Bread was always special – even sacred – in our home. A day did not go by that we did not share a loaf of dark-bake sourdough (Larraburu!). While we loved (and still do) our sourdough, our relationship with bread went deeper. When other food fell on the ground, that was usually the end for whatever it was that had fallen. However, if a piece of bread were to find its way to the floor, we would pick it up, even kiss it, and eat it. From my very earliest days, I remember being told that this was because Jesus chose bread to become His Body. Even “ordinary” bread had eucharistic significance for us. While the bread we shared at dinner was not the Body and Blood of the Lord, it was a sign or remembrance of the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

As we continue to hear from the sixth chapter of the Gospel of Saint John, Jesus contrasts the “bread from heaven” (manna) that the Israelites ate in the desert with the bread that He gives, “food for eternal life.”

We will continue to unfold the ways in which Jesus is the Bread of Life and Living Bread come down from heaven in the weeks ahead.

Let us rejoice in this greatest of gifts, by which we are sharers in the very Body and Blood of the Lord.

Solemnity of Saint Clare of Assisi Our Patronal Feast

Next weekend, we will celebrate the Feast of Saint Clare of Assisi. In a parish church, the feast of the patron is observed as a solemnity, ranked even higher than a Sunday.

Clare is not just patron of our Parish and the University and Mission Church across the street from us. She is also patron of the City of Santa Clara and Secondary Patron (along with Saint Joseph) of the Diocese of San José and of Santa Clara County.

In honor of the feast – and in honor of all of our parishioners – we will have special hospitality after the Masses next weekend. This includes the Saturday evening Mass, as well as the 7:30, 10:30 and 12:00 Noon Mass.

We invite you and your family members to join us in celebrating who we are as a parish, defined in canon law as “a community of the Christian faithful,” but more than that. We are a people who share a faith, care for each other, and gather to celebrate each Sunday the saving work of God in Jesus, Who feeds us with His holy Word and with His Body and Blood, thus forming us more and more into a vibrant community, established in God’s love.

The Portuguese Mass next Sunday will be at 10:30 in the tent.

This will allow us to celebrate our Feast Day’s Family Mass in the church. If you are planning on coming to the English Mass at 10:30, just come to the church, as you normally would.




Parish Mission Statement

“A obra de Deus consiste em acreditar n’Aquele que o Ele enviou”. Acreditar é a palavra chave da Liturgia da Palavra deste Domingo. Acreditar é o sinal do grau de fé que se tem e que se acenta em Deus. Ter fé é acreditar naquilo que se não vê mas que se vive porque assim o disse Deus. As escrituras nos trazem muitos exemplos de fé sendo a maior o exemplo de Abraão, o nosso Pai na fé. Também da mulher que pela fé acreditou que bastava tocar na túnica de Jesus para ficar curada. Ela assim o fez e em resposta Jesus disse-lhe; “mulher a tua fé te salvou”. Santa Mónica, Mãe de Santo Agostinho que depositou a sua confiança... o seu crer na oração pela conversão do filho a uma vida desregrada e de viver na devassidão, para uma vida de Santo e Doutor da Igreja. A fé gerada e trabalhada pelo crer resulta da ser persistente na oração diária. Fazer da oração o alimento espiritual que nos liga intimamente com Deus. Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Ex 16:2-4, 12-15 | Eph 4:17, 20-24 | Jn 6:24-25

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE


When have you grumbled against God instead of consenting, trusting, and believing he would see you through to a brighter future? In this first reading from Exodus, the whole Israelite community laments over their wanderings in the desert; their earthly focus on hunger and thirst leads them to believe slavery in Egypt would have been better than God's freedom for them. When we are struggling for whatever reason, it's easy to forget all that God has done for us in the past and all he desires to do for us in the future. We may not even recognize the very life-giving and life-sustaining "bread" that lays before us, much as the Israelites did not recognize the bread that lay before them in the desert. In spite of our hard-heartedness at times, however, God is truly patient; he loves us beyond measure. Just as he did not condemn the Israelites, he does not condemn us but rather, calls us back to him time and again with love and mercy.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

As we heard, God sends the people quail and manna - bread from heaven - to satisfy their frustrated longings while preparing them for an even greater "bread from heaven" that is still to come. In the Gospel, Jesus references this Scripture passage and clarifies that it was not Moses, but his Father who provided the bread from heaven. Jesus tells his disciples to "work for food that endures for eternal life" because he wants them to see the bigger picture. He wants them (and us!) to understand that we should not toil only for physical bread, but for the truest food that is life-giving to our souls - the food found in accomplishing the works of God by believing and following the one he sent: Jesus. We do this by following Paul's advice from the second reading and seek to "be renewed in the spirit of [our] minds," following God's way of holiness. Only in and through this conformity to Christ will we be prepared to go forth and witness to the mystery of our faith.

REFLECT This week, in thinking about how you can "accomplish the works of God," turn to Paul's Letter to the Ephesians. He tells them to put away their old self and "put on the new self, created in God's way." Examine where you might not be seeing your own manna from heaven, and refocus your efforts to give praise and thanksgiving to God for his never-ending mercy and care.



Comida del cielo

Las lecturas de esta semana en la misa

- ▶ Éxodo 16:2-4, 12-15 - Maná en el desierto
- ▶ Efesios 4:17, 20-24 - Renovación en Cristo
- ▶ Juan 6:24-35 - Jesús como el pan de vida

El Evangelio de Juan está lleno de simbolismo y metáforas y grandes “señales” de que Jesús trabaja para demostrar la verdad detrás de las metáforas. El sexto capítulo, que estamos leyendo desde hace cuatro semanas, es un ejemplo perfecto de ello.

Primero, hoy, se nos recuerda cómo Jesús alimentó a la inmensa multitud comenzando con solo dos panes y cinco peces. Esto despierta la curiosidad de la multitud que sigue a Jesús para aprender más sobre quién es, de dónde viene y qué más podría hacer. Su señal de alimentar a la multitud en el desierto les había recordado cómo Dios suministró a sus antepasados maná en el desierto cuando estaban en peligro de morir de hambre después de escapar de Egipto. Jesús les dice que no fue Moisés quien produjo el maná, sino su Padre celestial. De la misma manera, Jesús les dice, él ha bajado del cielo para dar vida al mundo.

En este punto, hace la increíble afirmación de que “YO SOY el pan de vida; el que viene a mí no tendrá hambre, y el que cree en mí nunca tendrá sed”. Jesús usa el signo (alimentar a la multitud) y la metáfora (la comida da vida) y lo lleva un paso más allá al afirmar que él es la realidad detrás de ambos.

Los judíos que escuchaban a Jesús entonces y escuchaban esta historia contada más tarde habrían reconocido con un shock el juego de palabras Cuando Jesús dijo: “YO SOY el pan de vida”. La frase “YO SOY” es la gran frase que Dios (“Yah-veh”) usó

para nombrarse a sí mismo en el Antiguo Testamento cuando Moisés se encontró con Dios en la zarza ardiente. (Éxodo 3). ¡Jesús claramente se está identificando a sí mismo aquí con Dios!

- 1 Piensa en un momento de tu vida en el que necesites alimento (literalmente) y/o nutrición mental, emocional o espiritual. ¿De qué forma te llegó el maná?
- 2 What ¿Qué significa para ti cuando Jesús dice: “Yo soy el pan de vida; el que viene a mí nunca tendrá hambre”?

El pan siempre fue especial –incluso sagrado– en nuestro hogar. No pasaba un día sin que compartiéramos una hogaza de masa madre horneada (¡Larraburu!). Si bien amamos (y todavía amamos) nuestro pan fermentado, nuestra relación con el pan fue más profunda. Cuando otros alimentos caían al suelo, normalmente era el final de lo que había caído. Sin embargo, si un trozo de pan cayera al suelo, lo recogeríamos, incluso lo besaríamos y nos lo comeríamos. Desde mis primeros días, recuerdo que me dijeron que esto se debía a que Jesús eligió el pan para convertirse en Su Cuerpo. Incluso el pan “ordinario” tenía para nosotros un significado eucarístico. Si bien el pan que compartimos en la cena no era el Cuerpo y la Sangre del Señor, era una señal o recuerdo del Sacramento de la Eucaristía.

Como seguimos escuchando en el capítulo sexto del Evangelio de San Juan, Jesús contrasta el “pan del cielo” (maná) que comieron los israelitas en el desierto con el pan que Él les da, “alimento para la vida eterna”.

Continuaremos revelando las formas en que Jesús es el Pan de Vida y el Pan Vivo que descendió del cielo en las próximas semanas.

Alegremonos de este mayor de los dones, por el cual somos partícipes del mismo Cuerpo y Sangre del Señor.
