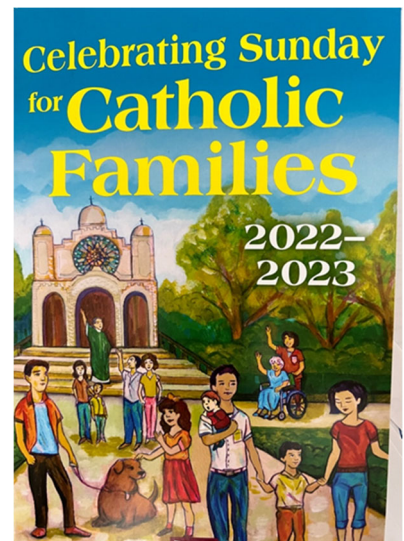
From Monsignor Fran Cilia

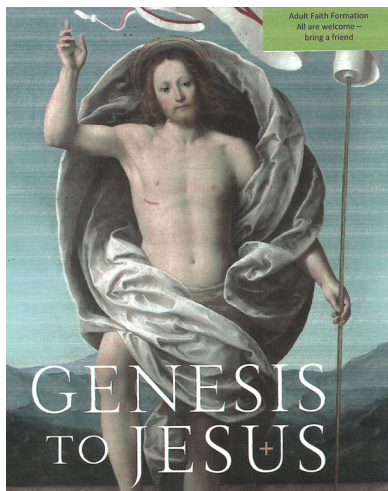

Creation Care Tips

Back-to-school is a great time to consider the ideal method of transportation: walking, biking, scooting, or carpooling. The simple question is: are there people going in the same direction? You could organize an informal “walking school bus” among neighbors or publicize it at your child’s school, with an agreement to take turns leading a group of younger children from a designated meeting point at the same time each day. If you’re traveling further, you could publicize your wish to form a carpool and share the cost of gas. Everyone wins by saving money, plus fewer cars on the road, less pollution, and less consumption of fossil fuels.

Weekly Justice Challenge

This Sunday’s Gospel (Luke 14:25-33) challenges us to take up our cross and follow Jesus. In this same passage, we are called to renounce our possessions. That may seem a bit harsh—and really hard to do. But if we put the two messages together, we understand that taking up our cross does require sacrifice. We can live up to this challenge by becoming less attached to things and more attached to people. Just as Jesus gave up everything—prestige, power, life itself—to redeem us, we are called to make sacrifices and give up things to help those in need. We do this because, as our U.S. Bishops wrote, we Catholics believe that people are more important than things. Your challenge this week is to choose one possession you have which takes up a lot of your time. It may be an electronic gadget, your television or your phone. Take the time you would have spent playing one game, listening to music, or watching a program, and spend the time instead being present to someone who needs companionship, listening to someone who never gets heard, or helping someone in need.

WCEA UPDATE

Saint Clare faculty and staff continue their work as they take a close look at the lived reality of all aspects of our school and school community. The accreditation process asks us to dig deeply into our relationships with parents, the parish, and, of course, our students.

The Saint Clare team has met on a number of occasions to update our school's Mission Statement and Schoolwide Learning Expectations (SLE). The goal of the SLEs is to articulate what we should see in each student who graduates from St. Clare School. To that end, teachers are currently meeting to develop rubrics that "show us" that younger students are on the path and growing every year, while our 8th graders are meeting those expectations upon graduation.

In addition, faculty and staff teams have begun the process of drafting the Self Study. This document identifies areas of strength with respect to Saint Clare's Catholic Identity, operations, and student learning. It will also identify those areas for growth. Based on the Self Study, an Action Plan will be developed that addresses those areas in which emphasis should be placed going forward.

While a lot of work, it is a welcome process that will give Saint Clare School a clear path ahead..

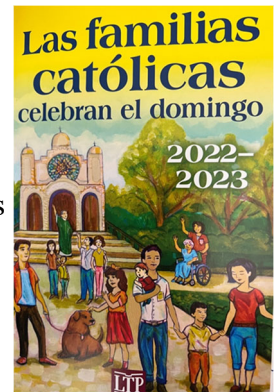
De Monseñor Fran Cilia

Domingo XXII do Tempo Comum

Reflexão por: João Pereira Arruda

Neste Domingo e através do Evangelho, Jesus Cristo adverte-nos para ponderar-mos com cuidado antes de fazer a decisão de O seguir. Cristo adverte-nos para que não façamos uma decisão cujo o objectivo desta é servir os nossos próprios interesses e não o objectivo de que é seguir a Cristo e servir o interesse comum de todos os irmãos. Cristo pede-nos que façamos uma ponderação prévia ao assumir o compromisso com o seu estilo de vida. Perguntemo-nos honesta e livremente: estou consciente das consequências? Quero mesmo seguir Cristo, vivendo ao seu estilo? Terei forças para tal? O nosso objectivo é caminhar pelo mesmo caminho que Cristo caminhou quando esteve entre nós como Homem-Deus. Nas inúmeras decisões que todos os dias fazemos qual a consideração e atenção pomos nessas decisões entre o escolher o bem e o mal. Em qualquer uma das decisões que fazemos deveremos pôr a questão: seria assim que Jesus faria? Na base das nossas decisões; sejam elas de índole: material ou espiritual, de ordem familiar ou comunitária, ou económica ou política, etc. todas elas tem que haver por base isso: Seria assim que Jesus faria? Quem com esta minha decisão será prejudicado? Na liturgia deste Domingo aparecem as palavras de justo e humilde. São qualidades de carácter que Deus enaltece e encoraja que seus filhos se esforçam em cultivar essas virtudes. A Primeira Leitura é iniciada com esta frase: *“Filho, em todas as tuas obras, procede com humildade e serás mais estimado do que o homem generoso”*. Não quer dizer que Deus subestima a generosidade em detrimento da humildade, porém realça a humildade como pedra baselar na construção de carácter. O mesmo acontece com as pessoas que fazem esforços toda a sua vida em serem justos. Onde não há justiça, não há paz. Do justo parte qualidades de promover equidade entre os irmãos. Os justos não se fecham em si mas procuram promover ambientes e situações pelo qual todos á sua voltam beneficiam. S. Paulo no fim da Segunda Leitura nos diz que: *“Somos primogénitos inscritos no Céu, de Deus, o juiz do universo, dos espíritos dos justos que atingiram a perfeição e de Jesus, mediador da nova aliança*. Mais ainda o refrão ao Evangelho nos diz: *“Tomai o meu jugo sobre vós, diz o Senhor, e aprendei de Mim, que sou manso e humilde de coração”*. Como vêm é o próprio Deus que nos transmite hoje quanto o valor de ser humilde e justo, qualidades essas que se convertem nas pessoas terem tal como Deus corações mansos e humildes. A humildade não está na moda nem tampouco na promoção de valores que o mundo divulga nos nossos dias. Por toda a parte do mundo os povos queixam-se com a falta de justiça e equidade; e o resultado é que das injustiças vêm as guerras, actos de violência, ondas de crime, corrupção, etc. Está em cada um de nós escolher Deus como única opção de vida, porque é n’Ele que encontramos um coração manso e humilde que nos ama misericordiosamente.

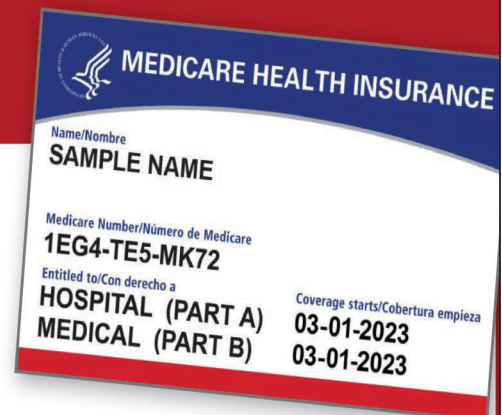
