

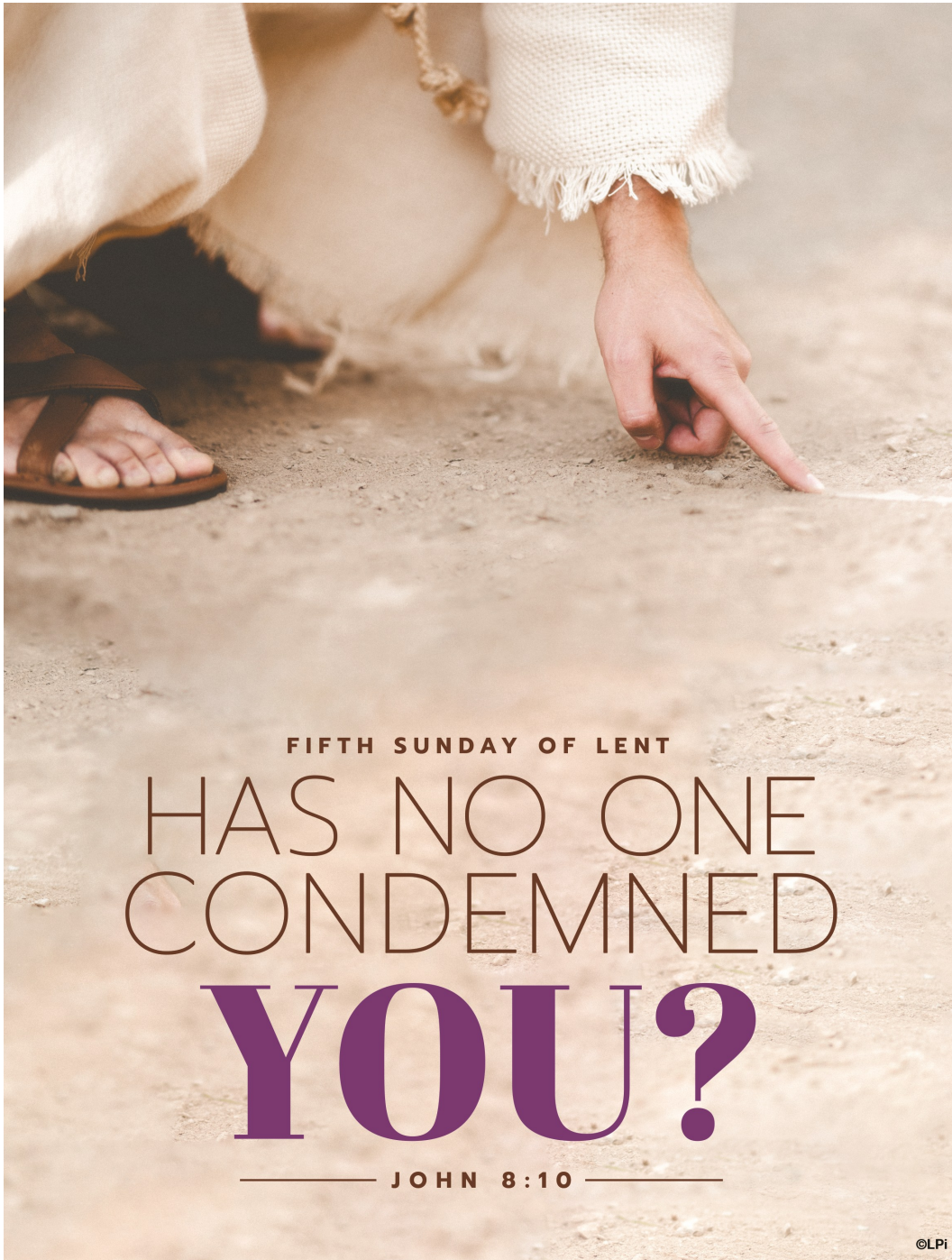

The prophet Isaiah narrates the forgiveness that comes from the Lord:

Thus says the Lord. . .
Remember not the events of the past,
the things of long ago consider not;
see, I am doing something new!
Now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?
In the desert I make a way,
in the wasteland, rivers.

When the religious leaders brought to Jesus the adulterous woman, noting that the law prescribed that she be stoned to death, Jesus invited those same leaders and the crowd who were without sin to cast a stone. And they all walked away.

Jesus preferred compassion and mercy over the law and its brand of justice. He did, however, instruct the woman to sin no more. Forgiveness does not give us license to sin, but the opportunity to change our ways, to be converted again and again to the Lord. Let us forgive as we have been forgiven. . . Indeed, God is doing something new – in us.

Palm Sunday Masses

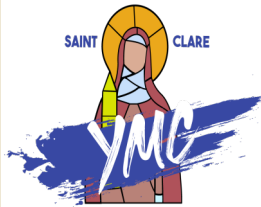

Boletim Paroquial Português
6 de Abril de 2025; Domingo V da Quaresma
Reflexão Por: João Pereira Arruda

Neste Quinto Domingo do Tempo Quaresmal já se apercebe uma esperança de um grande acontecimento de enormes proporções de transformação de vida e uma Humanidade renovada e libertada das amarras do pecado. O Senhor nos fala de libertação, libertação essa com a saída da escravatura do Egípto [para a Terra Prometida e no Salmode hoje o salmista nos cantará: “*O Senhor fez maravilhas em favor do Seu Povo*”. Assim cantavam os escravos vindos da Babilónia quando da sua libertação de voltar para a sua terra a terra do Seu Senhor. No Evangelho se fala de uma escravidão do pecado. Ser apanhado em adultério era punição para a mulher ser apedrejada até á morte. Tal actividade bárbara. Selvagem e desumana não se concebe nos nossos dias que isso pudesse ser possível; porque em muitas sociedades as infidelidades são toleradas, consentidas e no caso dos homens ficam a serem admirados pela sua macheza sexual, porém na visão de Jesus Ele assim disse aos que queriam apedrejar a mulher pecadora “Quem de entre vós estiver sem pecado seja o primeiro a atirar-lhe uma pedra,” Quando todos se foram sem apedrejaram a mulher ficou libertada dum pecado pelo qual envolve um homem. Porque há-de ser a mulher punida e o homem não? Desse modo Jesus trouxe libertação á mulher já livre de retomar a sua vida. São três cenários que nos falam de uma esperança libertadora que nos leva á victória da gloriosa Páscoa .No final do Evangelho Jesus diz á mulher: “*Ninguém te condenou ? ...Nem Eu te condeno. Vai, e a partir de agora não voltes a pecar.*” Assim nos diz, também Jesus, *Estais libertos não volteis a ser escravos dos vícios e tudo o que seja que te amarra e te tira a felecidade de viver.*

A primeira Páscoa vivida pela Comunidade Paroquial Portuguesa foi no ano de 1974 e ainda pelo Padre Gilberto Avelar, A liturgia da Missa da Festa pouca diferença tinha das missas de um outro qualquer Domingo. Via-se a comunidade Americana a fazerem tudo o que implica nas cerimónias da água e do fogo e a distribuir desejos de Happy Easters ao redor da igreja enquanto a nossa comunidade falava de como saíram os folares ou quantos ovos tinham, Foi assim uma festejamento que deixava um desejo que se queria mais e que se podia fazer mais, mas só em 1976 e já com o Padre José Ribeiro entre nós por sete meses que conscientemente se preparou uma Páscoa mais viva, mais participada, já incuiu palestras de preparação para a Festa, já houve um serviço penitencial tudo coordenado pelo Padre José Ribeiro. As palestras formativas dadas pelo padre Ribeiro captivavam de tal modo a nossa comunidade que pediam cada vez mais ao Conselho Paroquial para que ele desse mais palestras e desse entusiasmo gerou que acontecesse cursos de bíblia e cursos de formação de leigos. Desses cursos de formação gerou uma consciencialização sobre o sentido prático de ser católico e a vontade de querer ser católico responsável.

A partir daí criou-se um grupo de leigos que conscientemente se preparavam para desempenharem com entusiasmo em servir a comunidade no ministério que escolheram servir. Com o entusiasmo dos leigos a partir daí as Festas Pascais só podiam ser melhores e assim foi por muitos anos porque o declínio das celebrações pascais deve-se mais ao número de paroquianos que por esse tempo faziam parte da comunidade e ao número dos que agora existem. Muitos outros padres contribuíram para a Páscoa ser celebrada com entusiasmo e tudo o que eles fizeram serviu para o amadurecimento da nossa comunidade que mesmo assim com um número muito reduzido de pessoas não desistem e querem mais

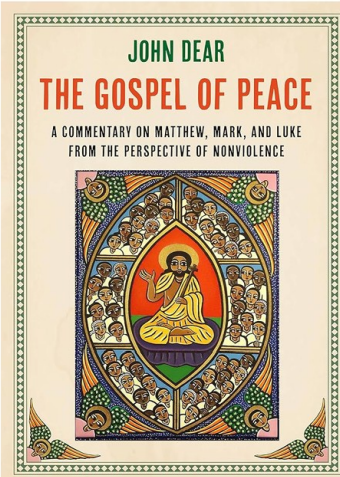

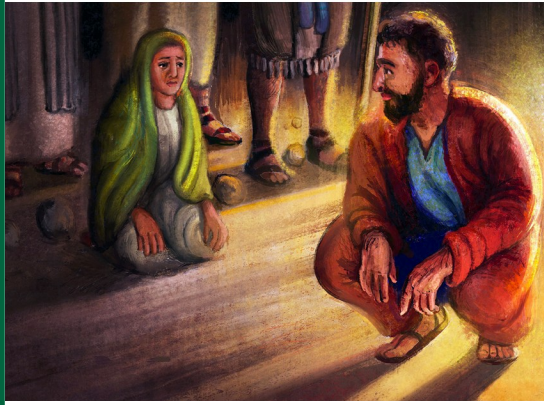

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT



Clearing a Path

God our Father, you are our protector and our comfort. You have done great things for us: you make a way amid hopelessness and despite our sinfulness. Your forgiveness knows no bounds, and though we weep now, we know we will soon rejoice. Help us announce your praise, relinquish our judgment of others, and live with our sights set on pursuing you. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Boundless Mercy

Today's readings: Isaiah 43:16–21; Psalm 126:1–2, 2–3, 4–5, 6; Philippians 3:8–14; John 8:1–11. A crowd begins to gather to hear Jesus teach in the temple. The scribes and the Pharisees bring forth a woman

who had been caught in adultery. After forcing her to stand in the middle of the crowd, they test Jesus, asking what the woman's punishment should be. The law states that she should be stoned for her sin.

Jesus writes on the ground, and John leaves it to our imagination as to what his words might be. Though Jesus' written words are not revealed, the Gospel records him as saying, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." He bends down again and writes on the ground a second time. Then people leave, perhaps humbled in the realization that they are sinners and do not have the ability to judge someone else for their sins. Have you condemned or judged another for their wrong doing? Imagine what Jesus might write on the ground in front of you to encourage you to grow in mercy.

After the woman has been humiliated and brought to the center of a crowd (a crowd well aware of the punishment for her actions), Jesus tells her that she is not condemned. Imagine the shock and relief this woman likely felt. This Sunday, as you listen to the Gospel being proclaimed, bask in God's boundless mercy. Allow yourself to join this woman as she experiences God's unconditional love. How can you let this inspire you to be better and "not sin any more"?

Creation Care Tips

"Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." —Isaiah 43:18-19

If you sometimes feel overwhelmed by the direction the climate crisis is going, consider reading chapter 43 from Isaiah as an antidote. Or read chapter 3 of Pope Francis' *Laudato Si'* (you can find it online for free). He reminds us, "The Spirit of God has filled the universe with possibilities and therefore, from the very heart of things, something new can always emerge" (#80). © The Pastoral Center / PastoralCenter.com. Weekly Justice Challenge

What is the role of anger and rage in our lives? What purpose does it serve? We often think that when we feel anger, we need to express it... we need to get it out of our system. Perhaps anger has a different purpose as Jesus suggests to the angry crowd that is about to hurl stones at the guilty woman. Perhaps anger is a signal that there is something wrong inside of us, some pain that has surfaced because we have witnessed an injustice in the world and our consciences are feeling pricked. Anger can trick us into thinking that the injustice is outside of us or that we are above it. But Jesus suggests that when we seek justice with anger, rage, or revenge, we should use our anger to look within and hurl stones at our own sin. The challenge this week is to address the injustice that has root in our own souls.

Así dice el Señor...

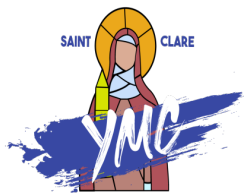
