In Nazareth, Jesus' hometown, the first reactions to His teachings and "mighty works" were gratitude and astonishment. This quickly turns to resentment that He, one of them, should do such wondrous things. They asked, "Is he not the carpenter, the son of Mary?"

This illustrates the mystery of the Incarnation. Jesus, God among us, is also fully human. He could teach and heal and restore life, but all the people of Nazareth could see was one of their own, whom they resented for His good works.

The people had done the same to the prophet Ezekiel. And sometimes we are also guilty of judging others because, in our estimation, they have no right to be wiser, better or more intelligent than the rest of us. We may say to such a person, "Who do you think you are?"

We should not be threatened by the good that others can accomplish; rather let us see in them – and hopefully, they in us – the glory of God revealed in our good works.

As we enter into a new budget year, we anticipate the need for our weekly collections to average \$10,100. This will allow us to cover all budgeted expenses. Due to your generosity, this past year, we actually received more than we are requesting this coming year.

This is a good time to consider our weekly, monthly or annual gifts. So many continue to give what they gave 5, 10, or more years ago. What was a sacrifice then may no longer be today. Others dig into their pockets or purse to see if they have any spare change to put into the basket. Boletim Paroquial Português **7 de Julho de 2024; Domingo XIV do Tempo Comum** **Reflexão Por: João Pereira Arruda**

“Um profeta só é desprezado na sua terra, entre os seus parentes e em sua casa.” Assim foi no tempo de Jesus, antes de Jesus no nosso tempo aqui e agora e assim o será no futuro. Parece que seja uma atitude natural em os lugares que pessoas se distinguem por feitos extraordinários, com inteligências geniais em áreas de medicina, aos profetas construtores da paz; etc. Tal e qual no tempo de Jesus, que por inveja os judeus levaram-No á condenação e morte por medo e inveja de Jesus pregar a paz , a justiça e equidade, também nesta nação o fizeram a Martin Luther King perseguir e o assassinaram. Este tinha a convicção de que Deus fizera o homem á Sua imagem e semelhança, não obstante a cor, raça e gender , E de igual modo na Índia mataram Mahatma Ghandhi que liderou um movimento de resistência do poder colonial por meios pacíficos. A história nos diz e repete-se que a ganância do poder e a inveja leva os poderosos a matarem quem se lhes enfrenta e estorva. A reação dos nazarenos que conheciam os pais interrogavam-se “Não será este Jesus o filho de Maria e Jose?” De novo a fraqueza humana, de que ser pobre, ou de poucos meios, é sinal de não ser inteligente para as lides de professor, doutor ou advogado. Em todos os tempos e em todas as gerações existiram termos legais de impedirem os pobres de terem acesso ao ensino básico e dar oportunidades aos pobres de estudarem. Esta tendência humana dos pobres se curvarem para dar os lugares de relevo aos ricos e poderosos é contrário ao modo como Deus opera conosco. Ora vejamos: Jesus escolheu Pedro para chefiar a Sua Igreja. Este que era pescador e vivendo de um modo modesto do pescado que apanhava e que durante o julgamento de Jesus O negou de não O conhecer; escolheu-o para conduzir o Seu Povo, ser o Pastor da Sua Igreja. Não foi Jesus que aparecendo a Saulo, o mesmo que perseguia e matava os cristãos para depois o tornar no Apóstolo dos gentios e de evangelizar para fora da Terra Santa expandindo a Palavra de Deus por todo o lado que pregava. Estes e outros mais exemplos nos indicam que Deus na sua divindade usa um processo de amor conosco pelo qual todos batizados na Trindade Santíssima de Deus Pai, Deus Filho e de Deus Espírito Santo têm todos a oportunidade de serem seus filhos, profetas, sacerdotes e reis. A atitude dos nazarenos , mesmo reconhecendo que Jesus era de uma inteligência extraordinária, por inveja não acreditaram Jesus como tal por ser filho de Maria e José que por sinal na sua modéstia eram humildes mas ricos de fé e de entrega aos pedidos do Senhor. Quando Deus se fez humano escolheu Maria que era uma simples rapariga de pais: Joaquim e Ana que eram também modestos e humildes. A Maria fez dela a Mãe do Salvador da Humanidade. Deus não escolheu uma princesa, rainha, ou de escala elevada no escalão social, mas sim uma moça simples e modesta que aceitou e executou o plano de Deus tal e qual Ele o pedira. Este Evangelho nos lança um desafio em termos os nossos corações abertos ao que Ele nos pede e a dar justiça e respeito áqueles que o merecem.
