In the tenth chapter of the Gospel of John, Jesus describes Himself as the Good (or “ideal”) Shepherd and the “Gate” for the sheep, the One who will lay down His life for the sake of the flock. This biblical image of shepherds and sheep reminds us of King David, who himself was shepherding his father’s flock when he was anointed to be King over all of Israel. Jesus, proclaimed as “Son of David,” is Shepherd-King, the Servant of all.

We who follow Him are asked to be the same: authority is for loving service, whether in our homes and families, in our parish and beyond.

In the Diocese of San José, “Good Shepherd Sunday.” (the Fourth Sunday of Easter) is the weekend on which an annual collection is taken to benefit the Retirement Fund for our Diocesan Priests.

This Sunday was chosen in the hope that parishioners throughout the Diocese might relate the priests who served them for decades in the past to Jesus, the Good Shepherd.

There is a lengthy announcement about this collection here in the bulletin. I would ask you to review it when considering if you can make a gift to support the retired and soon-retired priests of our Diocese.

First Communion Celebrations

We will have the joy of celebrating the reception of First Holy Communion by young members of our parish and school this Sunday at 10:30 Mass, and next Sunday at the 10:30 and 12:00 Masses. Weekly Justice Challenge

Justice Challenge: Sunday's Gospel has Jesus saying, "I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture." (John 10:9) We are called to salvation through Jesus. If he is the gate, then we need to live as he did, to follow his teaching, to be his disciples in the world. Jesus always stood for the poorest and most vulnerable people in the world. And he told us we would be judged by how we treated the least of our brothers and sisters. Your challenge this week is to find a brother or sister who is ignored by others but in real need of help. Reach out and practice the works of mercy. If they need food, clothing, or shelter, help them find it. If they need someone to listen to their story, lend an ear. Be the face of Christ for them.

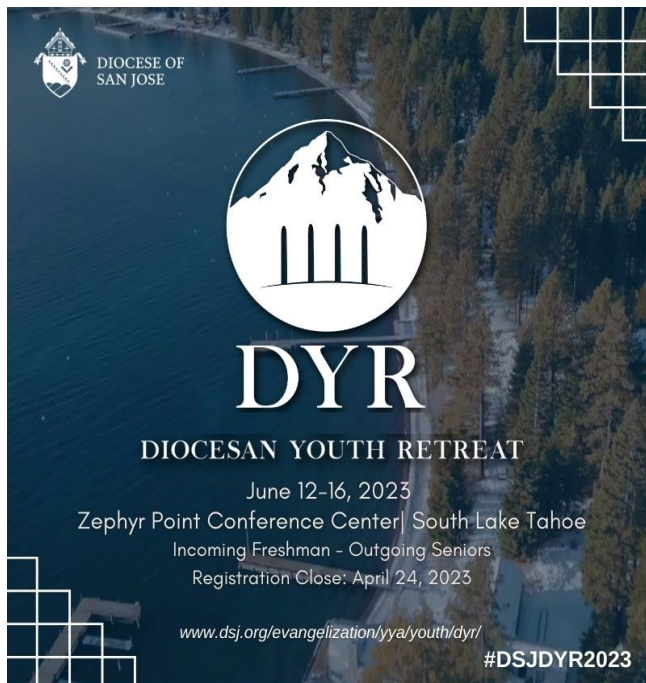

O evangelho deste domingo recorda-nos a passagem do Bom Pastor. Antes de mais, devemos estar muito cientes do seguinte: Jesus, só Jesus é o Bom Pastor. Jesus é de uma total e exigente bondade comprovada. Ser bom Pastor não significa fazer as vontadinhas todas a quem quer que seja. Antes, significa dizer as verdadinhas completas a todos. O bom Pastor, Jesus, conhece as suas ovelhas, dá a vida por elas. Jesus adverte-nos que podemos ser invadidos por mercenários, vestidos de pastores mas tantas vezes com intenção de devoração. Ainda hoje o mundo está cheio de falsos pastores que procuram seduzir através de publicidades enganosas. Diz Jesus: não te deixes enganar. O Bom Pastor conhece as ovelhas e dá a vida por elas.
