

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From Monsignor Fran Cilia

We have just concluded a very long and contentious political season. The American people elected a president, members of Congress and a host of state and local leaders. We chose them to serve us – each in a specific way and for a definite term of office.

On this Solemnity, “Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe,” the Church gives us the image of a different kind of ruler, One Whose “kingdom is not of this world,” Who was crowned with thorns, and freed us from our sins by the blood He shed on the cross.

The Lord’s reign is marked by service, especially to those on the margins. In the gospel of Matthew, Jesus tells the story of the final judgment, the sheep and goats separated according to whether or not they fed the hungry, clothed the naked, etc. Indeed, the best way to discern the state of a nation or a kingdom is the care that is given to those who are seen as powerless: the poor, the ill, the aged, the unborn, the immigrant. In Jesus’ reign, their welfare is paramount. As we work toward tending the seeds of the Kingdom that the Lord has planted, we show extra care to those who are seemingly unimportant, but whose well-being is, in actuality, the measure of the greatness of God’s reign.

Reflexão Por: João Pereira Arruda

“É como dizes; sou rei. Para isso nasci e vim ao mundo a fim de dar ao mundo o testemunho da verdade. Todo aquele que é da verdade escuta a minha voz”. Foi a resposta de Jesus dada á pregunta de Pilatos no julgamento que condenou Jesus por ser rei dos Judeus. Pilatos, os judeus, os fatiseus, os escribas e os próprios discípulos acreditavam num reino de poder e de riqueza, mas Jesus estava a referir que o seu Reino era um Reino de amor, de Justiça e equidade e de paz. Era então o que o mundo ansiava com a vinda de Jesus Cristo; é também hoje , o que o mundo anseia nos nossos dias. Se o mundo judeu não acreditou em Jesus, julgou-O e matou-O com morte de cruz, assim também hoje não acreditamos na Sua ressurreição e na mensagem do Evangelho que neste Domingo celebramos desde o Advento, acompanhando os Evangelhos nos dado segundo S. Marcos. O Reino de amor, de justiça e equidade na paz só se materializa a começar por cada um de nós. O Reino de Deus que Jesus perante Pilatos afirmou não é deste mundo, mas é da responsabilidade de cada um de nós viver neste mundo usando um formulário de decisões cujo o resultado dessas decisões afecta o nosso viver em paz ou em agitação preocupante que até afecta a saúde e aqueles que vivem em nosso redor. Fazer uma decisão de viver em preguiça do não me rales, ou do isso não é comigo,, causa efeitos muito prejudiciais; porque enquanto se esconde nessa qualidade de preguiça aqueles que vivem dos fracos , dos pobres, dos imigrantes e exilados, podem-no fazer-lo porque inconscientemente fizeste a decisão de “esconder-te” numa imagem que embora aparentemente seja boa para os demais na verdade é podre porque teve a oportunidade de viver segundo as recomendações de Jesus no sermão da montanha já clarificavam o povo qual o plano de Deus para O alcaçarem. Entre as oito Bem aventuranças a primeira das quais Jesus diz **“Felizes os pobres de espírito porque deles é o Reino de Deus”** Deixar-se ficar na ignorância é preguiça, desmazelo, não dar importância ás recomendações que Deus nos deixou é dar impotâncio ao efêmero, ao agora.. É o fim do ano litúrgico, que neste último dia tentemos fazer uma mudança e em cada um de nós possa ser uma pedra viva da Igreja de Jesus Cristo Rei do Universo e das nossas vidas que nos recomenda viver uma vida neste mundo que nos leva ao Seu Reino.

Faith and Racial Justice: Changing Systems and Structures




If we reflect on today's Gospel, it might be hard for us to envision Jesus ever dressed like an actual king! When Pontius Pilate asked him if he was a king, Jesus responded, "If my kingdom did belong to this world, my attendants would be fighting to keep me from being handed over." Imagine: Jesus had spent the night in agony; his friends had all abandoned him; and, in a few verses, Pilate will deliver him to be scourged. He must have *felt*, at that moment, like anything but a king. But, indeed, he was (and is) the Creator of the Universe and its rightful king. We Christians – called, like Jesus' first disciples, to be his friends and followers – should do everything we can to proclaim him as king of our hearts, our families, our lives, and our society.

INVITE This week, take one opportunity to invite someone to pray with you. They could be dinner guests, a coworker, or a friend you meet for coffee. Whoever it is, ask him or her if there are any particular intentions you can bring to God in prayer. By doing this, you remind your friend of God's constant presence and his desire to be part of all of your joys, sorrows, and anxieties.

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

There is a tradition of placing an image of Jesus' Sacred Heart in a prominent place in the home. The idea is to "enthrone" Jesus as king of the home and the family; there is even a small ceremony to go along with the enthronement. In one of the most famous images of the Sacred Heart, Jesus wears a magnificent crown, holds a scepter in his right hand, and carries the earth in his left hand. We see, from this picture, Jesus as a king with a glorious crown who holds the world in his hand – but he does so with a heart burning with love! He loves us so much that he wishes to extend the reign of his love to every human being on earth. We can cooperate with him in this by "enthroning" him as king of our hearts and our homes and allowing his love to impact everything we do and say. By our willingness to welcome God into every aspect of our lives, we will become witnesses of his love to others.

Acabamos de concluir una temporada política muy larga y polémica. El pueblo estadounidense eligió un presidente, miembros del Congreso y una multitud de líderes estatales y locales. Los elegimos para que nos sirvan, cada uno de una manera específica y por un período de mandato definido.

En esta solemnidad, “Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo”, la Iglesia nos da la imagen de un tipo diferente de gobernante, Uno cuyo “reino no es de este mundo”. Que fue coronado de espinas y nos liberó de nuestros pecados por la sangre que derramó en la cruz.

El reino del Señor está marcado por el servicio, especialmente a los marginados. En el evangelio de Mateo, Jesús cuenta la historia del juicio final, las ovejas y las cabras separadas según si alimentaban o no a los hambrientos, vestían a los desnudos, etc. De hecho, la mejor manera de discernir el estado de una nación o de un reino es el cuidado que se brinda a quienes se consideran impotentes: los pobres, los enfermos, los ancianos, los no nacidos, los inmigrantes. En el reinado de Jesús, su bienestar es primordial. Mientras trabajamos para cuidar las semillas del Reino que el Señor ha plantado, mostramos un cuidado especial a aquellos que son aparentemente poco importantes, pero cuyo bienestar es, en realidad, la medida de la grandeza del reino de Dios.
