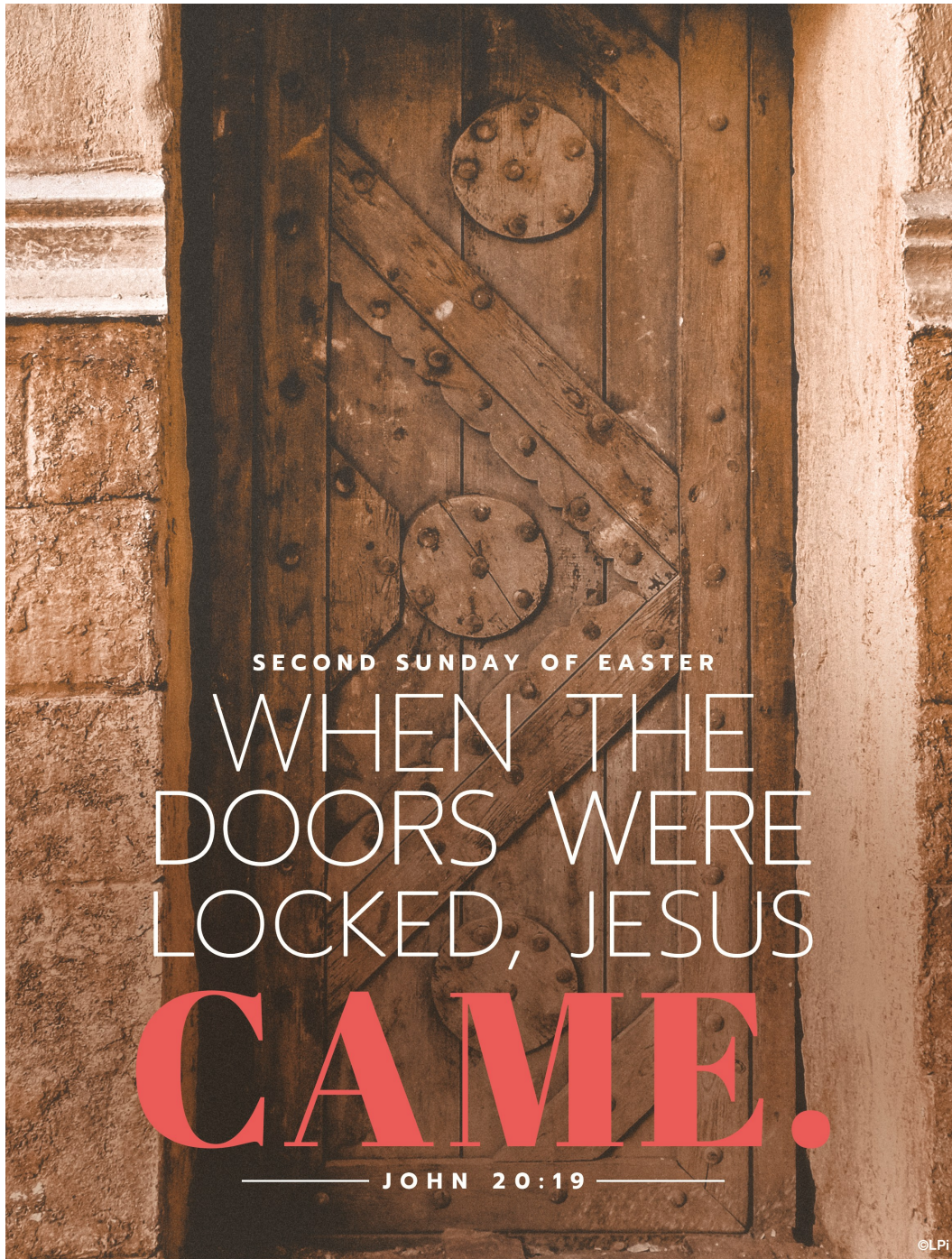

From Monsignor Fran

As we mourn the death of Pope Francis this past Easter Monday, we give thanks for his ministry of service to the Church throughout the world. At the same time, confident that he has gone “to the house of the Father,” we rejoice that he is now a “saint among the saints in the halls of heaven.”

As we pray for the Pope, we remember in a special way the cardinal-electors who will soon gather to choose a new Bishop of Rome.

On this Second Sunday of Easter, the Church gives us the gospel passage (John 20:19–31) of Jesus’ appearances to the disciples on Easter night and again a week later. He wished them peace and gave them the gift of the Holy Spirit, Who would guide them – and us – until the end of time.

We pray that this same Spirit come upon the cardinals, who are successors to the Apostles, in choosing one who will lead the Church as a sign of God’s endless love and mercy, a true Shepherd of the flock of the Lord.

—————Update April 22, 2025—————

The Funeral Mass for Pope Francis will take place on **Saturday, April 26 at 10:00 a.m. (Rome time) in St. Peter’s Square**. Following the Mass, the Holy Father’s coffin will be taken to **St. Peter’s Basilica**, and then to the **Basilica of St. Mary Major** for burial.

This Funeral Mass marks the beginning of the “**Novendiales**”, nine days of Requiem Masses offered for the repose of Pope Francis’ soul. Each day, a cardinal selected by the late pope will preside over Mass in St. Peter’s Basilica. The Diocese of San José will hold a **Memorial Mass for Pope Francis**, celebrated by **Bishop Oscar Cantú**, on **Tuesday, April 29 at 7:00 p.m.** at the **Cathedral Basilica of St. Joseph**. All are warmly invited to attend and join in prayer for the eternal rest of our Holy Father.

Below is a statement from Bishop Cantú, issued the day Pope Francis died.

April 21, 2025

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It is with profound sorrow that we mourn the passing of our beloved Holy Father, Pope Francis, who returned to the house of the Father this morning at the age of 88.

Pope Francis was a shepherd who led with humility, compassion, and an unwavering commitment to the Gospel. He referred to the Church as a field hospital, reaching out to the peripheries, and encouraged us all to encounter each other, especially the poor. His emphasis on mercy, care for creation, and solidarity with the poor has left an indelible mark on the Church and the world.

As we mourn his passing, we also unite with the Church around the world in prayer during this novendiales period, nine days of prayer and remembrance following the death of a pope. The official date of the funeral or the novendialis is yet to be confirmed. I will celebrate a Diocesan Memorial Mass for Pope Francis in the coming days, and all are invited to participate. Details will be shared soon.

Let us honor the legacy of Pope Francis by continuing to build a Church that is welcoming, inclusive, and dedicated to serving those in need.

Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace. Amen.

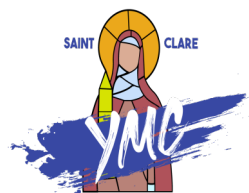
This Week: Parking Lot Rehabilitation and Renewal

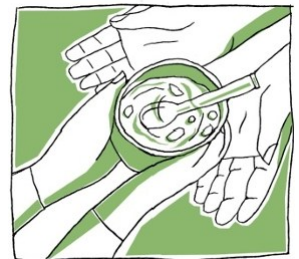

Weekly Justice Challenge



A consistent theme in Catholic social teaching is the preferential option for the poor and vulnerable. God loves all people but has a soft spot in his heart for the poor and vulnerable members of society. Thomas was vulnerable because he missed out on the first appearance of Jesus to the Apostles. He was an outsider among the group, and he expressed his sense of being “distant” by refusing to believe their story. When Jesus arrived again with Thomas present, he directed his attention to the vulnerable Thomas. Jesus loved all of his followers, but Thomas was in need of special, preferential attention. Jesus delivered, and Thomas believed. The challenge this week is to give attention to the outsider in your group. Draw that person back in with your love. It’s just the right thing to do as we celebrate Divine Mercy!

27 de Abril de 2025, Domingo II da Páscoa ou da Divina Misericórdia
Reflexão Por: João Pereira Arruda

O Senhor já morreu! O Senhor Ressuscitou! E agora que fazer? Assim muitos dos Apóstolos e discípulos pensavam que tudo se houvera consumado. A falta de fé criava na cabeça dos seguidores de Jesus Cristo uma desilusão enorme com um desnorte de se não saber por onde começar, esus conhecendo intimamente o que era seu não deixa-os cair e aparecendo no meio deles, quando estavam reunidos lhes apareceu com a mesma frase que o Sacerdote diz na missa logo a seguir á consagração do vinho e do pão: “A paz esteja convosco”! Assim os saudava o Senhor porque devemos cultivar sentimentos de paz e não de sentimentos que nos afastam de Deus. De paz porque esta nos faz recebedores da Sua Misericórdia Divina. É na paz que se cultiva a unidade e amor fraterno: seja na família, na comunidade, na paróquia e ou na nação que vivemos. Não sejamos como Tomé, porque assim disse Jesus: Porque Me viste acreditaste; felizes aqueles que acreditam sem terem visto” Jesus fazia isto tudo para que os discípulos acreditassem n’Ele assim também e ainda nos nossos dias se acreditamos que Jesus é o Messias também seremos salvos porque Ele está sempre no meio de nós e sabemos isso porque Ele assim o disse “Eu estarei convosco até ao fim dos tempos. O salmista da liturgia deste Domingo cantará: “Aclamai o Senhor porque Ele é bom; o Seu amor é para sempre”, Façamos o nosso melhor para sermos merecedores da Misericórdia de Jesus Cristo

No historial da presença da nossa Comunidade Paroquial Portuguesa deu-se em muitas ocasiões tempos de não termos padres para pastorear a nossa comunidade. Muitas vezes era-mos como ovelhas sem pastor. Teve que haver ; tanto nos membros da Comissão, para conseguir uma Missa celebrada a língua portuguesa e mais tarde do Conselho Paroquial Português. A Comissão sabia que em 1974 o então padre Gilberto Avelar iria regressar á sua missão no Brasil. Sabia-mos então do Diácono Eduardo Salazar e este com um português meio conseguido fazia as homilias enuando não foi ordenado sacerdote. Ainda nos nossos dias o lembramos como tendo uma determinação para que a nossa missa continuasse a ser celebrada nesta paróquia e antes de ir permanentemente para iniciar a sua vida sacerdotal depois de ser ordenado ainda teve tempo de criar um grupo de jovens de saudosa memória criar um espaço para que a nossa missa passasse a ser celebrada no piso principal. Antes no piso inferior já se celebrava as missas na língua croata e espanhol, sendo a nossa missa mais uma a juntar-se ás existentes. Nessa altura tínhamos uma comunidade com um número de pessoas muito forte e que precisava de mais espaço. O regresso do padre Salazar ao Texas deixou a Comissão desorientada e rezava-se intensamente para que aparecesse algum sacerdote que nos orientasse permanentemente. e por alguns meses em que a nossa missa era presidida por um sacerdote Jesuíta em inglês e as leituras eram feitas em português. Era o melhor que nessa altura se podia fazer. Havia alguns sacerdotes que vindos dos Açores visitar as famílias vinham celebrar a nossa missa mas nunca houve uma comunicação correcta para que algum destes sacerdotes ficassem continuamente a servir a nossa comunidade, Uma das regras seria que o sacerdote que servisse a nossa comunidade também teria que servir a Comunidade Hispânica. Finalmente, em Setembro de 1975 veio o Padre José Ribeiro. Este por si trouxe uma vontade enorme de formar leigos, principalmente nos ministérios da proclamação da Palavra de Deus, do Teatro do Natal, cursos de Bíblia e de educarmo-os a sermos exigentes e sermos responsáveis pelo modo que as nossas Organizações Portuguesas de Santa Clara celebrava a parte religiosa. Tinha que haver uma mudança e esta mudança apareceu porque o Conselho e os leigos estavam determinados em apoiar as suas iniciativas.

Um Santo e Alegre Domingo da Misericórdia Divina!

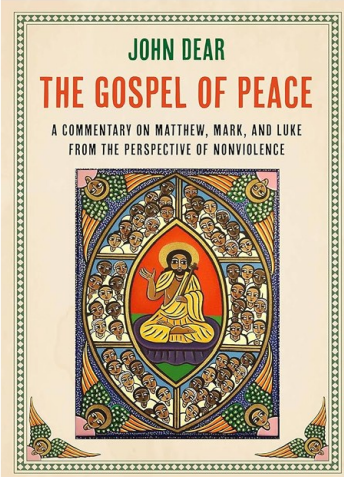

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER SUNDAY OF DIVINE MERCY

Courage to Believe

Merciful God, you call us to you, beckoning us to turn from our fear and disappointment. You are with us despite our doubt, We give thanks: your mercy endures forever. Grant us the courage to see through eyes of faith and to share the joyful news of the resurrection. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Believe!

Today's readings: Acts 5:12-16; Psalm 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24; Revelation 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19; John 20:19-31. Jesus appears to the disciples, who were in hiding because they were being persecuted for being his followers. Despite the locked doors, Jesus "came and stood in their midst," bidding them peace. Thomas, who was not with the other disciples when Jesus first appeared, says that he will not believe unless he sees the mark of the nails in Jesus' hands and puts his finger into his side.

Since we know that Jesus was raised from the dead, it is easy to place blame on Thomas. How could he not believe? But when we reflect on our faith journey, how many times do we find ourselves in Thomas' shoes? How often do we doubt and question God's presence? On this Sunday of Divine Mercy, place yourself in the Gospel. Where do you find yourself? What do you think when Thomas expresses his disappointment and fear? What do you feel when Jesus comes, despite the locked doors, stands in your midst, and says: "Peace be with you?" What do you see when Jesus invites Thomas to touch the mark of the nails in his hands and put his hand into his side? What do you hear exclaimed in the room?

After placing yourself in the locked room with the disciples and Thomas, full of fear and sadness, consider how Jesus' resurrection can inspire you. How can you step through fear and doubt and move toward action? Ask the Lord to meet you where you are and to bring you peace.

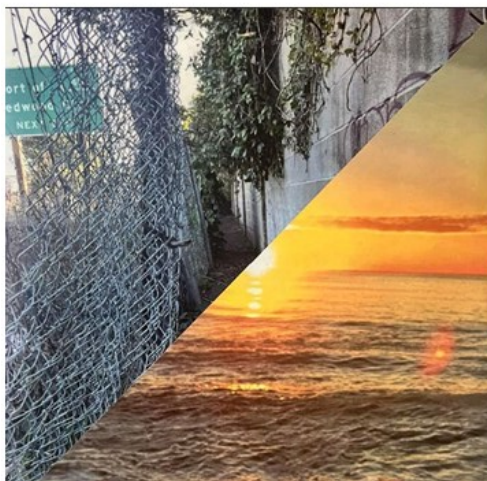

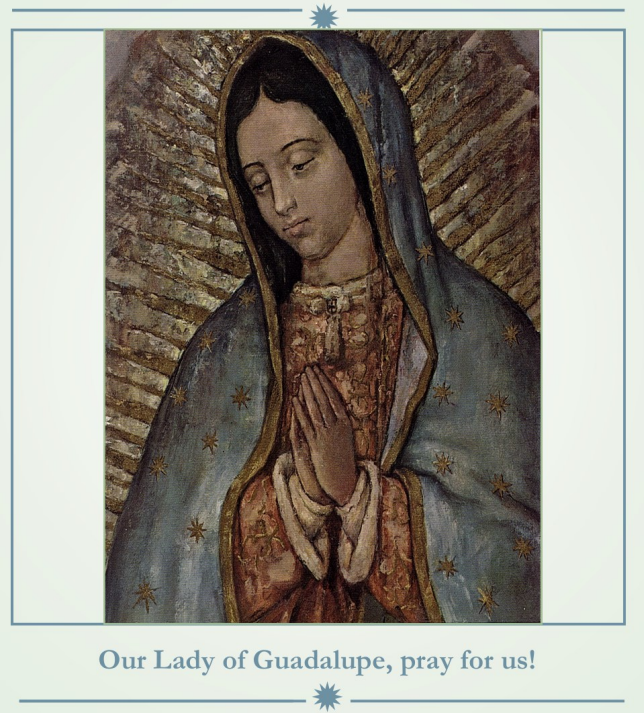

—————Actualización 22 de abril 2025—————

La Misa funeral por el Papa Francisco tendrá lugar el sábado 26 de abril a las 10:00 a.m. (hora de Roma) en la Plaza de San Pedro. Después de la Misa, el ataúd del Santo Padre será llevado a la Basílica de San Pedro y luego a la Basílica de Santa María la Mayor para su entierro.

Esta Misa de Exequias marca el inicio de los “**Novendiales**”, nueve días de Misas de Réquiem ofrecidas por el descanso del alma del Papa Francisco. Cada día, un cardenal seleccionado por el difunto Papa presidirá la Misa en la Basílica de San Pedro.

La Diócesis de San José celebrará una **Misa Memorial** por Papa Francisco, celebrada por el **Obispo Oscar Cantú, el martes 29 de abril a las 7:00 p.m. en la Catedral Basílica de San José**. Todos están cordialmente invitados a asistir y unirse en oración por el eterno descanso de nuestro Santo Padre.

A continuación una declaración del Obispo Cantú, emitida el día en que murió el Papa Francisco.

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,

Con profundo dolor lamentamos el fallecimiento de nuestro amado Santo Padre, el Papa Francisco, quien regresó a la casa del Padre esta mañana a la edad de 88 años.

El Papa Francisco fue un pastor que dirigió con humildad, compasión y un compromiso inquebrantable con el Evangelio. Se refirió a la Iglesia como un hospital de campo, extendiendo la mano a las periferias, y nos animó a todos a encontrarnos unos con otros, especialmente con los pobres. Su énfasis en la misericordia, el cuidado de la creación y la solidaridad con los pobres ha dejado una huella imborrable en la Iglesia y el mundo.

Al lamentar su fallecimiento, también nos unimos en oración a la Iglesia de todo el mundo durante este período de novendiales, nueve días de oración y recuerdo tras la muerte de un Papa. La fecha oficial del funeral o del novendialis están por confirmarse. Celebraré una Misa Diocesana en Memoria del Papa Francisco en los próximos días, y todos están invitados a participar. Pronto se compartirán los detalles.

Honremos el legado del Papa Francisco continuando la construcción de una Iglesia acogedora, inclusiva y dedicada a servir a los necesitados.

Esta Semana: Rehabilitación y Renovación del Estacionamiento

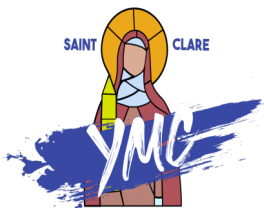
