From Monsignor Fran Cilia

On this Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (*Corpus Christi*), we reflect upon the multi-faceted reality of the Body of Christ (not only in the Eucharist, but in what each of us is called to be and to become), for we are called as members of Christ to be His Body, alive in the world today. In the fourth century, when Saint Augustine was Bishop of Hippo in north Africa, he offered these thoughts for our understanding of the mystery of the Body of Christ:

So now, if you want to understand the body of Christ, listen to the Apostle Paul speaking to the faithful: “You are the body of Christ, member for member” [1 Cor. 12.27]. If you, therefore, are Christ's body and members, it is your own mystery that is placed on the Lord's table! It is your own mystery that you are receiving! You are saying “Amen” to what you are: your response is a personal signature, affirming your faith. When you hear “The body of Christ,” you reply “Amen.” Be a member of Christ's body, then, so that your “Amen” may ring true!

But what role does the bread play? We have no theory of our own to propose here; listen, instead, to what Paul says about this sacrament: “The bread is one, and we, though many, are one body” [1 Cor. 10.17]. Understand and rejoice: unity, truth, faithfulness, love. “One bread,” he says. What is this one bread? Is it not the “one body,” formed from many? Remember: bread doesn't come from a single grain, but from many. . . And thus it is with the wine. Remember, friends, how wine is made. Individual grapes hang together in a bunch, but the juice from them all is mingled to become a single brew. This is the image chosen by Christ our Lord to show how, at his own table, the mystery of our unity and peace is solemnly consecrated.

We are pleased this weekend to celebrate with Father Victor Trinidad the Fifth Anniversary of his Ordination as a Priest. By virtue of our Baptism, we are all members of Christ. That is our first calling, and within the vocation of our Baptism, some are also called to ministries of service as ordained, vowed, married or as single members of the Church.

We rejoice in Father Victor's continued response to the Lord's call and in the many ways he has served the Body of Christ, first at the Cathedral Basilica Parish, and for two years now at Saint Clare.

We welcome the Trinidad Family and Father Victor's friends who join with us this Saturday. At the same time, we offer thanks to our Parish Pastoral Council for the work the councilors have done in organizing our celebration.

This accounts for a \$60,000 hole in this year's budget.

Saint Clare School is abuzz with year end activities and celebrations. Through their Capstone projects, the 8th grade students shared their visions for student led programs that can address current needs in our community. Every project idea had merit and was directly tied to Catholic Social Teachings. Projects included access to health services for the unhoused, awareness and a plan of action for condor preservation, English language acquisition for immigrants and refugee children, the provision of interview clothing for high school students along with interview skills workshops, mental health support through soccer, an allergy awareness website and application, and an effort to provide economically disadvantaged children with healthy meals beyond those received during the school day.

We are proud of the young people these graduates have become and know they will continue to share their gifts, talents, and faith as they move forward. They are a testament to their parents' investment in Catholic education. We are waiting to see the great things they will accomplish for the Church, the community, and in their lives.

Weekly Justice Challenges



The Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ is a powerful reminder of Jesus’ life, death and resurrection. We celebrate the gift of the Eucharist, the sacrament in which each of us is nourished and sent forth. This day reminds us that we don’t do things on our own power – but from strength gained from the Eucharist. Before Jesus died, he asked his disciples if they could drink from the cup. He was asking if they were willing to endure what might come if they chose to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, heal the sick and blind and set captives free. They said YES. The Body and Blood of Jesus is a gift to us, yet it is a challenge too. Ask yourself this week, “How does the Eucharist nourish and strengthen me? How am I being sent like the disciples? To whom am I being sent?” Reflect on how you have responded to these questions in the past. What will your response be from now on?

BRINGING HOME THE GOSPEL

June 2, 2024 • Body & Blood of Christ • Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

The Greatest Sacrament

Like all good Jews, Jesus and the apostles prepare for the Passover. The apostles secure a place for them to eat and celebrate the ancient ceremony of their faith. During the meal, at one of the ritual blessings, Jesus offers himself as a blessing—a blessing we continue to celebrate every day.

I have a great love for symmetry, and so I enjoy looking at trees and knowing that the branches that stretch to the sky have roots digging deep into the earth. In most healthy trees, the roots mirror the branches digging down, as far out and wide as the branches above them. People are very similar. If we hope to be healthy and whole, we need to be equally balanced, firmly rooted in the concrete reality of our lives while reaching out in the uncertainty of faith for all that is and can be.

We reach out, stretching for God, offering praise and seeking answers, but if we aren't firmly rooted in the ordinary things of our life, we're going to fall over. At the same time, we will be pretty shallow people if we live out our days stuck in the earth without constantly stretching toward our life source.

That's why the sacraments are such a perfect gift. The church celebrates seven different ways we can reach out for God's grace and receive God's life through ordinary physical things. Each sacrament has its own concrete sign, something that we can see, hear and feel that not only reminds us of the grace we receive in the sacrament, but also provides it.

The Blessed Sacrament is God's supreme gift. I become one with the Body of Christ in the very concrete signs of the faithful assembled, the Word broken open, the priest and, most especially, the blessed bread and wine; I share in Jesus' divinity just as he shared in my humanity. Jesus, you see, was the first and greatest sacrament—a concrete sign that God's life was with us and in us.

In a sense, everything visible is a kind of sacrament. Even the trees I so love are signs of God's love inviting us to love God in return.

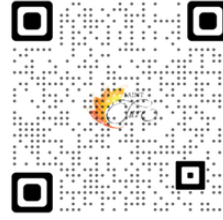

“ Aos mortais dando comida, dais também o pão da vida; que a família assim nutrida seja um dia reunida aos convivas lá no Céu!”. Assim acaba a Sequência da liturgia desta Solenidade do Santíssimo Sangue e Corpo de Cristo. S. Paulo na sua carta aos Hebreus, retrata-nos como no Cordeiro de Deus se materializou a última Aliança de Deus com os homens. Pelo qual Cristo ao derramar Seu Sangue alcançou á Humanidade a redenção eterna. Cristo foi a vítima sem mancha que sacrificando Seu Corpo por cada um de nós remiu-nos e nos justificou perante o Pai como herdeiros do Paraíso. Na Quinta Feira Santa se proclama este mesmo Evangelho. É o Evangelho da Instituição da Santa Eucaristia; herança nos legada por Jesus Cristo, para nos alimentar de toda e qualquer fome que tenhamos. Na Santa Eucaristia Jesus Se nos doa no pão e nos saceia no vinho, é uma refeição completa em que Deus fica dentro de nós. Reparem que tanto o pão como o vinho coisas pelo qual sem serem consagradas no altar são simplesmente artigos usados em qualquer refeição. Porém o pão ao ser confeccionado foi trigo que foi ceifado, triturado pela mó para se tornar farinha, batido para ser massa levedada e cozido no forno quente pelo fogo. Dá uma ideia da vida de Jesus quando traído por Judas, acusado e julgado falsamente por Pilatos e crucificado pela remissão dos nossos pecados. Da mesma forma o vinho que vai ser elevado pelo sacerdote que Diz as palavras de Jesus na última Ceia” Este é o Meu Sangue da nova Aliança...todas as vezes que o tomares fazei-o em memória de Mim.” Para ser vinho, a videira é cortada dos ramos que impedem a videira de dar bons frutos. Esses frutos depois de separados da videira são triturados para depois de levarem poerem ser vinho. Assim, o pão e o vinho são transformados na consagração no Corpo e Sangue do Senhor. Na doação do seu Corpo e Sangue firmou-se a última Aliança de Deus connosco desde Jesus Cristo até aos nossos dias e até ao fim dos tempos. Quando Jesus dizia que estaria connosco até ao fim dos tempos era na Santíssimo Sacramento da Eucaristia que Jesus planeou estar connosco. Comunguemos pois Jesus que fortalece as nossas vidas com a Sua vida. De Monseñor Fran Cilia

En esta Fiesta del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo (Corpus Christi), reflexionamos sobre la realidad multifacética del Cuerpo de Cristo (no sólo en la Eucaristía, sino en lo que cada uno de nosotros está llamado a ser y a llegar a ser), porque somos llamados como miembros de Cristo a ser Su Cuerpo, vivo en el mundo de hoy. En el siglo IV, cuando San Agustín era obispo de Hipona, en el norte de África, ofreció estos pensamientos para nuestra comprensión del misterio del Cuerpo de Cristo:

Ahora bien, si queréis comprender el cuerpo de Cristo, escuchad al apóstol Pablo hablando a los fieles: “Ahora bien, ustedes son el cuerpo de Cristo y cada uno es miembro de ese cuerpo.” [1 Cor. 12.27]. Si, pues, sois cuerpo y miembros de Cristo, ¡es vuestro propio misterio el que está puesto sobre la mesa del Señor! ¡Es tu propio misterio el que estás recibiendo! Estás diciendo “Amén” a lo que eres: tu respuesta es una firma personal que afirma tu fe. Cuando escuchas “El cuerpo de Cristo”, respondes “Amén”. ¡Sé, entonces, miembro del cuerpo de Cristo, para que tu “Amén” suene verdadero!

Pero ¿qué papel juega el pan? No tenemos ninguna teoría propia que proponer aquí; Escuchemos, en cambio, lo que Pablo dice sobre este sacramento: “Hay un solo pan del cual todos participamos; por eso, aunque somos muchos, formamos un solo cuerpo” [1 Cor. 10.17]. Comprende y alégrate: unidad, verdad, fidelidad, amor. “Un pan”, dice. ¿Qué es este pan? ¿No es “un solo cuerpo”, formado de muchos? Recuerda: el pan no surge de un solo grano, sino de muchos. . . Y lo mismo ocurre con el vino. Recuerden, amigos, cómo se elabora el vino. Las uvas individuales se juntan en un racimo, pero el jugo de todas ellas se mezcla para formar una sola infusión. Ésta es la imagen escogida por Cristo nuestro Señor para mostrar cómo, en su propia mesa, se consagra solemnemente el misterio de nuestra unidad y paz.

Tenemos el agrado de celebrar este fin de semana con el Padre Víctor Trinidad el Quinto Aniversario de su Ordenación Sacerdotal. En virtud de nuestro Bautismo, todos somos miembros de Cristo. Ese es nuestro primer llamado, y dentro de la vocación de nuestro Bautismo, algunos también son llamados a ministerios de servicio como miembros ordenados, votos, casados o solteros de la Iglesia.

Nos regocijamos por la continua respuesta del Padre Víctor al llamado del Señor y por las muchas maneras en que ha servido al Cuerpo de Cristo, primero en la Parroquia Catedral Basílica y desde hace dos años en Santa Clara.

Damos la bienvenida a la Familia Trinidad y a los amigos del Padre Víctor que se unen a nosotros este sábado. Al mismo tiempo, agradecemos a nuestro Consejo Pastoral Parroquial por el trabajo que han realizado los concejales en la organización de nuestra celebración.

LLEVANDO EL EVANGELIO A CASA

2 de junio de 2024 • El Cuerpo y la Sangre Santísimos • Marcos 14:12-16, 22-26

El más grande de los Sacramentos

Como todos los buenos judíos, Jesús y los apóstoles se preparan para la Pascua. Los apóstoles aseguran un lugar para que coman y celebren la antigua ceremonia de su fe. Durante la comida, en una de las bendiciones rituales, Jesús se ofrece a sí mismo como una bendición, una bendición que seguimos celebrando todos los días.

Tengo un gran amor por la simetría, así que disfruto mirando árboles y sabiendo que las ramas que se extienden hacia el cielo tienen raíces cavando profundamente en la tierra. En la mayoría de los árboles sanos, las raíces reflejan las ramas cavando hacia abajo, tan lejos y ancho como las ramas por encima de ellos. La gente es muy similar. Si esperamos ser sanos y enteros, debemos ser igualmente equilibrados, firmemente arraigados en la realidad concreta de nuestra vida mientras llegamos a la incertidumbre de la fe para todo lo que es y puede ser.

Nos acercamos, extendiendo a Dios, ofreciendo alabanzas y buscando respuestas, pero si no estamos firmemente arraigados en las cosas ordinarias de nuestra vida, nos vamos a caer. Al mismo tiempo, seremos personas bastante superficiales si vivimos nuestros días atrapados en la tierra sin estirar constantemente hacia nuestra fuente de vida.

Por eso los sacramentos son un regalo perfecto. La iglesia celebra siete maneras diferentes en que podemos tender la mano a la gracia de Dios y recibir la vida de Dios a través de cosas físicas ordinarias. Cada Sacramento tiene su propio signo concreto, algo que podemos ver, oír y sentir que no sólo nos recuerda la gracia que recibimos en la Santa Cena, sino que también la proporciona.

El Santísimo Sacramento es el don supremo de Dios. Me convierte en uno con el Cuerpo de Cristo en los signos muy concretos de los fieles reunidos, la Palabra abierta, el sacerdote y, sobre todo, el pan bendito y el vino; Comparto la divinidad de Jesús tal como él compartía en mi humanidad. Jesús, ya ves, fue el primer y más grande sacramento, una señal concreta de que la vida de Dios estaba con nosotros y en nosotros.

En cierto sentido, todo lo visible es una especie de sacramento. Incluso los árboles que amo son signos del amor de Dios invitándonos a amar a Dios a cambio.
