

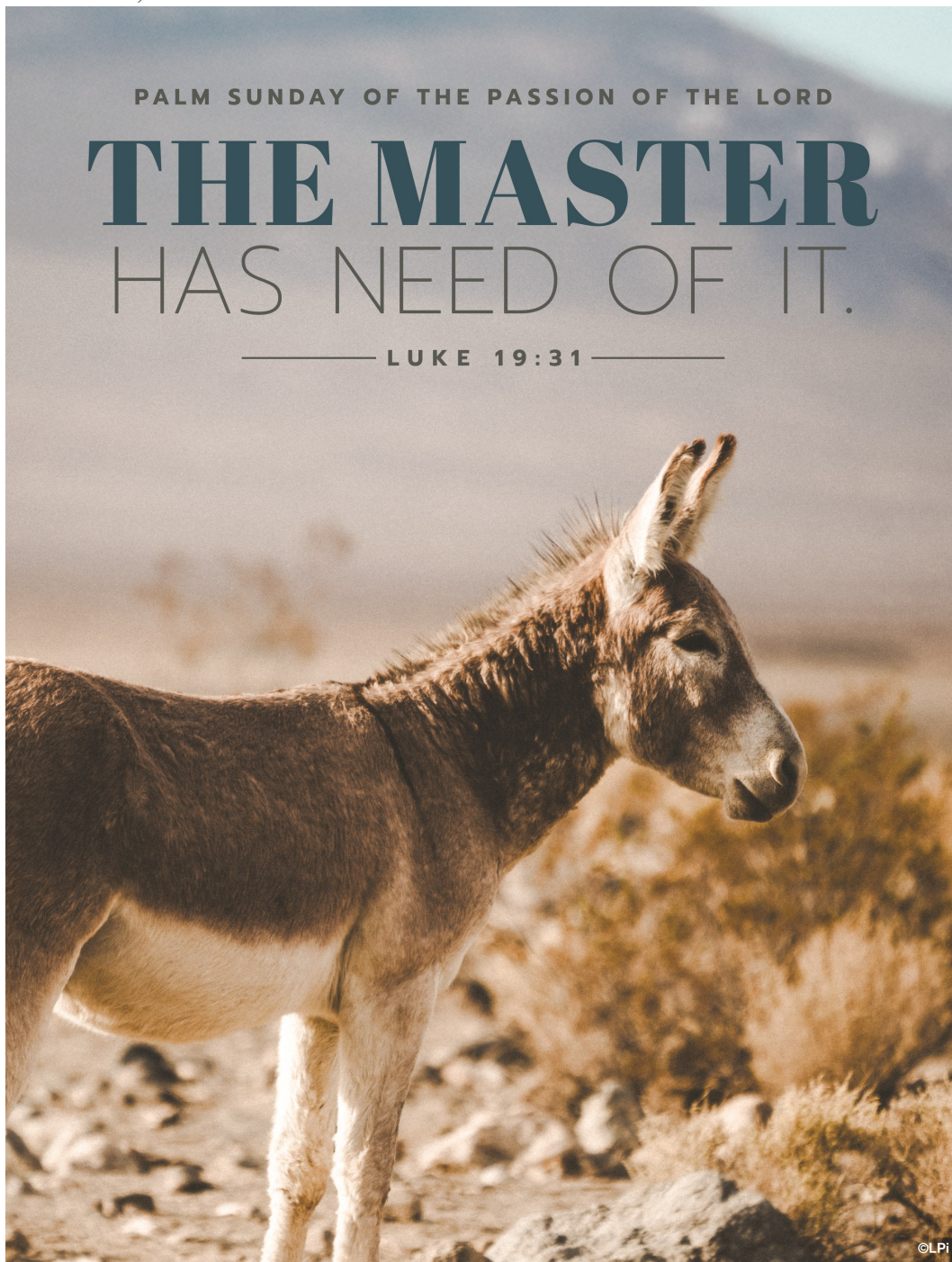

Palm Sunday is both triumphant and tragic: At the beginning of our liturgy, Jesus is proclaimed as King and welcomed into the city of Jerusalem. Then we hear the Passion according to Saint Luke, the same crowd calling for Jesus to be crucified.

The events of that week had to happen: It was necessary that Jesus suffer and die before He rose.

We, too, must sink to our lowest before we can rise. The Resurrection does not come to Jesus without great pain. Neither can we share that glory until we know the depths of sharing Christ's death to sin, which has been our goal this Lent.

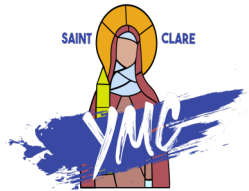
As we begin our Holy Week observances, we invite you to be with us throughout these days, beginning with the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, and Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday evening, truly "the most wonderful night of the year."

Since the Easter Vigil will begin at 8:30 pm with the "Lucernarium," or Blessing of the New Fire, we ask that you gather in the parking lot adjacent to the parish hall. We will then process into the church for the remainder of the Vigil.

Special Collections during Holy Week

The collection on Holy Thursday will benefit the work of our Saint Vincent de Paul Society. It is fitting that the traditional hymn sung during the Preparation of the Gifts that night is "*Where Charity and Love Prevail*."

Good Friday's collection benefits the upkeep of the sacred places in the Holy Land, entrusted to the Franciscans. Given the turmoil of wars and the dwindling Christian population, our help is needed now more than ever.

Reflexão Por: João Pereira Arruda

Hosana, Hosana! Ao Filho de David; assim gritava a multidão á entrada de Jesus Cristo em Jerusalém, montado numa jumenta para comer uma ceia com os seus Apóstolos. Esta Ceia seria a última e nela ficou instituída a Santa Eucaristia que ainda nos nossos dias nos serve de ceia. Jesus, sabia bem que n'Ele estavam centrados os objectivos do Pai pelo qual Jesus obedeceu-Lhe até á morte; e que dessa morte, veio a ressurreição e a vitória sobre a destruição do pecado e a herança da vida eterna para cada um de nós baptizados e crentes em Jesus Cristo. A mesma multidão que gritou Hosana ao Filho de David ...Bendito Aquele que vem em nome do Senhor, no dia seguinte da Sua paixão e morte gritava crucifica-O! Crucifica-O! Mesmo que Pilatos estivesse disposto a soltar Jesus e dar-lhes Barrabás para ser crucificado, mas eles gritavam ainda mais para Jesus ser O crucificado. Essa injustiça de mais de dois mil anos que matou Jesus inocentemente continua a acontecer ao longo da História da Humanidade, á quase cem anos com Hitler e as guerras na Europa e neste momento estamos a viver uma situação de injustiça humanitária com o governo actual desta nação. Se Jesus Cristo foi o alvo para matar por enfrentar a hipocrisia dos escribas e fariseus e sacerdotes, nas primeira e segunda guerras mundiais foram os judeus e tudo que não fosse da raça ariana, nos nossos dias os alvejados, são os pobres, os mais fracos, os imigrantes. A Ilegalidade desses imigrantes que procuram viver aqui. Arriscando a própria vida, tudo o que querem é um emprego e mesmo assim as pessoas da multidão não entendem que para Jesus na há ilegalidade nos imigrantes. Jesus vê os imigrantes irmãos perseguidos pela vida má que levavam nos seus países de origem para uma vida de perseguição e de abuso na nação de acolhimento. São esses os mártires do nosso tempo, São esses imigrantes que vivem sextas-feiras contínuas numa vida de sofrimento. As mensagens dos poderosos iludem as multidões e tal qual com Jesus teve na sua paixão e morte: Simão de Cirene, a Verónica, José de Arimateia que arriscando a morte ajudaram a Jesus. Hoje e nos nossos dias precisamos ter atitude de José Arimateia ou as da Verónica. Tempo Quaresmal é um convite a uma mudança de vida. Uma mudança de vida que implica sair do comodismo que vivemos, do não me rales, do isso não é comigo. Tempo Quaresmal é tempo de conversão e de mudança. De que vale rezar pelos sem abrigo ou pelos empobrecidos se participas ou não fazes nada e deste comodismo os governantes dão cabo deles. Hoje mais do que nunca somos chamados a ser activos a fomentar leis de apoio aos mais necessitados, por todos aqueles que já as orações não são suficientes, porque por um lado rezamos e por outro lado participamos em leis que foram criadas para causar ainda mais dano ás vidas deles, Na liturgia deste Domingo levantemos os nossos ramos, cantemos Hosana Tu reinarás, proclamemos o Evangelho da Paixão e participemos na Última Ceia na Santa Eucaristia; mas conscientemente nos lembremos que no meio desse viver há um compromisso a tomar para a vida que se vive afora da assembleia na igreja em sermos um mais na multidão ou sermos um Simão de Cirene que tomou a cruz de Jesus ás suas costas, ou uma Verónica que saiu do seu grupinho de mulherada para limpar o rosto ensanguentado de Jesus, ou ainda José de Arimateia que da sua vida deu um túmulo para depositar o Jesus morto. Esse mesmo Túmulo que Jesus saiu dele Ressuscitado na manhã da Páscoa da Ressurreição. Nessa Ressurreição está a nossa herança de sermos irmãos de Jesus Cristo o mesmo que vindo ao mundo nos disse” Eu vim para que tenhais vida e a tenhas em abundância”!

Um Santo e Alegre Domingo de Ramos para todos!!

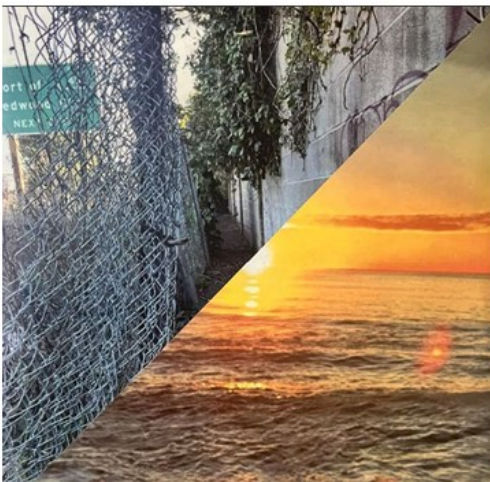

PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD



Journey with the Lord

Merciful Lord, humbling yourself, you came to us. You endured humiliation, suffering, and pain as your followers turned away. Today, we prepare to journey with you. Open our ears so that we may hear your voice. Guide us in radically accompanying you. Wash away our sin and lead us to paradise. Who live and reign with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Radical Accompaniment

Today's readings: Luke 19:28–40; Isaiah 50:4–7; Psalm 22:8–9, 17–18, 19–20, 23–24; Philippians 2:6–11; Luke 22:14–23:56 or 23:1–49.

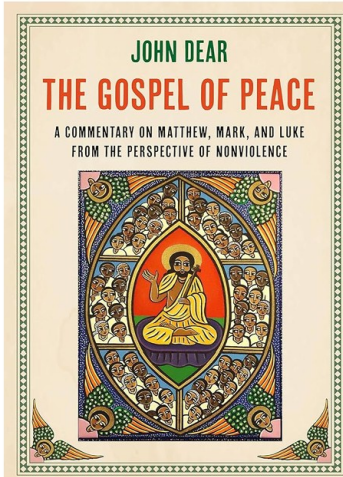
Today we enter Holy Week as we celebrate Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. At Mass, the procession will be different than other Sundays. The assembly will receive palms and gather at the church's doors. As the first Gospel is proclaimed, the assembled will hear of Jesus entering Jerusalem, greeted by a joyful crowd waving palms. At the end of the reading, all will wave palms and sing as the priest processes to the sanctuary. These actions commemorate Jesus' journey to Jerusalem. During the proclamation of the passion, the horrifying story of Jesus' suffering and death is told. Not only do we hear of the crucifixion but also of Peter's denial of Jesus and of the soldiers jeering at our Lord. Amid the betrayal and the mockery, though, women wept for him, a man carried Jesus' cross, a criminal asked to be remembered, and a righteous man wrapped the Lord's body and brought it to a tomb, where women prepared oils and perfume.

As a community, we contemplate the last moments of Jesus' life. Aware that Jesus is with us in our moments of desolation, we take seriously our journey with him through his passion. Entering Holy Week, consider how you might walk with Jesus—be it praying with Scripture daily, inviting a friend or family member into your prayer, or serving at a local shelter. Offer a prayer in gratitude for Jesus' relentless accompaniment.

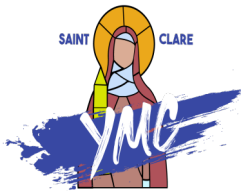
