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## From Monsignor Fran Cilia

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“Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?”

These words, placed on the lips of the apostles, who were in the storm-tossed boat with Jesus, echo many of our questions. We ask why God does not intervene to heal whatever ails us, whether in mind or in body. We wonder why we feel abandoned during our most difficult times.

Job questioned the wisdom of God, Whose response forms this weekend’s first reading, *addressing Job out of the storm*:

Who shut within doors the sea,  
when it burst forth from the womb;  
when I made the clouds its garment  
and thick darkness its swaddling bands?  
When I set limits for it  
and fastened the bar of its door,  
and said: Thus far shall you come but no farther,  
and here shall your proud waves be stilled! (Job 3:1,8-11)

The Lord *does* care when we believe all is lost and that we are perishing. He is, so to speak, “in the boat” with us in those darkest days. He challenges us, also, to believe, to have faith in His nearness to us then, and every day of our lives.

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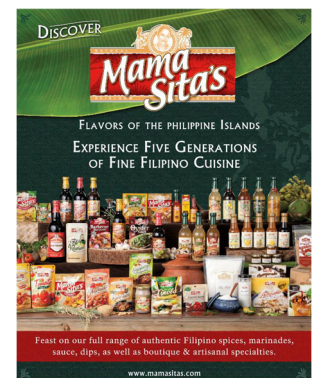

## Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jb 38:1, 8-11 | 2 Cor 5:14-17 | Mk 4:35-41

### **GROW** AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

St. Boniface, an English Benedictine monk who died in the 8th century, wrote in a letter: “In her voyage across the ocean of this world, the Church is like a great ship being pounded by the waves of life’s different stresses. Our duty is not to abandon ship but to keep her on her course.” Oceans and seas, lakes and rivers, baptism. The role of water in daily life and its use as a metaphor are woven throughout our Scriptures. In today’s readings, we hear two references to the sea. First, we have God talking to Job out of a storm, reminding the prophet that he – the Lord – is the one who created the seas and keeps them firmly in their place. The Gospel passage provides us with a stark reminder of that truth. As the disciples and Jesus cross the sea, a storm crops up and threatens to sink their boat. But one command from Jesus and the water is still. St. Boniface had it right. We really all are on that ship with Jesus on its voyage across the ocean of this world, and trusting in him to keep us on course and safe from harm ensures we reach the destinations he intends for us.

### **GO** EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

How to do our part to keep this great ship that is the Church on course? Trust in Christ, trust that he is present within us and guiding us each day. No one is immune from stormy seas, and like the disciples, we can turn to Jesus in times of peril. He asked the disciples: “Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?” Like the disciples, we must experience the change of heart that is necessary to place complete trust in Jesus to replace our fear and anxiety. God has things under control. Of course, that is what can be so scary sometimes. I know God will take care of everything, but what if I don’t like how he does it? What if I want him to answer my prayers one way and he answers them a different way? This is where Jesus might ask me: “Do you not yet have faith?” And I would have to reply, “I’m working on it.”

**PRAY** We are assured throughout Scripture that God loves us, cares for us, and sustains us. But how do we move from knowing that in our heads to feeling it in our hearts? Prayer. If we center our life on Jesus and his commands, trusting in him will become second nature. Take some time this week and pray with today’s Psalm (107:23-24, 25-26, 28-29, 30-31), which praises God for his love for us and gives voice to trusting in his providence.

“*Quem será Ele? Até o vento e o mar Lhe obedecem!*” Em vista de tantos milagres feitos por Jesus não era fácil acreditar que Jesus Cristo era o salvador, era o Messias. Não muitas vezes o próprio Jesus mostrou desapontamento na demonstração da falta de fé demonstrada pelos Apóstolos e pelos discípulos que O seguiam de perto. S. Tomé não acreditou que Jesus haveria ressuscitado enquanto não meteu o dedo nas feridas causadas pela morte de cruz. Falta de fé é tão humano e comum nos homens e mulheres de todos os tempos de todas as eras. Depois de Abraão, só uns poucos santos que veneramos nos altares das nossas igrejas são reconhecidos por uma fé inabalável. Ter fé é partir do acreditar no que se não vê. Para recebermos a Santa Eucaristia é imprescindível que na hóstia está o Corpo de Jesus e no vinho está o Sangue de Jesus. Não se vê carne ou sangue, mas, ainda hoje acreditamos que assim é), porque o próprio Jesus o disse na última Ceia; “Tomai e comei isto é o meu corpo...e levantando o cálice disse: Tomai e bebei este é o meu sangue derramado por vós para a remissão dos pecados.....Toda a vez que o fizerdes o fareis em minha memória!” Sabemos e devemos acreditar neste mistério porque é o próprio Jesus que o disse. Não acreditando não faz sentido ir tomar a Santa Comunhão. Ter fé é isso mesmo, pois que ; nem as tempestades, navegar em mar bravo, furacões e outros perigos preocupava Jesus que dormia descansadamente no meio de todos esses perigos. Se os discípulos de Jesus tivessem fé seria desnecessário acordar Jesus. A Pergunta que se faz é: Os discípulos acordaram Jesus para Ele se dar conta do perigo em que estava ou seria porque eles sabiam de antemão que Ele iria fazer o que fez: mandar que as ondas amainassem e que parasse os ventos? Pela frase que está no começo desta reflexão eles não esperavam que Jesus fosse capaz de fazer um milagre desta natureza. As travessias da vida são experiências que fazem o homem sair do confortável para o desconhecido. Sendo assim o homem aberto e vulneravelmente exposto so incógnito num bravo fica consciente que é fraco, que não tem nem força e menos poder para se comparar com Deus. Historicamente o mar é uma força negativa donde nos seus abismos habitava o demónio.; era desta forma que no tempo de Jesus o mar era conhecido como força natural negativa. Decerto que os pescadores não pensariam dessa forma pois do mar ganhavam o seu sustento e das suas famílias. Na barca (vista como a Igreja) Jesus esta no meio dela e dos discípulos, nas tempestades e nos perigos que a Igreja vive, esta evangeliza esperança e confiança pois nos assegura da presença de Jesus que nos assegurou não nos abandonar nunca e estar conosco até ao fim dos tempos. Sabemos que Jesus se dá na Santa Comunhão, mas será que nos comprometemos a vir á igreja para O receber? Para cumprimentar-Lo e agradecer o seu amor por nós? Quando por amor o Pai enviou seu Único Filho para nos salvar do pecado e da escravidão neste gesto de amor misericordioso está o modelo para retribuirmos o nosso amor construindo um relacionamento amoroso com Jesus pela oração e Santa Comunhão..

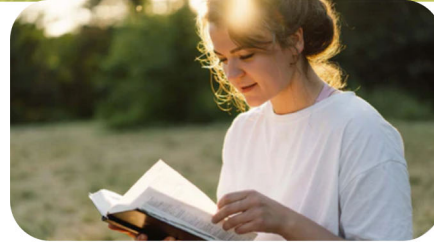

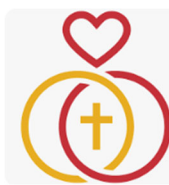

Al Señor *sí* le importa cuando creemos que todo está perdido y que estamos pereciendo. Él está, por así decirlo, "en el barco" con nosotros en esos días más oscuros. Él también nos desafía a creer, a tener fe en su cercanía a nosotros en ese momento y todos los días de nuestras vidas.
