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From Monsignor Fran Cilia

Two passages in this Sunday's scripture reading give instruction and challenge to present-day believers.

From the Letter of Saint James, we hear:

Humbly welcome the word that has been planted in you and is able to save your souls. Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves (1:21b).

Jesus, quoting the prophet Isaiah, chastises the Pharisees for their hypocrisy and warns his followers, then and now, to live lives of integrity:

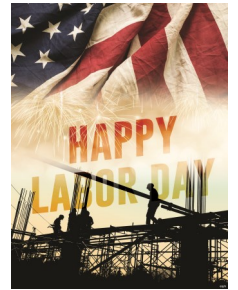
This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me
(Mark 7:6 and Isaiah 29:13).

In other words, there must be an unbreakable bond between what we think, what we say and what we do. In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus declares that "Blessed are those who hear the word of God and keep it."

Each in our own way struggles for this integrity. A generation ago, we heard "Mean what you say and say what you mean." This continues to be good advice for us throughout our lives, but especially regarding our beliefs and our life of faith.

Labor Day Holiday

On Labor Day, this Monday, our parish Mass will be at 9:00 am, and our Parish Office will be closed in observance of the holiday.



Second Collection Catholic Education: September 7 and 8

90% of the funds collected will remain in our diocese to support the work of the Department of Catholic Schools in developing leadership and making Catholic education accessible to all students (via the tuition assistance fund) and to support lay ecclesial ministry formation and certification through the ILM and Office of Evangelization. 10% of the fund will be sent to support the Catholic University of America.



♦ Throughout the School Year, we celebrate Mass with our Saint Clare School community each Friday (except on school holidays) at 10:45. We extend an invitation to any parishioners who would like to participate in these Masses.

The Season of Creation extends from September 1 until October 4, the Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi. In a joint statement from Pope Francis, the Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew and Archbishop Justin Welby of Canterbury, these three Christian leaders wrote: "Future generations will never forgive us if we miss the opportunity to protect our common home. We have inherited a garden; we must not leave a desert for our children."

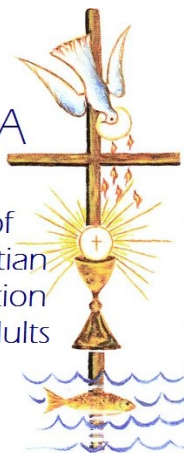

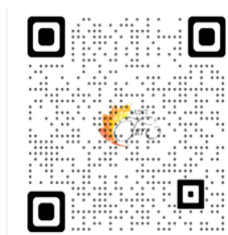

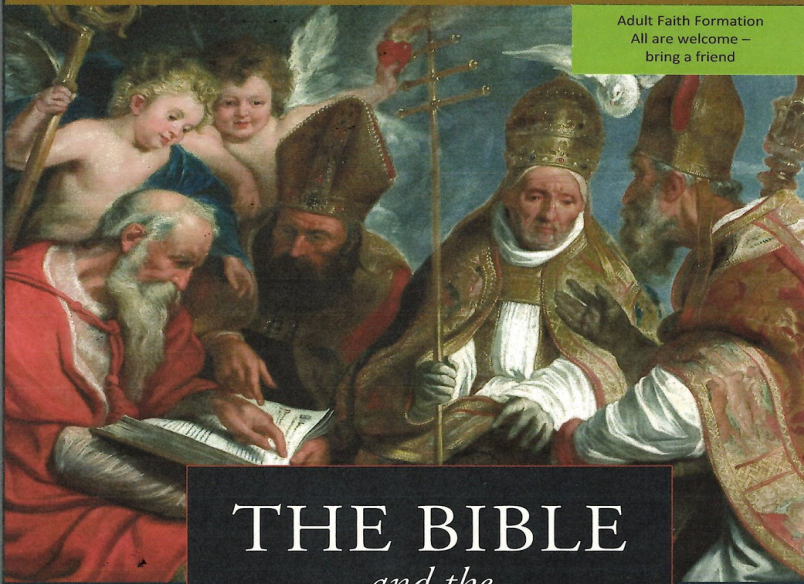

Stewardship and Evangelizing Young Adults: A Conference Focus

Few issues resonant more with Catholics today than the evangelization of the young Church. How is your parish prepared to reach out to young adults and respond to their pastoral needs? This vital question will be explored at the 2024 International Catholic Stewardship Conference in New Orleans, Louisiana, from September 15 to 18. Pope Francis, in *Evangelii Gaudium* ("The Joy of the Gospel"), captured the importance of the young in sharing the Good News: "How beautiful it is to see that young people are 'street preachers,' joyfully bringing Jesus to every street, every town square and every corner of the earth! ... Young people call us to renewed and expansive hope."



There is a renewed interest in scripture studies among young adults both inside and outside of the Church.

Yet, as Christian stewards, we are concerned about how to engage young adults, who often see the Church with cynicism and disappointment. How can we bring forth from them the enthusiasm and devotion of which Pope Francis speaks? How do we involve them and support them pastorally so that our pews – and our street corners – are filled with young adults committed to Jesus?

At this year's ICSC conference, a number of inspirational speakers will touch on topics related to evangelizing young adults in your parish today.

History shows us that young adults are inspired by Catholic leaders who step forward in social justice causes and in service to the poor. Some parishes are finding that an effective way to reach unchurched young adults is to give them the opportunity to work with young Catholics who are committed to work in service and justice projects. Relationship building is key to evangelizing young adults. There is a renewed interest in scripture studies among young adults both inside and outside of the Church. How can a parish committed to studying scripture in an engaging and transformative way help to demonstrate to young adults the relevance of the Gospel to modern life? To explore all these important questions, join us in September at the annual ICSC Conference in New Orleans.

“Hipocritas”! Disse Jesus aos fariseus e escribas. Jesus na sua vida pública nunca recusou uma oportunidade de demascarar aqueles que se entregavam aos usos e costumes em abono das suas tradições herdadas dos seus antepassados. Jesus ao confrontar-los e de os demascarar como falsos, insinceros, as aparências exteriores, estava a revelar-lhes que a pureza no homem não está na água com que se lava mas sim de como se esforça para limpar seu coração de tudo que é: desamor, inveja, hipocrisia, violência, injúria e mais...porque são dessas inundeças que devemos limpar para nos aproximarmos de Deus. A aclamação ao Evangelho de hoje nos diz: “Deus Pai nos gerou pela palavra da verdade, para sermos como primícias das suas criaturas” É muito importante que cuidemos da nossa higiene corporal mas mais ainda é importante que cuidemos do nosso espírito porque este é pertença de Deus. 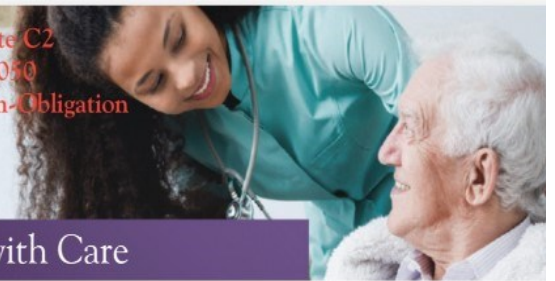
El Consejo Portugués patrocina un picnic comunitario
