From Monsignor Fran Cilia

Jesus calls us to mercy, which is an internal act on our part, not something done for show. The Latin root of mercy is *miser cordia*, meaning ‘pity from the heart.’ Justice, on the other hand, springs from our intellect, from our desire for fairness.

Mercy is from God and is rooted in treating others the way God relates to us. Mercy is not mean-spirited, vengeful or retaliatory. When we act in those (unsavory) ways, we are far from the call of our Baptism and even farther from God.

This Sunday’s gospel passage ends with these words, on the lips of Jesus:

“Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. Stop judging and you will not be judged. Stop condemning and you will not be condemned. Forgive and you will be forgiven. Give and gifts will be given to you; a good measure, packed together, shaken down, and overflowing, will be poured into your lap. For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you”
(Luke 6:36-38).

There are echoes of this in Shakespeare’s play, *The Merchant of Venice*, (Act IV, Scene I):

The quality of mercy is not strained;
It droppeth as the gentle rain from heaven
Upon the place beneath. It is twice blest;
It blesseth him that gives and him that takes:
'T is mightiest in the mightiest; it becomes
The throned monarch better than his crown:
His sceptre shows the force of temporal power,
The attribute to awe and majesty,
Wherein doth sit the dread and fear of kings;
But mercy is above this sceptred sway;
It is enthronèd in the hearts of kings,
It is an attribute to God himself;
And earthly power doth then show likest God’s
When mercy seasons justice.

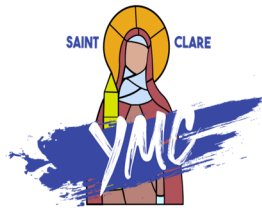

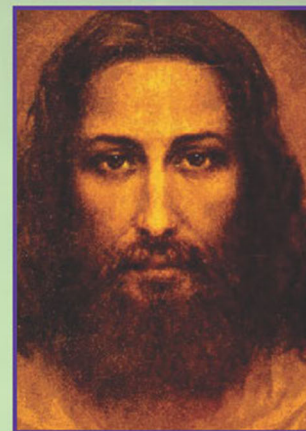


Fr Edmund Page, O.Praem.

Jesús nos llama a la misericordia, que es un acto interno de nuestra parte, no algo que se hace para ostentar. La raíz latina de *misericordia* es misericordia, que significa ‘piedad del corazón’. La justicia, por otro lado, brota de nuestro intelecto, de nuestro deseo de equidad.

La misericordia viene de Dios y tiene su raíz en tratar a los demás de la manera en que Dios se relaciona con nosotros. La misericordia no es mezquina, vengativa ni de desquite. Cuando actuamos de esas maneras (desagradables), estamos lejos del llamado de nuestro Bautismo y aún más lejos de Dios.

El pasaje del evangelio de este domingo termina con estas palabras, de labios de Jesús:

“Sean compasivos como es compasivo el Padre de ustedes. No juzguen y no serán juzgados; no condenen y no serán condenados; perdonen y serán perdonados. Den, y se les dará; se les echará en su delantal una medida colmada, apretada y rebosante. Porque con la medida que ustedes midan, serán medidos ustedes.”
(Lucas 6:36-38)

Hay ecos de esto en la obra de Shakespeare, *El Mercader de Venecia* (Acto IV, Escena I):

La propiedad de la clemencia es que no sea forzada;
Cae como la dulce lluvia del cielo
Sobre el llano que está por debajo de ella; es dos veces bendita:
Bendice al que la concede y al que la recibe.
Es lo que hay de más poderoso en lo que es todopoderoso;
Sienta mejor que la corona al monarca sobre su trono.
El cetro puede mostrar bien la fuerza del poder temporal,
El atributo de la majestad y del respeto
