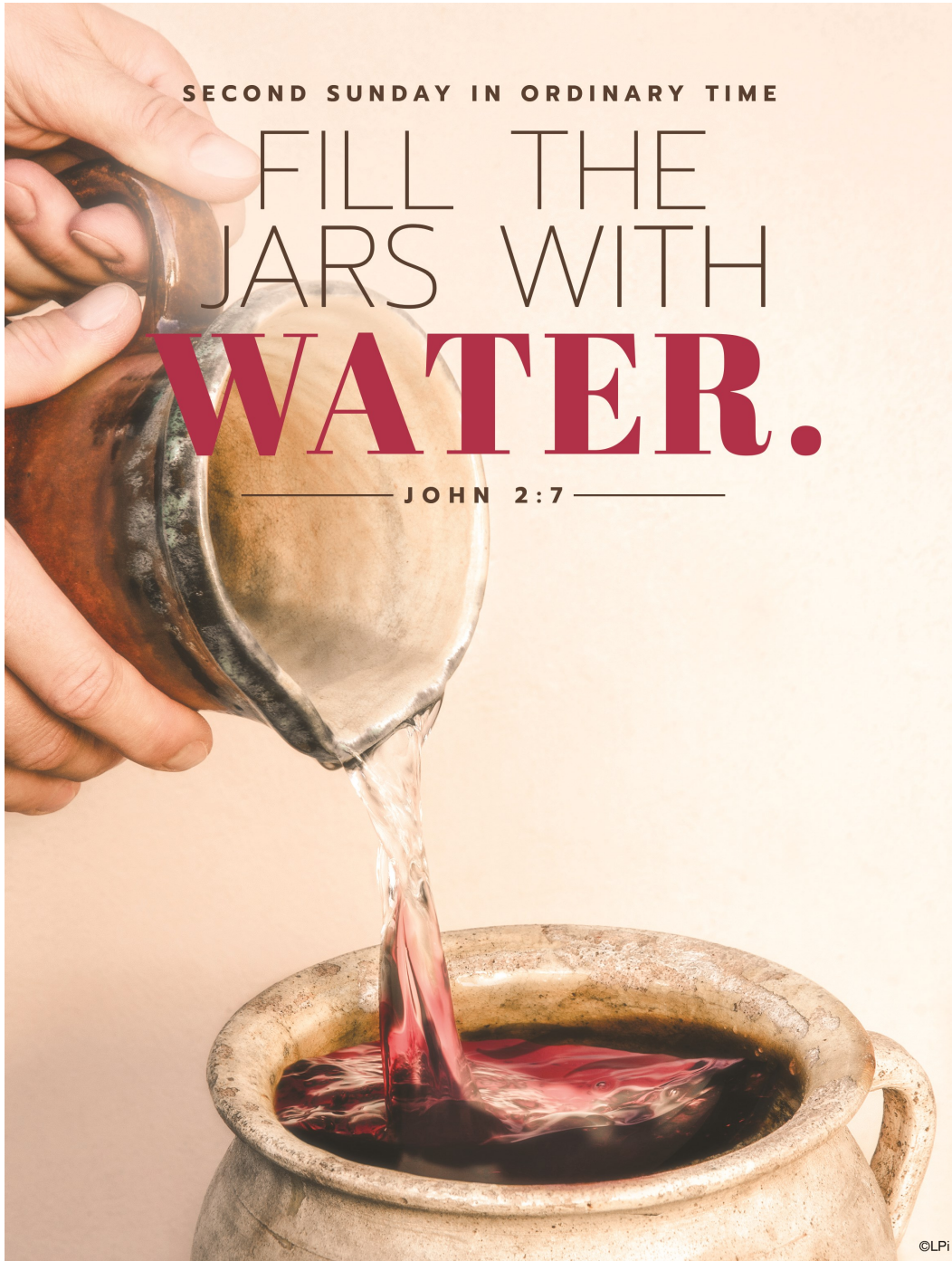

From Monsignor Fran Cilia

Jesus' miracle at the wedding feast in Cana in Galilee is a further manifestation (or epiphany) of God's unique presence in the Lord Jesus. Along with the visit of the Magi and the Baptism in the River Jordan, this first of the miracles (known as "signs"), changing water into wine, was a "revelation of His glory," resulting in the disciples' believing in Jesus.

We will never know why Jesus chose that wedding celebration to act in this way; however, for a poor people who lived a hard life, running out of wine while the party continues would have brought great sadness.

Wine had traditionally been a sign of the joy that will be found in God's reign. To use theological language, a wedding feast would have been a "foretaste and promise" of the feast of heaven. To run out of wine would be, in effect, to lose the joy of the occasion.

Why did Jesus do this? Perhaps simply because He had compassion for the newlyweds and their families. Or it may have been out of deference for His mother, who lamented that there was no more wine. For whatever reason, Jesus clearly immersed Himself in the concerns of others, as He continues to be for us. The "signs and wonders" of the Lord's compassionate care for us may not be as visible as changing water into wine, but He is here, with us, now and always.

Annual Diocesan Appeal 2024 ~ Final Report

Last year's ADA was a tremendous success here at Saint Clare. You may remember that our diocesan goal was \$98,700 and that we targeted a combined goal of \$175,000. We received 275 pledges, totaling \$183,795.45, and by the end of the year 270 were fully paid, for a total of \$182,545.45. The parish refund is \$83,845.45.

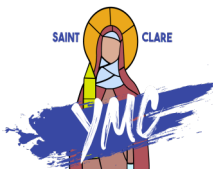

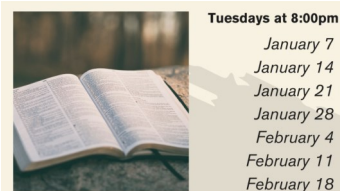

We at Saint Clare School are excited about the rapidly approaching Catholic Schools Week. The week begins next Sunday, January 26th, with Family Mass at 10:30 and a delicious breakfast served from 8:00am to 12:00pm in the hall. The Breakfast at St. Clare's team has been working for months to provide an opportunity to gather as a parish and school community and to fill those empty Sunday morning stomachs. An example of one of the many ways our teachers bring our Catholic faith to life was kindergarten's Epiphany House Blessing. An Epiphany house blessing is a Catholic tradition that involves marking a home's entrance with blessed chalk to invite God into the home. Leading up to the blessing, our 5 year olds learned about Epiphany and the three Magi who followed the Star as they brought gifts to honor Jesus. In celebration and remembrance of Epiphany, they helped bless their classroom and each of their own homes by writing 20+C+M+B+25 on the entry doorway with white chalk blessed by Msgr. Fran.



Our excited kindergartners learned that the numbers in 20+C+M+B+25 represent the year and that the letters CMB represent the three Magi - Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They also learned that CMB stands for "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" or "May Christ bless this house." They discovered that the white chalk is traditionally used as it represents purity and holiness.

The symbols and tradition of our faith were brought to life in the classroom and shared in our students' homes. As Catholic educators, it is our hope and prayer that this tradition inspired meaningful conversations and moments of prayer as a family on Epiphany and throughout the year.

Reflexão Por: João Pereira Arruda

Neste Domingo e depois do Baptismo do Senhor, Jesus inicia a sua Missão de fazer a vontade do Pai: evangelizando os povos daquela região a que chamamos hoje Terra Santa. Jesus inicia o começo da Sua vida pública fazendo o milagre de tornar água em vinho. Para Jesus podia não ser o tempo correcto mas Maria iniciou o processo em fazer de uma situação embaraçosa em normalizar-la de modo que o último vinho servido era melhor do que o primeiro. A intervenção de Maria, também poderia-mos ponderar; que tal como Jesus sempre esteve atenta á vontade do Pai e tal como Jesus que disse que veio ao mundo para que todos nós tivéssemos vida e a tivéssemos em abundância ; assim também Maria apressou o começo da vida pública de Jesus ao dizer aos criados: “ fazei tudo o que Ele vos disser..” Maria em toda a sua vida nos aponta Jesus como a **solução** para os nossos problemas. Maria nunca Se distraiu á s mensagens que vieram do Pai e a todas elas deu a resposta certa. Maria, sempre atenta, notou que o vinho iria cedo acabar e para evitar uma ocasião embaraçosa para a família apontou Jesus como solução; ainda hoje Maria, a quem tal como Jesus chamamos de Mãe, vai pelo mundo, seja em Fátima, em Lurdes ou Guadalupe, ela escolhe gente que tal como os criados no casamento levam o seu recado a Jesus. Crianças ou jovens tal como: Lúcia, Francisco e Jacinta, Bernardete ou Juan Diego; não foram escolhidos os eruditos do mundo, nem os mais ricos e poderosos ou os sempre bonitos e populares, mas sim crianças de condição modesta mas todos eles atentos á mensagem e com vontade de a transmitir ás pessoas a quem estas eram dirigidas. Por este cenário entramos neste Domingo com uma recomendação muito clara e uma virtude de Maria, nossa Mãe. ***Estar atentos ás mensagens que vêm de Deus e Fazer a vontade de Deus.*** Para que isso aconteça é necessário bloquearmos as mensagens que vêm do mundo que nos rodeiam, tais como os meios de comunicação de cariz social, política, despotiva das artes e de outras lugares que só nos desfocam da meta que é Deus nas nossas vidas e do nosso viver em paz conosco, com Deus e os irmãos. Para fazer-mos a vontade de Deus, e sabermos bloquear, não deixar entrar em nós, inuncies que prejudiquem as nossas vidas . Deste modo e fazendo isso, entramos mais seguros de aderir e seguir Jesus na Sua missão evangelizadora de nos pregar vontade de Deus tal e qual : André, Tiago e Pedro seguiram Jesus quando João Baptista lhes apontaram a seguir Jesus . Neste Tempo vamos seguir Jesus no início da Sua vida pública até chegarmos á Quarta – Feira de Cinzas e o início do Tempo da Quaresma. Pede-se a Deus que durmamos o necessário para a manutenção da nossa saúde e o resto do tempo atentos para podermos, tal como Jesus e Maria fazermos a vontade do Pai.

Em Espírito de celebrar meio século de existência na paróquia de Saint Clare's: Na verdade as celebrações em português tiveram seu início em Abril de 1973, porém só com a vinda do Padre José Ribeiro formou-se em uma comunidade organizada liturgicamente Culturalmente e socialmente. Uma das tradições que ainda hoje temos e que tem impacto de grande significância são os convívios de Natal que pela primeira vez foi este convívio realizado em 24 de Dezembro de 1975. O Conselho Paroquial tem este ano projectado para celebrar-mos o meio centenário deste evento único nesta paróquia. Hoje e neste Domingo teremos um convívio, cujo este terá por meta iniciarmos este ano de meio centenário de revivências que nos trouxeram até aos nossos dias de hoje nesta paróquia a comunidade paroquial que somos. Venham pois todos celebrar nesta paróquia aquilo que somos partilhando uma refeição dos pratos que cada um há-de trazer para serem partilhados. E conviver reforçando os nossos laços que nos ligam uns aos outros tal e qual uma família.

El milagro de Jesús en las bodas de Caná de Galilea es una manifestación (o epifanía) adicional de la singularidad de presencia de Dios en el Señor Jesús. Junto con la visita de los Magos y el bautismo en el río Jordán, este primero de los milagros (conocidos como “señales”), cambiar el agua en vino, fue una “revelación de su gloria”, lo que resultó en que los discípulos creyeran en Jesús. .

Nunca sabremos por qué Jesús eligió aquella celebración de bodas para actuar de esta manera; sin embargo, para un pueblo pobre que vivió una vida dura, quedarse sin vino mientras continúa la fiesta habría traído una gran tristeza.

El vino había sido tradicionalmente un signo del gozo que se encontrará en el reino de Dios. Para usar el lenguaje teológico, una fiesta de bodas habría sido un “anticipo y promesa” de la fiesta del cielo. Quedarse sin vino sería, en efecto, perder la alegría de la ocasión.

¿Por qué Jesús hizo esto? Quizás simplemente porque tuvo compasión de los recién casados y sus familias. O puede haber sido por deferencia hacia su madre, quien se lamentaba de que no hubiera más vino. Por alguna razón, Jesús claramente se sumergió en las preocupaciones de los demás, como lo sigue siendo por nosotros. Las “señales y maravillas” del cuidado compasivo del Señor por nosotros tal vez no sean tan visibles como cambiar el agua en vino, pero Él está aquí, con nosotros, ahora y siempre.

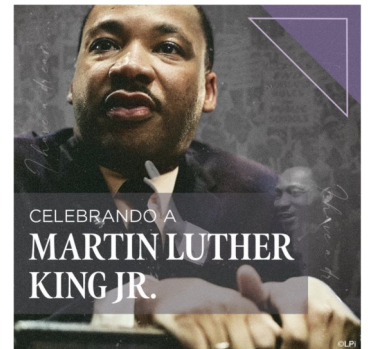

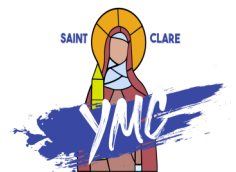

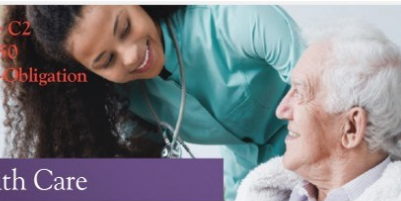
