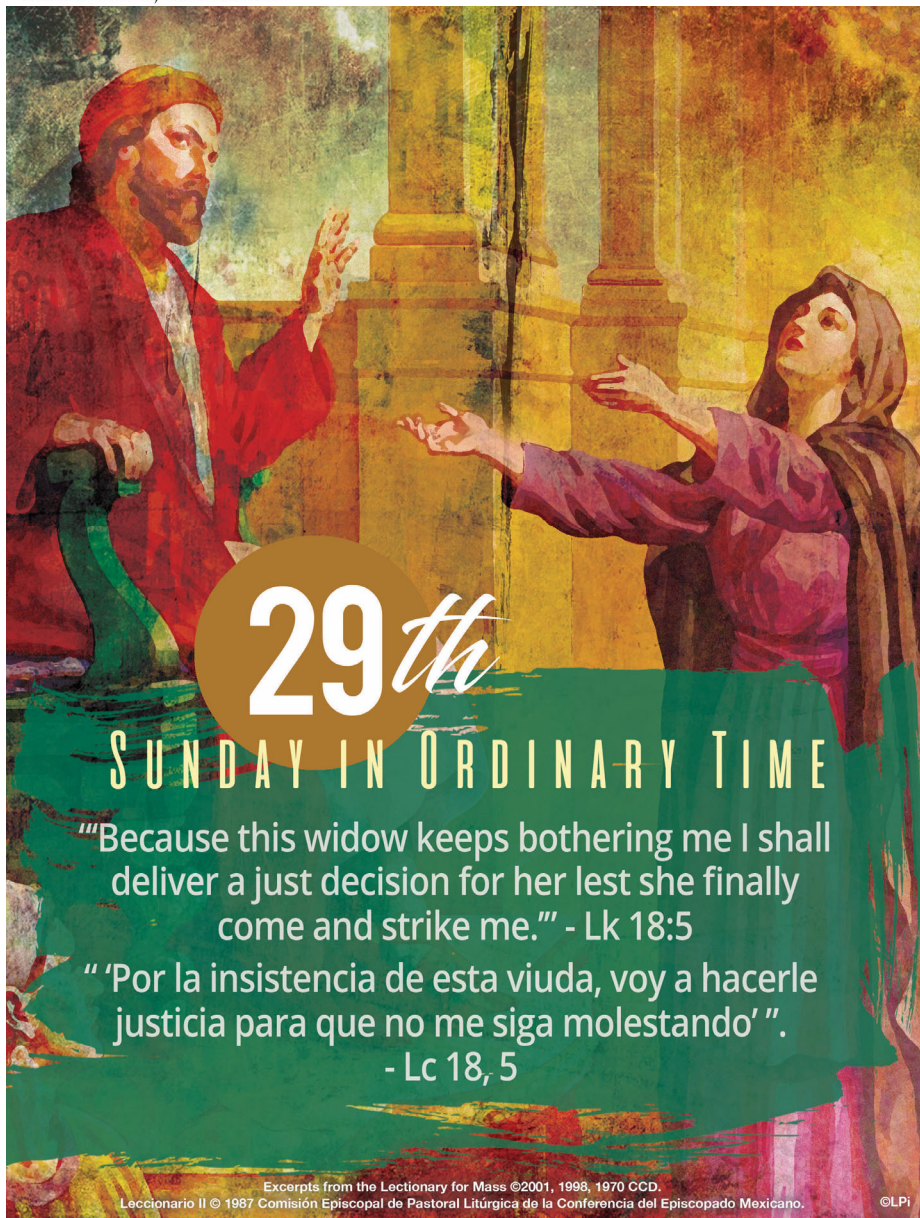

Moses surely appreciated the sentiment expressed in the Beatles' lyrics, "I get by with a little help from my friends." For the Israelites, it was Moses' persistence and the support of others that won the battle for them

In the gospel reading, a seemingly helpless widow confronts an unjust judge with a persistence that finally wore him down. Under pressure, the judge commits to rendering a just decision. Jesus uses the parable as an assurance that God will act swiftly and justly on behalf of those who call upon the Lord, especially those who face injustice.

In the Church, we are committed to a "preferential option for the poor," which is defined as "**Caring for those who are less well off is everyone's responsibility.** Preferential care should be shown to vulnerable and marginalized people, whose needs and rights are given special attention in God's eyes" (Caritas Australia).

Rather than being an afterthought, the marginalized should be a primary focus of our ministry and outreach. Everything we do should have an essential component of care for those on the fringes of society. . . of our families.

VOTE "NO" ON PROPOSITION 1

Proposition 1 is a worst-case scenario for abortion in California. It is an expensive and misleading ballot measure that allows unlimited late-term abortions — for any reason, at any time, paid for by tax dollars.

Prop 1 is not needed. California already has some of the most permissive abortion laws in the nation that would remain in effect without the amendment, including our current limit on late-term abortions that are permitted only for the life and health of the mother. Prop 1 destroys this common-sense limit.

California does not limit state spending on abortion, and with thousands more traveling from other states, the cost will be in the hundreds of millions. Weekly Justice Challenge



On October 18, we celebrate the feast of Saint Luke, one of the four evangelists. The Gospel of Luke is sometimes nicknamed the “Justice Gospel” because Luke has so many stories of Jesus reaching out to those who were victims of injustice in their society. Perhaps this was partially due to Luke’s own experience as a healer. Luke wrote his Gospel to help us understand that Jesus was and is a universal savior—for everyone, everywhere. Your challenge this week is to spend time each day with Luke’s Gospel. Find a chapter (or at least a story or teaching in a chapter) which deals with justice, then reflect on and discuss as a family how you can apply the message which the passage teaches in your life today.

Humanitarian Assistance to Refugees in Diocese of El Paso

“For I was a stranger, you welcomed me”. The Diocese of El Paso is helping with humanitarian assistance to refugees arriving on the U.S. border. Immigrants/ Refugees processed by ICE or Border Patrol are released and need assistance in getting to their final U.S. destination where they will appear at an immigration court hearing. The Diocese of El Paso has organized immigrant hospitality centers to offer hot meals, shelter, clothes, prayer, and connections to family members to make travel arrangements. They need volunteers who can travel to El Paso for one week and serve our immigrant brothers and sisters in their time of need. The process is fairly simple in that you can help with welcoming our guests, making meals, helping with intake, making phone calls to family for giving rides to the airport or bus station. Creation Care Tips

With the fall fruit harvests upon us, consider that 30-40% of the food produced in the United States is wasted. Fruit from trees often goes to waste either because there is too much of it in a short space of time to be used or because the tree's owner doesn't have the ability or the time to harvest it. An established fruit tree can often produce 100+ pounds of fruit, far more than one family can consume. If you have a fruit tree, why not donate the excess to your local food bank? When you notice laden fruit trees in your neighborhood, knock on the door and ask if you can help harvest it to donate. Finally, you can look up local gleaning groups and offer your services to help pick or deliver the excess fruit to an organization that will get it into the mouths of hungry people.

Stewards of a Missionary Church

The month of October is an ideal time to focus our prayerful reflections on the world and to see its peoples as a gift from God. The global community is a gift to be received with gratitude and held in stewardship. With the celebration of World Mission Sunday, October is a month that offers Catholics worldwide the opportunity to renew their commitment to proclaim the Gospel and to give a greater missionary focus to parish activities. It is time to reflect on the global context of our stewardship, and to express our gratitude to missionaries who bear witness to Christ in the most remote and challenging places of the world, often with their lives.



The month of October can remind us that being witnesses to Jesus Christ is a stewardship responsibility of us all, and that in a world experiencing increasingly disturbing forms of alienation and indifference, our communion of faith can offer signs of hope and work to make the planet a home for all peoples.

We are “communion” because of the gift of the Eucharist. And this gift that we celebrate in the sacrament is not something we can keep to ourselves. By its very nature it demands to be shared with everyone. That is one reason the missionary impulse of our Church has always

been a sign of vitality in its unique witness of unity around the world.

There are a number of ways you can focus on the missionary activity of the Church:

- Include petitions for the Church’s missionary work in your daily prayers.
- Increase your awareness of the wider global mission of the Church.
- Discover ways to participate in specific missionary activities taking place in your parish or diocese.
- Give generously on World Mission Sunday, celebrated this year on October 23.

With the celebration of World Mission Sunday, October is a month that offers Catholics worldwide the opportunity to renew their commitment to proclaim the Gospel and to give a greater missionary focus to parish activities.

The Church’s work around the world is as important as the work in our own neighborhood. Let us be mindful this month that we are stewards of the Gospel, called to proclaim it to the ends of the earth, bringing hope to a world that hungers for Christ’s peace.

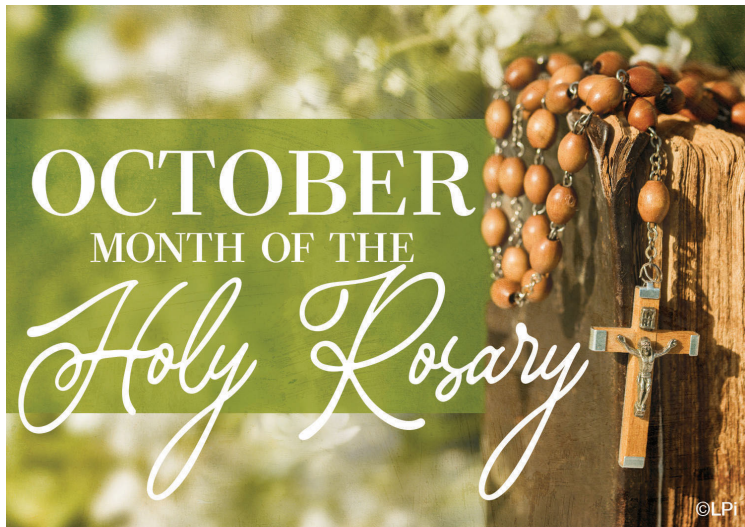
