## **From Monsignor Fran Cilia**

Jesus said to the Pharisees: "There was a rich man who dressed in purple garments and fine linen and dined sumptuously each day. . ."

Jesus did not fault the rich man (also known as "Dives," meaning "a rich man") for being rich, but because of his complete disregard for Lazarus (meaning "God helps") who was daily lying at Dives' door, not even given the scraps from the table. Jesus' teaching echoes the words of God found in the book of the prophet Amos:

"Woe to the complacent in Zion!

Lying upon beds of ivory. . .

Therefore, now they shall be the first  
to go into exile."

If we want to be counted as one of the Lord's blessed, we need only be faithful to the words of Psalm 146:

Blessed is the person who keeps faith forever,  
secures justice for the oppressed,  
gives food to the hungry.

The readings at Mass this Sunday challenge us, in the words of an often-quoted phrase: "To comfort the afflicted and to afflict the comfortable." True religion continues to comfort us and to afflict us, as we need as we grow along the path toward the coming of God's reign in our lives and, hopefully, in the world.

And we invite you to come and support our candidates and their families at this special moment in their lives.



## ADA Report

---

It has been a while since our last update on this year's Annual Diocesan Appeal. To date, we have received **278 pledges and gifts of \$161,297**, well over our parish goal of \$150,000. Thank you, all so very much. Of these, 41 are still making payments, with a remaining balance of \$11,659.57. The parish has already received our first rebate of \$37,025.37. Currently, we are due an additional rebate of almost \$27,000, but this could grow to more than \$38,000 (for a total rebate of \$75,623), as pledges are paid off. Obviously, this will help us begin to recover from the major expenses (church roof, church tenting for termites and church sewer line) that we had to deal with this year. The great news is that during last week's rains there were no leaks in the church!

Again, many thanks to all who participated in the Appeal and for your constant support of our parish.

## VOTE “NO” ON PROPOSITION 1

---

Proposition 1 is a worst-case scenario for abortion in California. It is an expensive and misleading ballot measure that allows unlimited late-term abortions — for any reason, at any time, paid for by tax dollars.

Prop 1 is not needed. California already has some of the most permissive abortion laws in the nation that would remain in effect without the amendment, including our current limit on late-term abortions that are permitted only for the life and health of the mother. Prop 1 destroys this common-sense limit.

California does not limit state spending on abortion, and with thousands more traveling from other states, the cost will be in the hundreds of millions. ### Weekly Justice Challenge

---

Sunday's Gospel tells the story of the rich man and Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31). Ironically, we don't see the rich man doing anything bad—he didn't hit Lazarus or make him leave or even yell at him. So why did he end up in eternal damnation? It was because he didn't even notice his suffering brother. The rich man was totally oblivious to the needs of Lazarus. Your challenge this week is to increase your awareness. Look at your community, your country, and even your world with new eyes. Who are the invisible poor who need your help? Discuss every evening who you have noticed for the first time. Then, at the end of the week, as a family or an individual choose one action you can do to help a person or a group whom you identified. The help could be a financial donation, direct service, or a form of advocacy on their behalf (e.g., emailing your state legislators to change laws to provide more aid to the homeless or single parent families or the mentally ill).

## **Informe del ADA**

Ha pasado un tiempo desde nuestra última actualización sobre la Campaña Anual Diocesana de este año. Hasta la fecha, hemos recibido 278 promesas y obsequios de \$161,297, muy por encima de nuestra meta parroquial de \$150,000. Muchas gracias a todos. ## **VOTE “NO” A LA PROPOSICIÓN 1**

---

La Proposición 1 es el peor de los casos para el aborto en California. Es una medida electoral costosa y engañosa que permite abortos tardíos sin límites – por cualquier motivo, en cualquier momento, – a expensas de los contribuyentes. La Proposición 1 no es necesaria. Lamentablemente, California ya cuenta con políticas de aborto entre las más permisivas del país que seguirían en efecto sin la enmienda, incluso con sus límites importantes para el aborto tardío, que se permite por la vida y la salud de la madre. La Proposición 1 derriba estos límites de sentido común. California no limita el gasto estatal en aborto, y con miles viajando desde otros estados para procurar un aborto tardío, el costo será de cientos de millones. No entregue a los legisladores un cheque en blanco para pagar los abortos y no permita que hagan de California un "santuario del aborto". ## **Boletim Paroquial Português**

Domingo XXVI do Tempo Comum

*Reflexão por: João Pereira Arruda*

---

Do Evangelho deste Domingo se nos apresenta duas opções de vida: Tal como o homem rico foi indiferente ao estado do pobre Lázaro, podemos também viver desta escolha quando fechamos os olhos aos marginalizados da sociedade; aos sem abrigo e carentes do essencial para viver. Ou escolhemos ser justos, partindo da base, de usarmos de ações que favorecem a justiça e equidade, na família, na paróquia, na comunidade, na sociedade que vivo. Seja em que lugar viva que eu possa ser participante de ações que promovem a justiça e equidade, bases da paz e da concórdia entre os povos. Vejamos que do Evangelho podemos concluir que há destinos diferentes para os justos e para os indiferentes. Por mais que queiramos acreditar que pelo amor infinito de Deus estamos salvos, porém nesta passagem do Evangelho de hoje é muito transparente a mensagem de Deus quando diz que os justos terão lugar no Céu com Abraão e que entre os justos e indiferentes haverá um abismo enorme e impossível de aproximação. Ainda mais; em tom de aviso; que depois da morte não haverá comunicação com os que neste mundo ficaram, Se no tempo antes de Jesus as pessoas não queriam escutar as mensagens de Deus anunciados pelos profetas; nos nossos dias, as pessoas também não dão ouvidos aos homens de Deus! As mensagens dos meios de comunicação social; os televangelistas e vendedores de religião, não servem os interesses das populações com os interesses de Deus; Sabemos que o Deus de que falamos quer para nós ainda vivendo neste mundo: paz, justiça, equidade, unidade, amor fraterno, harmonia, que haja entre as pessoas o objectivo denominador que é o amor! De onde o amor não existe, também aí não está Deus.

Inserida na liturgia deste Domingo celebramos o Domingo do Sacerdote. Como Comunidade Paroquial Portuguesa também devemos ter em conta os sacerdotes que presidem ás missa em português, tais como os padres: Prosper Molengi, Pedro Sencion Perez, Paolo Gobbo e Leonardo Rocha e até esporadicamente padre Marco Valadão e Francisco Rodrigues que sempre que podem sair das suas obrigações partilham as suas vocações sacerdotais com a nossa comunidade. . 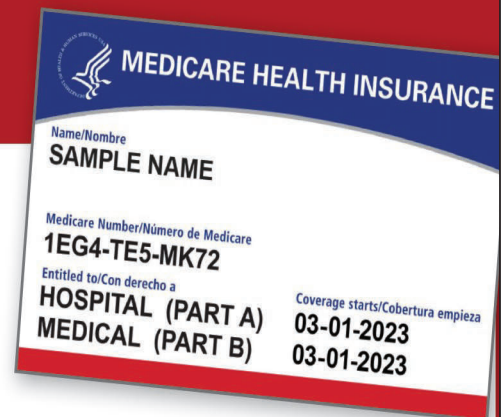
