

Lent is patterned after Jesus' 40 days in the desert:

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days, to be tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and when they were over, he was hungry.

(Luke 4:1-2)

These six weeks are our time in the desert, days to face whatever tests our faithfulness to our Baptism and to the Lord.

By works of prayer, penance and care for the poor, the Lord hones our instincts toward greater fidelity to the Christian life.

By common acts of penance (Friday abstinence from meat), we support one another, for we are not alone on this journey.

Our world is bleak. Merciless acts of injustice abound at the highest levels of our society, and all we have is the hope that the Lord Jesus, who was successful in confronting the tests that were hurled at Him, will be with us in the trials that are suffered by the most vulnerable. As a child-refugee, the heart of Jesus beats with the hearts of all who struggle, who have lost hope and who grieve what befalls them. But none are alone, for we are with them, especially in these days of their trials.

May God bless us all as we begin the journey of hope that leads us to Easter and the renewal of our lives in Christ.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at All Masses Next Weekend

Next weekend, the Second Sunday of Lent, as we hear the Gospel account of the Lord's Transfiguration, we invite all who suffer from acute or chronic illness or the weakness due to age to celebrate with us the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. These communal celebrations help to strengthen the bond between those who suffer from illness with the rest of the Christian community. As we invoke the Lord, the Healer, we pray that those who are anointed will find healing, not only in their bodies, but also in spirit.

Realizing that we are not alone is in itself a great source of comfort. If you are unsure if you should approach the Sacrament, Father Victor and Msgr. Fran will offer you guidance.

The Little Black Book for Lent is available, in English and Spanish. It offers a page per day and in about six minutes each day helps guide us through the season.

Boletim Paroquial Português
9 de Março de 2025 – Domingo da Quaresma
Reflexão Por: João Pereira Arruda

Ao entrar-mos neste Tempo Quaresmal de 2025, o Evangelho mostra-nos Jesus Cristo a ser conduzido pelo Espírito Santo para o deserto, a fim de jejuar, e orar, meditar, fazer penitência. No fim dos quarenta dias aparece-lhe o diabo que O desafia a pecar; convidando Jesus a usar da Sua dividande e fantasmagóricamente transformar pedras em pão, para matar-Lhe a fome. Jesus respondeu-lhe: “Nao só de pão vive o homem”. Com esta resposta o demónio não desistiu de tentar Jesus, porém, façamos uma pequena paragem para meditarmos na profundez da resposta de Jesus.

Nos nossos dias, aqui e agora, somos convidados a questionar-mos : sem ser o pão; de quê mais vivemos? Por exemplo pensemos no nosso espírito e no Espírito Santo que habita em nós e nos alienta com a Palavra de Deus. Este mesmo Espírito Santo nos enche de doms pelo qual somos chamados a gerir-los e a doar-los para o bem comum da comunidade que vivemos. Esses mesmos doms e o uso destes que nos dizem para sermos neste Tempo Quaresmal a sermos mais atentos ás necessidades dos irmãos que nos rodeiam sem pensar nas necessidades que temos. No Tempo Quaresmal o nosso deserto convida-nos a sermos mais: mais generosos ao ponto de darmos o que temos até das nossas necessidades. A sermos mais orantes, para nós próprios, pelas necessidades do mundo, pelas injustiças cometidas contra os pobres, os fracos, os que se não são iguais a nós., os idosos, os enfermos, os exilados, os escravos de vícios de droga, alcool, jogo, pelos chefes que governem os povos saberem governar-los com justiça, equidade na paz, por todos que sofrem de enfermidades; seam estas físicas ou mentais; por tudo isso e mais somos chamados neste Tempo Quaresmal a sermos chamados a ser mais.

No historial da Comunidade Paroquial Portuguesa da paróquia de Saint Clare's, com o regresso do padre António Meira a Portugal, houve uma certa insegurança com a continuidade da mesma na paróquia. Houve algumas missas a serem presididas pelos sacerdotes que residiam na paroquia. Estas era celebradas com o sacerdote a presidir em inglês com os leigos a fazerem tudo o mais em português. Apareceu então o padre Gerald Phelan, na altura, era professor na Universidade de Santa Clara e como tinha o dom de falar várias línguas aceitou servir a Comunidade Portuguesa e a hispana. Alguns membros da nossa comunidade viram no padre Phelan além de um enviado por Deus para servir a nossa comunidade um Santo com uma vontade enorme de servir-nos e de melhorar o seu português. Com as suas limitações e muito trabalho para uma pessoa de idade avançada ele teve que dar algumas responsabilidades aos leigos, tal como a Página Portuguesa do boletim paroquial que a partir de então ficou á responsabilidade de João Arruda, com umas poucas interrupções; esporadicamente pelo padre Francisco Rodrigues e o José Bettencourt quando esteve na presidencia do Conselho Paroquial. Coube então também de João Arruda convocar reuniões de planeamento Litúrgico e de convocar os leigos portugueses necessários para servirem nas missas em português, incluindo o planeamento da devoção das Vias Sacras. Padre Gerald Phelan em todo isso marcava presença ou dizia ao coordenador de antemão como queria que as coisas fossem feitas e era rariíssimo ele não estar presente nas reuniões do Conselho nem lhe escapava oportunidades de nos corrigir ensinando-nos como melhorar o viver os ministérios em que os leigos serviam. Jesús, lleno de Espíritu Santo, se volvió del Jordán, y era conducido por el Espíritu en el desierto, durante cuarenta días, tentado por el diablo. No comió nada en aquellos días y, al cabo de ellos, sintió hambre. (Lucas 4, 1-2)

Estas seis semanas son nuestro tiempo en el desierto, días para enfrentar cualquier prueba que ponga a prueba nuestra fidelidad a nuestro Bautismo y al Señor.

A través de obras de oración, penitencia y cuidado de los pobres, el Señor afina nuestros instintos hacia una mayor fidelidad a la vida cristiana.

A través de actos comunes de penitencia (abstinencia de carne los viernes), nos apoyamos unos a otros, porque no estamos solos en este viaje.

Que Dios nos bendiga a todos al comenzar el viaje de esperanza que nos lleva a la Pascua y a la renovación de nuestras vidas en Cristo.
