesión sacramental de los pecados y recepción de la absolución. Mientras unos pocos se acercan al sacramento cada semana, el sentido del pecado y/o el aprecio por el perdón de Dios y nuestra reconciliación con la Iglesia es otra cosa que parece perdida en el siglo veintiuno.

Si nos acercamos al sacramento con una comprensión del "gozo en el cielo" que el hallazgo de las causas perdidas y si nos damos cuenta de que la Penitencia/Confesión/Reconciliación se ofrecen como aliento y no como condena, podemos redescubrir su inmenso valor en nuestras vidas.

El Domingo de Catequético es el próximo domingo

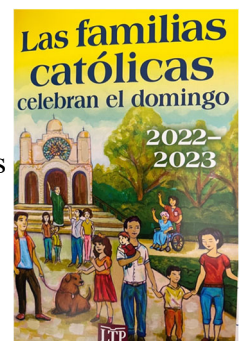

Reflexão por: João Pereira Arruda

A insensatez do mundo não pode ver mais nada além do que é prazer, riqueza e poder. Quando assim, o mundo que vivemos, está despido de “pastores” que salvam “ovelhas” tresmalhadas. Na parábola da ovelha perdida continua fortemente a nos ilustrar o relacionamento de Deus conosco. Todos nós somos como a ovelha perdida. A parábola diz que; o pastor deixou as outras noventa e nove ovelhas e foi á procura da ovelha que se perdeu. Que sorte teria as outras noventa e nove ovelhas que ficaram sem pastor ? (Sabe-se lá por quanto tempo levou o pastor a encontrar a ovelha que se perdeu.) Nesse caso as outras ovelhas ficaram sem a proteção e vigilância do pastor. Partindo dum ponto de que Deus nunca nos abandona, ao abandonar as ovelhas estava a contradizer-Se e este não é o caso desta parábola mas o de dar uma ideia do quando Deus nos quer que vai a grandes extremos para recuperar e não perder nenhum de nós. O comportamento da ovelha perdida passou pelo facto de não querer estar com as demais, de querer estar independente, de agarrar outras oportunidades e se pavonear depois perante as que ficaram. Tal e qual como a atitude de muitos imigrantes que deixaram a terra de origem e depois de algum tempo voltam á terra para historiar os sucessos e as riquezas feitas lá fora. A ovelha perdida foi atrás de outras ervas ou plantas sem passar que se estava a expo “a mercê dos lobos ou de ser capturada por um mau pastor. A parábola seria correcta se cada um de nós meditasse e se perguntasse: Que lugar tenho no rebanho que faço parte? A lógica de Deus não é a nossa e é um desafio ao nosso curto entendimento. Cristo não veio para confirmar na fé uns quantos justos, mas para se encontrar com os que andam mais apartados de Deus. Vivamos com largura de coração, num amor que se expande e nos leva a abandonar o conforto do conhecido, rumo ao lugar donde nos chama, procurando os nossos irmãos. Com sorte, descobriremos que o tranviado éramos nós e que o Senhor, nos traz aos seus ombros, de volta á companhia dos nossos irmãos, que julgávamos longe quando éramos nós que estávamos perdidos. Por quantas mais ofertas o mundo nos faz para nos perdermos , maiores tentativas faz Deus para nos encontrar e nos trazer aos ombros para Si. O rebanho é a comunidade! Na comunidade cada membro tem a oportunidade de criar raizes de valores comuns de unidade e de se entregarem em amarem-se fraternalmente na paz e harmonia. Quando assim dificilmente haverá “ovelhas” perdidas.

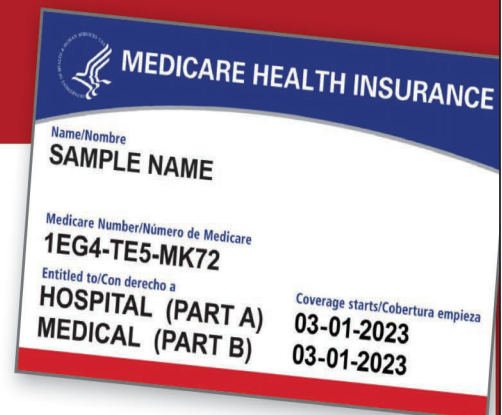
